It is hard to believe that three months have passed since the start of the school year. We have seen opening day, homecoming, open houses, picture days, concerts, first quarter report cards, parent teacher conferences, and Thanksgiving. We have had an excellent fall, and winter has already arrived.

We have seen several of our athletic teams compete in post season play, with our Girls' Volleyball Team returning as State Champions again. Our music groups have participated in Area All State competition, as well.

The future will bring some of the most challenging times we have ever seen in public education. These challenges include continuing economic issues, reduction of state aid after school began, and another reduction is possible in January. The mission of the Eden Central School District remains the same. We will continue to provide the best possible educational experiences we can, while balancing this against the needs and ability of our community. The Board of Regents in our state has established a very ambitious reform agenda that we must be part of. This agenda is rooted in the federal "Race to the Top" initiative, which includes:

- Adopting new learning standards and assessments to enhance preparation for college and the work place.
- Complete elimination of Regents Exams program in January. The only Regents Exams will be given in June beginning with 2012.
- Recruiting, developing and retaining effective Teachers and Principals.
- Building a new instructional data system to measure success; and
- Training around the lowest performing schools in the State.

This reform agenda will require our administrators, faculty and staff to work cooperatively to respond to those changes in a way that has a positive impact on our students. The impact of this initiative has already been seen in the form of increased student expectations on state assessments.

The coming year or two will be very different and challenging; however, this school district is one of the best, and we will do everything possible to maintain this status. We must continue our work together doing what is best for the youth of our community.

I would like to thank Mr. Beetow, our Director of Physical Education, Health & Athletics and Enrollment for his service to the District, as he starts a new position as Assistant Principal in the Iroquois School District. Ms. Marisa Fallacaro will become the Interim Director until the end of the school year. We look forward to working with her.

I would also like to thank the All Sports Booster Club and the PTA for their continued support and help in the District.

Thank you for your continued support of the Eden Central School District. I wish you all a very Happy Holiday season. I hope that everyone has the opportunity to enjoy the company of family and friends during this special time of the year.

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October and November Highlighted Ms. Wyman's 1st Grade Artists' ROCK PICTOGRAPHS at Eden Public Library

The first grade artists were introduced to cave art created in Prehistoric times. We discussed how art started 16,000 years ago and how and why the cave people drew on the cave walls. The true story of the teenager, Marcel Ravidat and his dog discovering the caves in Lascaux, France was told as inspiration.

We brainstormed animals that possess certain traits by a Dimension of Learning known strategy Carouseling. This activity allowed the artists to uncover

an animal that they shared a trait with Ex: I am as fast as a cougar or I am as smart as a fox. They chose their animal, and we practiced drawing the animal on paper through observation. Books models of animals were provided to encourage drawing skills. These drawings were then transferred to rocks that I collected from the lakeshore. We used rock colored acrylic paint and markers to create their prehistoric-like masterpieces. The Aboriginal artists from Australia used dots and patterns in their animal paintings. We combined the art from the Lascaux caves in France with the Aboriginal Animal "Dreamings" paintings from Australia.



Heather joined the Niagara-Frontier Volleyball at twelve years old. She started playing varsity in her freshman year, then took over the position of setter as a Sophomore. Gardner-Webb is a small school located in Boiling Spring, North Carolina. While visiting the campus, Gardner-Webb offered Heather a full scholarship to attend.

Heather is the first Eden Girls' Volleyball player to win a fourth state title. She joined the team as an eighth grader in 2006.

Heather also excels in the classroom where she is currently academically ranked number one in her class.

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Studio In Art Highlights

We have been very busy in the Studio in Art Class this year. Some of the highlights from my class are:

Projects -

Collage – Students created a collage composed of texture rubbings and a class quilt composed of squares that each student created to illustrate a specific design principle.

Coil Constructed Vessels – After they were dried then fired in the kiln, the students decorated the vessels by applying a lighter color slip on top of the terra cotta, cutting and scraping away the lighter topcoat to create designs inspired by their research of motifs found on ancient artifacts.

Ceramics – We learned about art's very earliest beginnings. In conjunction with the unit, we created a ceramics project - a small leaf plate built using the slab construction process.

Photo Reference Books – Students learned about art subject matter and were asked to produce six photos in each of six assigned subject matter categories. Special thanks to the Eden Rite Aid for providing discount coupons enabling the students to print their work locally, instantly, and at a very reasonable cost. We learned about the history of books and a bookbinding process. Students placed their photos and an analysis of each category of photos in their books, and they will use these photos as reference material for future projects.

Field Trips – We had a fantastic visit on October 8 at the Albright-Knox Art Gallery. We were able to see artists completing the new Sol LeWitt exhibit in the stairwell connecting the Albright building to the Knox building. We did several in-class activities to prepare for the visit. Special thanks go to our parent chaperones – Mrs. Kane, Mrs. Dole, Mrs. Johnson, and Mrs. Haley; to the Albright-Knox

Art Gallery's Education Department and its volunteer docents; to Blue Cross/Blue Shield of WNY for our admission and a generous allowance for our bus transportation. November 12th our class went to the Burchfield Penny Arts Center and the Buffalo Historical Society, seeing works produced in keeping with the allusive theme "Alternating Currents" as part of the regional show Beyond/In Western New York 2010. Special thanks go to our parent chaperone - Mrs. Nagle; to the Burchfield Penny Arts Center and its volunteer docents; to Beyond/In WNY 2010 for our reduced admission and free bus transportation. Our class also got a taste of college life by dining in Buff State's student union. We have some awesome pictures on my web site of the kids at these field trips.

Students who write a review of their visit accompanied by a ticket stub (or other "attendance evidence") will receive extra credit added to the quarter, the number of points depending on how detailed and insightful the written description is.
