In the afternoon, the students continued the tradition of parading down Schoolview Road. Students drove through the Elementary parking lot to show off their rides to the younger students.

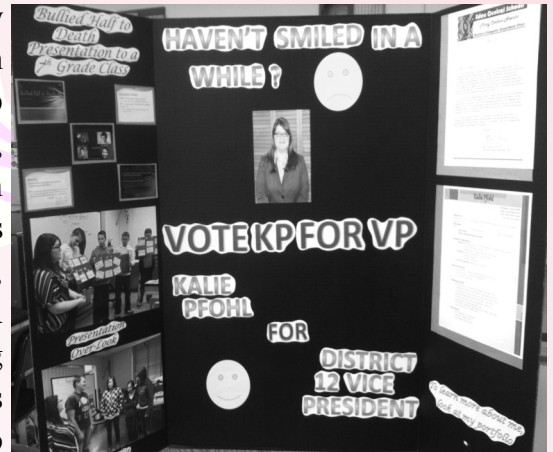


EDEN FUTURE BUSINESS LEADERS OF AMERICA PROUD TO HAVE DISTRICT 12 VICE PRESIDENT

EDEN FAMILY SUPPORT CENTER

The Eden Family support Center is solution-based therapy for families.

Family Support is a confidential service where counseling and information is available to Eden families at no charge. Fees are covered through the generosity of the Eden Central School District.

The Family Support Team provides: short term counseling for families; links to community resources; Wednesday evening hours for families who cannot meet during the day; service to any student or family within the Eden School District; a chance for families to focus on common goals by identifying strengths and resources.

The EFSC believes that the strength of a family's bond has a profound influence on a child's behavior and on his or her success.

The EFSC strives to link families with school and community services in order to solve problems collaboratively. All counselors are trained in Solution-based Therapy.

To date, families demonstrate over 90% success rate with an average of 3-4 counseling sessions per family.

The Family Support Counseling Team believes: There is a direct connection between the behavior and the academic success of your child at school and the strengths that exist

in your family.

Parents and siblings have a powerful and lifelong influence on a child.

Families can, and in fact, do change.

The Family Support Team can help influence family changes in a positive way.

School cannot usually bring about this change alone.

Problem solving works best when families and school personnel work together to solve problems.

FROM THE NURSE'S OFFICE

Keep your kids safe. Get their seasonal flu shots every fall or winter.

Is seasonal flu more serious for kids?

Infants and young children are at a greater risk for getting seriously ill from the flu. That's why the New York State Department of Health recommends that all children 6 months and older get the seasonal flu vaccine.

What is seasonal flu?

The flu, or influenza, is a viral infection of the nose, throat, and lungs. The flu can spread from person to person.

How can I protect my child?

- Get the seasonal flu vaccine.
- Get the seasonal flu vaccine for yourself.
- Wash your hands often and cover your coughs and sneezes. This will prevent the spread of germs.
- Keep their hands away from their face.
- Cover coughs and sneezes to protect others. It's best to use a tissue and quickly throw it away. If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve, not your hands.

What are signs of the flu?

The flu comes on suddenly. Most people with the flu feel very tired and have a high fever, headache, dry cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, and sore muscles. Some people, especially children, may also have stomach problems and diarrhea. The cough can last two or more weeks.

How does the flu spread?

People who have the flu usually cough, sneeze, and have a runny nose. The droplets in a cough, sneeze or runny nose contain the flu virus. Other people can get the flu by breathing in these droplets or by getting them in their nose or mouth.

How long can a sick person spread the flu to others?

Most healthy adults may be able to spread the flu from one day before getting sick to up to 5 days after getting sick. This can be longer in children and in people who don't fight disease as well (people with weaker immune systems).

What can I do if my child gets sick?

Make sure your child gets plenty of rest and drinks lots of fluids. Talk with your child's doctor before giving your child over-the-counter

medicine. If your children or teenagers may have the flu, never give them aspirin or medicine that has aspirin in it. It could cause serious problems.

Can my child go to school/day care with the flu?

No. If your child has the flu, he or she should stay home to rest. This helps avoid giving the flu to other children.

When can my child go back to school/day care after having the flu?

Children with the flu should be isolated in the home, away from other people. They should also stay home until they are symptom-free for 24 hours (that is, until they have no fever without the use of fever-control medicines and they feel well for 24 hours). Remind your child to protect others by covering his or her mouth when coughing or sneezing.

PHYSICAL EXAMS FOR WINTER SPORTS

According to NYS Education Law, a Physical Exam is required for new entrants and 7th and 10th graders.

Ideally, the family physician should perform the medical examination (forms are available in the school health offices). Each school district is mandated by law to provide an examination by the

school physician of those pupils whose parents do not provide a report from the family physician. Physicals for new entrants and 7th and 10th graders must be received by October 18, 2012. Physicals for new entrants, 7th and 10th graders and winter sports will be held on October 23, 2012 at 8:30 a.m.—11:00 a.m. by

New York's wilderness is beautiful—enjoy it safely! This 16-hour course is for those who work, live or play in remote areas—away from the usual EMS service. Even though the emergency workers near these areas may be trained to search for and rescue those in need, there may be a delay in the notification for assistance, the time required to get to the patient, or in moving the patient to more advanced treatment.
