

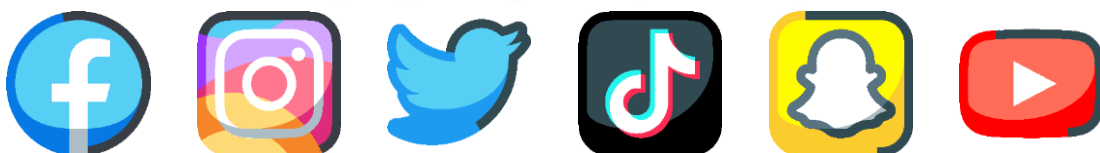

From the Desk of Principal Kazmierczak



Dear Families and Student:

Welcome to the 2024-2025 school year at Lincoln Park Middle School! I am so excited to see our 7th and 8th graders return to us after a summer of growth. A special welcome to our new 6th grade students and students who are new to Lincoln Park. At Lincoln Park Middle School, we value diversity and we assert that embracing our differences is what makes our school community great. Thank you for supporting our school community as we begin this journey into another school year.

We look forward to implementing quite a few changes to better serve our students. We will be starting a seven period day with a hybrid block schedule each week. The schedule allows for more student choice, better advisory connections, and will allow us to better support students who need extra help and provide enrichment opportunities for all our students throughout the year. Advisory classes will have a student number of between 16 and 20 students compared to WIN when we had more than 25 students. Parents, you will get to know your student's advisors well. The hybrid block schedule means that students will attend classes for longer periods of time on Wednesdays and Thursdays. This is a benefit for labs, individualized attention from the classroom teachers, and changing how we support learning.

We are excited to enter our second year as a Spanish Immersion Middle School. We now will have students in grades six and seven take two classes in the Spanish Immersion program. We are excited to continue to grow this program.

Lincoln Park continues to be a Full Service Community School. We are excited to announce that we have been awarded a grant to support and expand our afterschool programs. We will be able to offer transportation for certain clubs and activities later. This will impact our student athletes who will get to practice more than 45 minutes three times a week. It will also allow us to add staff to support our out of school time work and look for ways to expand offerings. This could include academic support, academic clubs, expanded arts opportunities, and the ability to bring in more community partners. Look for more information regarding these changes!

I want to invite all our families to our Open House on Wednesday, August 28, 2024 from 4:30-6:00 p.m. This is a great opportunity for you to meet teachers, pick up schedules, find classrooms and lockers, and get all the necessary paperwork taken care of before the year starts. Students will be able to pick up their schedules from their WIN teacher. You can find that by logging into Infinite Campus and checking your student's schedule or by checking in with a staff member in the Commons during Open House.

We are continuing as a 1:1 Chromebook school. The best way to ensure that your student has access to their device and email is to complete the Blended Learning Form. Scan Blended Learning QR code to complete this form online. We will also have Chromebooks available at the Open House for you to sign this e-document as well.



Students will have a variety of accounts that we use to support learning. These will include Reading Plus, IXL, and Canvas. Canvas is our learning management system for all secondary schools in Duluth. This is not a change for our 7th and 8th grade students, but our 6th grade students will be switching from See-. Scan Canvas Observer QR code to sign up for parent supervision rights in Canvas. Chromebook expected to be at school every day charged and ready to go.

We are also entering our third year of implementing Away for the Day. All students are required to leave their phones off (including smart watches and Bluetooth earbuds) and in their lockers during the school day. The distractions that cell phones are causing and the time lost is irreplaceable. We need to do right by our students and help them find balance as technology is truly a permanent part of their lives. Students will not have access to their cell phones from 8:45 a.m. (start of 1st period) to 3:15 p.m. (after 6th period). Cell phones, smart watches, earbuds, and headphones must be off and stored in their lockers. We ask that families continue to help by reinforcing this message at home. As always, our school has a landline phone in every class and office space so that a message can be delivered to a student during the day.

