As we begin this new school year, I would again like to thank the community for the continued support. It is this support, along with the work of our dedicated administrators, faculty and staff that allows us to provide abundant opportunities for our students to be successful and for the District to be one of the best in Western New York.

The schools have very active schedules planned for this school year. I would encourage all families and community members to attend these events and activities.

I am proud to announce that the N.Y.S. Education Department recently released the "School Report Card" for the 07-08 school year. Again, our students and teachers did an outstanding job. The 91% graduation rate placed Eden in the top five school districts in Western New York. Each Building Principal presented their Report Card to the Board of Education in August. In addition, the Business First rankings are out for the 2006-07 school year. The District continues to do well. We remained in the top 20% of school districts in Western New York. Our High School ranked 9th among Western New York Public High Schools. The Jr. High and Elementary schools both improved their rankings. Copies of these reports are available from your child's Principal.

We also received our 2008 Advanced Placement results for United States History and Calculus. The results are outstanding! In US History 96% of our students scored a three or better, while globally only 48% scored at that level. (Students need a three or better to receive college credit). In Calculus the results were very similar, as 100% of our students scored a three or better, while globally only 61% scored that high.

I look forward to another outstanding school year working together with the community, parents, teachers, administrators and staff.

ROCHESTER SCHOLARS STUDENT SPOTLIGHT: EDEN JUNIOR/SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT ATTENDS UNIVERSITY OF ROCHESTER OVER SUMMER VACATION

One Eden Junior/Senior High School student opted to get a taste of college at the University of Rochester during her summer vacation. Emily Falstewart, 10th grade, joined local students representing over 100 schools in attending Rochester Scholars, the University's prestigious pre-college academic program.

"I enjoyed it very much," said Mariko Tamate, Instructor for *As Easy as Saying Sushi: Intro to Japanese*, "I couldn't believe how much information they could take in."

For the past nineteen years, Rochester Scholars has given middle school and high school students the opportunity to experience college first-hand by participating in a variety of mini-courses. Around 400 students in grades 6-12 attended the program's one, two and three week 2008 Summer Sessions. These young scholars studied a variety of topics, including medicine, physics, engineering, communications, business, art, economics, philosophy, psychology, foreign languages, writing, journalism, astronomy, biology, and others. With no tests and little to no homework, students enjoyed a fun-filled curriculum consisting of hands-on activities, guest lecturers, and fieldtrips. Classes are taught by select UR faculty, graduate students, and top local educators and are held on the University's River Campus or in the Medical Center.

In addition to attending classes, students had the opportunity to participate in on-campus activities before and after class, such as lounging in Rush Rhees Library, browsing the University bookstore, or visiting one of many art collections. Students could also choose to attend an admissions and financial aid workshop with counselors from the University's Admissions Office and tour the campus.

EDEN CENTRAL SCHOOLS PLEASED WITH DISTRICT PERFORMANCE

The Business First definition sums it up, "find districts that achieve educational excellence despite spending a relatively low amount of money". That is exactly what the Eden Central School District has prided itself on for years. This year coming in at a ranking of 6th out of 97 area school districts in the cost-effectiveness category, Eden truly provides their students and taxpayers with the "biggest bang for their buck" in terms of educational quality and achievement.

The Eden Senior High School, ranked 18th out of 128 public and private high schools, and 9th out of public schools only, "boasts the best score among all high schools in Southern Erie, the territory sandwiched between the Southtowns and the Southern Tier". In addition, the Senior High School was awarded a special subject award in the area of science, which received a five star rating. Principal Marc Graff had the following to say, "When you look at these rankings, I believe it only strengthens the fact that we are one of the outstanding districts in Western New York and that we are truly giving our students an outstanding educational experience here in Eden. To be recognized as a top 10 public high school and having the best score among all high schools in Southern Erie county, is a testament to the hard work and dedication of our students, faculty, staff and parents. While there is always room to improve, I believe we should be extremely proud of our schools."

The Eden Junior High School, which is part of the Junior-Senior High School Complex, ranked 55 out of 211 public and private schools, and 24th among public schools only. This is a 13 slot improvement over last year's ranking.

The Eden Elementary School was selected as a Top 10 school in the Southern Erie area. Coming in at an overall ranking of 145 out of 289 public and private schools, the school ranked 103 out of public schools alone. Additionally, the school has continued to demonstrate growth by moving up in the rankings 6 places this year. Principal Rich Schaefer is quoted as saying, "The Eden Elementary School is continuously making incremental academic improvements as we align our curriculum with the New York State Standards. We are proud of the commitment of the faculty and staff of this building and the accomplishments of our students".

Unfortunately, at both the middle and elementary level, the only student achievement data that is considered for the Business First rankings is the ELA and Mathematics Assessments. The students of the Eden Central School District far exceed the New York State Performance Indicators set each year in each of the four core content areas for which assessments are given.

NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP SEMIFINALIST

Eden Jr./Sr. High School is proud to announce that senior, Joelle Crabtree, has been named a National Merit Scholarship Semifinalist. In each annual National Merit Scholarship Program, about 50,000 academically talented high school students are honored, but only about 16,000 of them are named Semifinalists. Students who qualify as Semifinalists based on their performance on the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) are the only program participants who have the opportunity to advance to the Finalist level and compete for National Merit Scholarships. About 8,200 of the outstanding Finalists will be chosen as Merit Scholarship winners in the 2009 competition.

