Office Hours

We are here to assist you and your child. Please feel free to call or visit us. Our office phone number is <u>406-268-7045</u>. We are available to answer the phone from 7:45-4:15 daily. If we are with a student and unable to answer the phone, please leave a message, and your call will be promptly returned. Before and after hours, we have voicemail available for your convenience. Additionally, each staff member has a telephone in their area to enable easy communication.

School Hours

School Start Time: 8:25 AM
Dismissal Time: 3:20 PM
Dismissal Time: 2:45 PM

Attendance and Tardies

Attendance matters to our school district and community. In order for your child to receive the maximum benefit of our education system, they are expected to attend school every day except for illness, medical appointments, or a family emergency.

If it is necessary for your child to miss school, please call the school office at 268-7045. If an absence is necessary, parents or guardians must notify the school by 9:00 a.m. on the day of the absence. If no contact is made, your child's absence will be marked as unexcused. If your child is absent due to a medical appointment or illness, please bring in a doctor's note so we can mark the absence as exempt.

If your children are tardy for school, please have them check into the office prior to going to the classroom. They will be considered tardy if they are not in their classrooms when school begins.

Student Check-Out

If a student leaves the school during school hours, they need to check out in the office. Students must have a signed parent permission slip to do so. If you come to the school to pick up your child during the day, please check them out in the office.

Breakfast Program

Giant Springs School offers a breakfast program five days a week served <u>in</u> your child's classroom. Please do not send children to school until 8:10.

Early Arrival

Students can arrive on the school grounds at 8:10 AM. The HANDS program is available for students who need to come before 8:10 AM. Make sure and sign up your child as soon as possible.

Before and After School

Supervision begins at 8:10 am. Students will wait at their assigned grade level door until the bell rings at 8:25. Students are expected to go directly home after school. We do not have staff available to supervise students after school. After school plans must be made at home.

Elementary Lunch

Giant Springs has qualified to feed ALL students breakfast and lunch every day free of charge. Free and Reduced Lunch forms must be completed yearly by ALL families for us to continue qualifying for our free meals grant.

• Please avoid sending sodas, energy drinks and coffee in student lunches and snacks. Milk can be purchased, or you can send juice or water.

HANDS

Giant Springs School will again be offering before and after school childcare through the HANDS (Heroes and Neighbors Down at the School) program. A child must be registered, and a fee needs to be paid before a child can attend. Information can be found at: www.handschildcare.org/. HANDS Hours: 6:45 a.m.-6:00 p.m.

Medication/Prescription and Non-prescription

We ask that all medication, including cough drops, be checked in at the office with directions for administering. If it is a prescription, you must have the doctor complete the medical form and meds must be brought to the office in their original container. These forms are available at the doctor's office or at the school. Please label the time(s) the medication should be taken. You will need to come and give your child their medication unless we have the proper forms on file.

All medications (including cough drops) are to be stored in the office as per School District policy. For a student to carry and self-administer asthma medication on school grounds or for school sponsored activities, a form must be completed by the prescribing physician and guardian. If your child has any health problems that may require special consideration, please inform the teacher and the office.

Homework

Homework is assigned at the teacher's discretion. Your child's teacher will discuss the homework plan during Back to School Night.

Wednesday Envelope

Student work and information for you about our district and school goes home on Wednesdays. Please take time to go through the envelopes, ask questions, sign and return any info requiring response by you. Please sign the envelope and return it with your child on Thursday. If your child splits his/her time with two parents/guardians and you would like a second Wednesday folder, please request one through your child's teacher.

Money and Personal Items

<u>Students should be advised to leave money, toys, and other personal items at home.</u> We have no safe location for keeping these items. Lockers are not secure, and classrooms are not monitored during breaks and lunch. Personal items are all vulnerable to theft. It is best to leave them at home. These toys and other personal items include but are not limited to trading cards, soccer balls, footballs, tails, costumes, and Heelys.

Cell Phones, Smart Watches and Other Electronic Devices

If you require your child to have a phone, smart watch or other electronic device at school, you must know the following:

- Students may use cellular phones, smart watches, and other electronic signaling devices before school begins and after school ends. This means that students may use these devices outside of the school building but on campus before school and after school.
- Once inside of the school building, these devices must be TURNED OFF and stored in their backpack. Exceptions will be made only with the express permission of the principal.
- Giant Springs Elementary will not be responsible for the loss or damage of personal property.
- Cyber bullying is on the rise nationwide. Be sure to protect your child by only giving out his/her phone number on an as needed basis.

Dress and Grooming

Students are reminded that their appearance significantly affects the way others respond to them. The personal appearance of students will be respected provided it does not interfere with the health and safety of students or others and does not disrupt the educational process.

- Unless it is a hat day, students and staff will remove their hats and hoods from their heads upon entering the building. Exceptions will be made only with the express permission of the principal.
- Clothing advertising tobacco, alcohol and/or other drugs is not allowed. All language on clothing must be appropriate and respectful for an elementary school environment.

School Safety

Walkers:

Always use the crosswalks and intersections when walking to school and home.

Parents, please model appropriate crossing and waiting. Obey the directions of the crossing guards.

Do not encourage your child to cross in the middle of the street.