We will be continuing our focus to ensure all our students are proficient readers. As a building, we strive for consistency implementing reading strategies across all classrooms to support our students learning and growing into strong secondary school students. These efforts focus on vocabulary and teaching students how to interact with a variety of texts. We continue to have positive growth data since we implemented these strategies.

Communication with families and stakeholders is a priority of our school. During the past school year, Parent Square became a very effective mode of communication. I encourage parents and guardians to download the ParentSquare app, but it is not necessary. As we continue to learn more and grow with using this platform, we will bring you along. We will continue to use Infinite Campus, social media, a Smore newsletter, and phone. Make sure that you are able to sign into the Parent Portal in Infinite Campus. When logged in, please make sure your contact information is correct. If you do not have a Parent Portal account, please contact our office and we will help you set one up. This year, I will update our newsletter every other week. A link to our newsletters will be sent to you directly through Parent Square. You can find our website at <https://lincolnpark.isd709.org/>.

I am so excited to continue to serve our wonderful community at Lincoln Park Middle School as we embark on a new school year. I look forward to welcoming our students back for another great school year!

Reporting Student Absences

Please remember if your student is going to miss school for any reason, you must report the absence. There are several ways you can report absences; just choose which is more convenient for you!

Please remember the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) has a new health related reporting requirement that now includes gastrointestinal (GI) illness along with influenza-like (ILI) illness. If your child is experiencing symptoms or tested positive for one of the illnesses below please indicate which one when you report your child's absence:

- COVID - Student has tested positive for COVID.
- Influenza A - Student has a fever of 100.0°F or greater and cough or sore throat.
- Gastrointestinal Illness - Student is out ill due to vomiting and/or diarrhea.
- RSV - Student has tested positive to RSV.

Appointments During the School Day



We understand the appointments and events during the school day are unavoidable. Hockey tournaments and broken brace brackets don't wait for 3:15 p.m. If you are picking your student up during the school day for any reason (doctor, orthodontist, hockey, family event, etc.), there are a couple preferred options you can use to inform the school.

Option 1: Send your student in with a note the day they are leaving early. First thing in the morning, they should come to the office with their note from home stating why and when they will be picked up. We will exchange that note for a pass to leave class at that time. When the time comes on their pass, the student shows their teacher and

then comes to the main office.

Option 2: You can email the office at lincolnpark@isd709.org or send a message via ParentSquare to Kristen Hughes the evening before or morning (before 8:00 a.m.) the day your student will be leaving early. Then ask your student to stop in the office before school to pick up their pass before school.

Option 3: If you just found out about an appointment or forgot to send a note, call the main office as soon as you know you will need to pick up your student early that day. This gives us time to get a pass delivered to your student.

In the event that you arrive at the school without calling ahead of time or call to indicate that you are on the way, it requires interruption of classes and could lead to an extended waiting period.

Dropping Off Items for Students

If you are dropping off an item for your student, please let your student know the approximate time you will be dropping their item off and please remind your student that it is their responsibility to stop in the office between classes or at lunch to pick it up. Unfortunately, we cannot guarantee that we will be able to deliver the item to your student.



Annual Blended Learning Form and Chromebook Loan Agreement

The Duluth Public Schools strives to provide students with the most effective tools to enhance their learning. Teachers, assessment coordinators, and media specialists may use educational web-based programs and applications. Many of the educational web-based programs and applications require parent permission for children aged 18 and under. To give that permission, an annual Blended Learning Form must be completed. The Blended Learning form also contains the Chromebook Loan Agreement. You can fill it out by going to <https://bit.ly/3RyTaCm> or scanning the QR code to the left. If your student does not have a signed Blended Learning Form and Chromebook Loan Agreement, they will not receive their Chromebook and will not be able to access web-based programs and applications.

How to find your student's Pairing Code ... easy as 1, 2, 3!

1. Download the Canvas Parent app on your mobile device.

8. You will see all of the student's classes listed. You can click into any class and see what assignments are due, what is missing, and more.
9. Click on each class to see the assignments, grades, etc. Click on each assignment to see instructions, due dates, etc.
10. Need to contact a teacher? Simply click on the chat icon in the bottom right corner and a message window pops up.



