

# **DENSITY DAY**By Lorry Malkowski

On September 27th and 28th, students in 6th grade science participated in "Density Day." They rotated to four stations which



reinforced the concept of density. They worked with five liquids with varying densities - creating density

layers in test tubes. Another station had them using triple beam scales to measure the mass and density of nine different materials. Students built boats and measured the mass they could contain before they sank. Finally, they worked in small groups to calculate answers to density

problems.

The students did an awesome job completing the different tasks!

# RED CROSS WILDERNESS AND REMOTE FIRST AID COURSE

New York's wilderness is beautiful—enjoy it safely! This 16-hour course is for those who work, live or play in remote areasaway from the usual EMS service. Even though the emergency workers near these areas may be trained to search for and rescue those in need, there may be a delay in the notification for assistance, the time required to get to the patient, or in moving the patient to more advanced treatment. This class covers assessment and urgent first aid techniques, but not in-depth CPR. Basic first aid skills are covered, making this course appropriate for anyone regardless of experience level. No prerequisites are required. Certification is valid for three (3) years. The course awards 1.6 CEU's. A minimum age of 15 is recommended for participants due to the serious nature of the course and scenarios. This course is recommended by the Boys Scouts of America, Girl Scouts of America and the American Camping Association to meet accreditation standards.