The 2007 PSAT/NMSQT served as an initial screen of more than one million entrants to the 2009 National Merit Scholarship Program. Semifinalists are the highest scorers in each of the 50 states and represent less than one percent of each state's high school seniors. Although Semifinalist qualifying scores vary from one state to another, the scores of all Semifinalists are extremely high. The National Merit Finalists will be considered for several scholarship opportunities that range from one time \$2,500 - \$5,000 stipends, several corporate-sponsored Merit Scholarships awards, and college-sponsored Merit Scholarships.

Being honored as a National Merit Scholarship Semifinalist is a major accomplishment. Joelle Crabtree is an outstanding student, accomplished athlete, and all around gifted individual who deserves recognition for her achievements. Congratulations, Joelle!

Independent Health Foundation is kicking off an eight-month fitness initiative in hopes to change health habits in 250,000 youth, and Eden Elementary and the GLP are taking part. The Fitness for Kids Challenge encourages children age 14 and under residing in the eight counties of WNY to complete health and fitness activities for the entire school year. The initiative includes education, promotion, rewards, incentives and school competitions, and two community-wide events.

The Independent Health Foundation's Fitness for Kids Challenge is an eight-month initiative - Sept. 22, 2008 to May 22, 2009 - which is meant to combat the increase in obesity and Type 2 Diabetes in our youth. The study shows obesity rates increased in 37 states in the last year and did not decline in any. "Experts estimate that if we keep on the current course, 75 percent of Americans will be obese by 2015," the report concluded.

MYNUTRIKIDS.COM

With this being only the second year we are using the NutriKids prepayment service, I thought I would recap what it is and how to use it. Eden Central School District's Food Service Department is excited to provide parents a convenient, easy and secure online prepayment service to deposit money into your child's school meal account at any time. This service also provides parents the ability to view your child's account balance through a web site called MyNutrikids.com. By having money in each child's account prior to entering the cafeteria, we find the lunch lines move along much faster, so your child has more time to eat and be with friends. Parents will have the ability to print out a copy of their child's eating history report. This history report will show you all dates and times that your child has purchased a breakfast and or lunch within the past thirty days.

To access these services:

- 1. Simply go to the district web site at www.edencsd.org
- 2. Click on the Food Services link.
- 3. Click on the MyNutrikids.com link. From this site you will create your account and add money to your child's school meal account. All you need is your child's name; <FNAME> <LNAME>, student ID <STUDENT ID#> number and school ZIP code: 14057. If you don't know your child's ID #, you can call your child's school or my office at 992-3623.

Things to know:

- * If you have more than one child in the District, you can handle all online prepayments from the same online account.
- * Payments may be made through an existing PayPal account or with a major credit or debit card.
- * In order to use the online prepayment service, a small convenience fee for each transaction will be assessed to cover the bank fees. The convenience fee is \$1.75 per deposit transaction. Parents placing money into multiple meal accounts will only be assessed the \$1.75 fee once per deposit transaction. Eden Central School District will not profit from the use of this site. To offset the cost of this convenience fee, the District Food Service Department will provide one FREE meal for your son or daughter for every 20 lunches purchased.
- * Automatic low balance e-mail notifications. Parents will be able to establish school meal balance amounts so that if your child's account balance falls below the established amount, you will receive an email alerting you to the low balance. We believe this feature will provide more convenience to you by proactively notifying you of your child's balance status. The low balance amount will be set by you for each child, which will provide you with the flexibility to set a different balance notification amount per child.
- * Students at the GLP and Eden Elementary will only be able to use pre-pay funds for the purchase of a lunch and two ala cart items per day. Students at the Jr./Sr. High School do not have any limits on how they spend their pre-pay funds, although parents may customize their children's account by contacting the Food Service office at 992-3623.
- * If your child has qualified for free or reduced price lunches or breakfasts, this information is securely contained within the system and the meal will be processed just as it is for all other students. There is no need to be concerned for a potentially uncomfortable situation for the student.

We are very excited to offer these services and are confident this system will benefit you, your child and our District. However, if you choose not to take advantage of the online prepayment service, you may continue to make advance payments via check, which should be made payable to the Eden Central School District. Please write your child's full name and ID number: <Student ID #> on the check.

The following are step-by-step instructions to use NutriKids:

Registering for MyNutrikids.com

- You will first need your child's student ID number; you may get this number by contacting your child's school or contacting my office.
- Go to the district website at www.edencsd.org, then click on Food Services, click on the link to MyNutrikids.com OR go to www.MyNutrikids.com.
 - Click Sign Up and enter the required information.
 - Click Finish to complete the initial registration process.

Add Students to Your Family Account

- When you log in, you will be taken to the homepage.
- Click MyKids from the main menu OR from the blue navigation bar above.
- This is a listing of the students in your account. It will be empty on your first visit to the site.
- Click Add Child and enter the required information.
- Click Add (next to your child's name) to continue.
- Click Add Child to repeat the process for additional children.
- NOTE: Your child's transaction history report will not display information during the initial account set up process.

How to Make a Deposit

- Click Deposit Money located next to Add Student.
- Enter an amount in the Deposit column next to your child's name.
- If you have more than one child, enter the amount you wish to deposit into the column next to each child's name. DO NOT deposit money for your entire family into ONE child's account.
 - Click Calculate.
 - Click Make Deposit.
 - You will be directed to the PayPal web site to enter your payment information.
 - You have the option to use your existing PayPal account or a major credit card to make your payment.
 - If you are using your PayPal account, enter your email address and PayPal password to continue.
- If you are using a credit card, enter the required information. For your protection, MyNutrikids.com will not store your financial information.
 - Click Pay Now when finished.
 - Click Pay once again to finish the process.


