With the temperature hovering at 97 degrees and the heat index dancing on the edge of the TSSAA's allowable limit. Crockett County's athletic season officially began Tuesday when the Cavalier golf teams hosted their first matches of Fall 2024.

"Fall," of course, is a misnomer. August in West Tennessee is as close to "fall" as the Olympics are to backyard badminton. Nevertheless, the Cav linksters teed it up against Dyer County and Jackson North Side Tuesday afternoon at the Crockett Golf & Country Club, trying to time their swings in between the gobs of sweat dripping into their eyes.

For the record, Crockett's boys -with several players competing in a varsity match for the very first time - gave the Choctaws a competitive match before falling 171 to 179, but also chalked up a win over North Side by fielding a complete team while the visitors had just three participants. All of the Cav scorers shot lower than the Indian trio anyway. Dyer County's girls captured a match win over Crockett 87 to 107 as each school used two scores.

Following the afternoon golf outing, it was over to Cavalier Stadium for the annual "Meet the Cavs" night - and the person with the best idea of coping with the stifling heat was girls basketball assistant coach Brent Fronabarger, who offered himself up as a dunk tank "target" and thereby was frequently falling into a large tub of refreshing water as several baseball players jumped at the chance to soak their former field general.

Several of the Cavalier teams had organized games to play and engaged as many community members as possible, but it was so hot that most fans were ready for the team introductions and then a race to their cars to start up the air conditioning. All the Crockett sports teams were honored, along with the Marching Cavaliers Band.

Before that, however, Coach Chris Eubanks' golfers accounted themselves well despite some first-match jitters. With only sophomore Jack Shaver having much match experience, Eubanks and assistant coach Pate Randall knew this season would be a learning curve for their freshmen-laden squad - but both also feel that as these players get some course time under their belts, they could eventually become a solid lineup.


Shaver and freshman George Randall both shot first-match scores of 40, just a few strokes behind medalist Jarrett Harrison of Dver County (37) and runnerup Seth LaRue (39). Another Cav freshman, Max Woods, matched the Choctaws' third-best score (Dalton Muncrief's 46). Tritt Moore and Clay Kail each shot 53 for the Cavs' fourth counting score, while Cooper Criswell carded a 49 for Dyer County.

Crockett's girls - Rachel Crossnoe and newcomer Addalynn Dunn - posted rounds of 51 and 56, respectively. They were topped by the Lady Choctaws' Kennedy Hill (38) and Josie Ferguson (49). North Side did not field a female entry. Next up for Crockett is the annual high school FCA Tournament at the Jackson Country Club on Monday at 9:00 a.m.