Let's **ROAR** Together to Build a Positive Community! LPMS Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports (PBIS)



At Lincoln Park Middle School, Wildcats ROAR. We are Responsible, Open-minded, Accepting, and Restorative. We embrace our school wide expectations to show pride in ourselves, our school, and our community. We are responsible for our own learning, open-minded to different perspectives, accepting of all regardless of differences, and restorative when we make mistakes. We value each other.

What are Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports?

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is an evidence-based, tiered framework for supporting students' behavioral, academic, social, emotional, and mental health. When implemented, PBIS improves social emotional competence, academic success, and school climate. It is a way to create positive, predictable, equitable and safe learning environments where everyone thrives.

Why use Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports?

PBIS is a framework for creating safe, positive, equitable schools, where every student can feel valued, connected to the school community and supported by caring adults. By implementing evidence-based practices within a PBIS framework, schools support their students' academic, social, emotional, and behavioral success, engage with families to create locally-meaningful and culturally-relevant outcomes, and use data to make informed decisions that improve the way things work for everyone.

Schools who build Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (PBIS) make an intentional decision to:

- Create a safe and welcoming school community for everyone – students, families, and staff.
- Adopt universal and positively stated school expectations.
- Regularly teach and practice the school-wide expectations.
- Recognize and acknowledge students who demonstrate positive behaviors and uphold school expectations.
- Review and use data frequently to help drive decision making.
- Identify and utilize a variety of interventions to help support students who are struggling to be their best selves.
- Implement several restorative practices to help build community and relationships.

What is the Family Role in Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports?

Including families in PBIS implementation means families and school personnel work together and share in the responsibility of making educational decisions and improving student outcomes. Through effective family engagement, families and schools work together to create a positive school environment where all students feel successful, supported, valued and seen.

How can parents use PBIS at home?

Expectations: Create 3-5 positively worded expectations for the whole house. Keep it simple! (Ex. Be Responsible)

Examples: Create a few examples of what each of those expectations looks like for the house. Ask for your child's feedback. (Ex. Our family is responsible when they clean up after themselves)

Be Creative: Find ways to embed learning in your regular day and create space for children to practice your expected family behaviors.

Celebrate: When you see your child upholding a family expectation, celebrate it! Tell them what you liked and appreciated about their behavior!

Be Patient: This type of system doesn't help solve everything, but it can help define expectations and focus on the positive outcomes. This small shift in looking for and rewarding positive behaviors can lead to much larger changes in how you think about and relate to your family.

Model and Promote Emotional Wellness: Your response in stressful and difficult situations teaches your student how to cope during stressful situations.

Dear Families:

We are excited to let you know that Lincoln Park Middle School is continuing to implement The Parent Teacher Home Visit Program (PTHVP). This is a national program intended to build positive relationships with families and to partner together to support your student(s). Parents and school staff come together, in a unique off campus setting such as at your home or other location of your choice, to get to know one another and talk about your student's future. Your student is also a part of this visit.

During the visit, time is taken to share your hopes and dreams for your child, experiences, and school resources. This is not a parent/teacher conference. It is meant to get to know each other and to build a positive relationship with each other, for the benefit of your student.

Studies show that this program has increased student academic achievement and improved parent engagement in schools. It has brought schools and families closer together and created opportunities for better communication between home and school.

You may be contacted by a Lincoln Park staff member to discuss a home visit. This is NOT a meeting to tell you what to do as a parent. This is a time to get to know you and your student away from school. This is also a time for you to get to know a member of our school community.

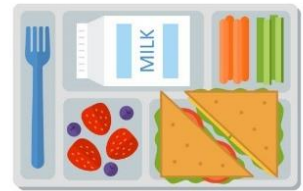

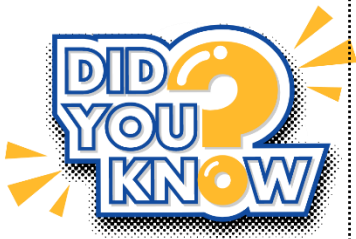