Bikers:

Students riding bikes to school must have locks for safety and wear helmets. Bikes can only be ridden off school grounds and must be stored and locked in the bike racks.

Bus Riders: Parents and students must be familiar with the rules and procedures of riding school buses. All stops are posted in the paper and are available by calling the office. Riding the bus is a privilege and if abused, it can be denied. Children are not allowed to bring guests on the bus.

Car Travelers: Because traffic is such a concern here at Giant Springs, we implore parents to be especially cautious when bringing and picking up your child. <u>Plan for congestion and confusion both morning and afternoon; we do report all violations of parking and safety to the police department in an attempt to keep our students safe.</u> Allow plenty of time to get here and drop off children only after pulling up to a curb. DO NOT STOP in the middle of the street and unload children.

Visitors

Anytime you come to school to visit or volunteer, you will sign in at the office. This is an essential safety protocol.

Birthdays

As part of our commitment to promoting a healthy and inclusive environment at our school, we have established specific guidelines regarding snack and birthday treat policies. Celebrations are encouraged, but any treats brought to school for birthdays must be store-bought and free from common allergens. This policy ensures the safety of all students, particularly those with food sensitivities and allergies, some of which can be life-threatening.

For those seeking snack and birthday treat ideas, here are some healthy and less healthy options that are free from major allergens:

- Fresh fruit (apples, bananas, grapes)
- Cut-up vegetables (carrots, cucumber slices, bell peppers)
- Cheese sticks or cubes
- Yogurt cups or pouches (check for allergens)
- Popcorn (plain or lightly salted)
- Rice cakes or chips
- Beef sticks
- Fruit snacks
- Cupcakes (check for allergens)
- Cookies (check for allergens)

Furthermore, the school welcomes the celebration of student birthdays. However, to accommodate any allergies, homemade baked goods are not permitted for classroom distribution. Usually treats are handed out in the last 15 minutes of the day. Make sure to have plenty for all.

<u>We DO NOT give out birthday party invitations at school unless all children in the class are invited.</u>

Giant Springs Guidelines for Success

Giant Springs Elementary will utilize a school-wide behavior system that all adult staff members are responsible for upholding. Teaching, modeling, practicing, and re-teaching are vital in successful implementation. Additionally, all adults need to give clear and consistent messages to students regarding their behavior.

The responsibility for basic behavior development rightfully belongs with the student and families. At the same time, effective learning cannot take place without good discipline. Therefore, we will hold students accountable for their behavior while at school. By doing this we can ensure that a proper educational environment will be provided.

The following is a list of the major guidelines which

students are expected to respect and follow at Giant Springs Elementary School. Please take time to discuss these guidelines with your child.

All children make mistakes and make poor choices at times. This does not mean they are bullies or even displaying bully behavior. Bully behavior is defined as behavior that:

- is aggressive and involves unwanted, negative actions,
- is repeated over time, and
- involves an imbalance of power.

Bullying

We will not bully others.

We will help students who are being bullied.

We will try to include others who are being left out.

If we know somebody is being bullied, we will tell an adult at school and at home.

Responsible

Treat others as they wish to be treated Keep hands, feet, objects to yourself

Ready

Follow directions the first time

Respectful

Use appropriate language and voice

Be kind

Treat others as they wish to be treated

Perseverance

Try, try, try...Never give up, Always do my best.

Respect

Be kind to myself and others in all I think, do, or

Integrity

Do the right thing even when no one else is watching. Wrong is wrong even if others are doing it.

Decision-Making

Think it through before I do. I am in control of myself and my behavior.

Empathy

Understand and respect the feelings of others.

School-wide guidelines also apply to students while they are going to and from school as well as at all before and after school functions, including field trips.

All disciplinary measures are in accordance with the GFPS Student Code and applicable state statutes. Communication with parents regarding a disciplinary action will either be verbal or in writing. Discipline reports will be issued for serious or chronic infractions. When an office referral is involved, usually parents are contacted by the teacher or principal.

In some cases, involving an intervention specialist, psychologist, or counselor is required when the typical strategies used by teachers just are not working. We work as a team to find the best solution. Sometimes an individual behavior plan will be developed to assist the child in being successful. We appreciate your support and follow-up with serious behavior issues that impact the learning of your child and the learning of others.

Celebrations

Character Tickets

Students who demonstrate outstanding citizenship will be honored with a note and a chance at a weekly drawing with a small token of appreciation for their efforts. These students will be recognized as leaders in our school!

Student of Strong Character

A student from each classroom is selected based on character trait of the month, as well as demonstrating all of our Character Strong traits. This student is a role model in the classroom. Student of the Month is selected from these students every month.

Student of the Month

Students are selected based on character trait of the month. Students should exemplify character traits and be role models in the classroom. One student is chosen for each grade level each month.

Please read and review these expectations with your child. Your support in providing a proper learning environment is essential!

Giant Springs School Expectations

These school-wide expectations have been explained to your child. They also correspond to the "Guidelines for Success" which have been included in this packet as well. We feel it is important to share these expectations with you. You will have an opportunity to address school-wide expectations, as well as classroom expectations at our Back to School Night.

Before School:

- 1. Arrive **after** 8:10 AM and will wait at their assigned grade level door until the bell rings at 8:25. Supervision begins at 8:10 AM
- 2. **NO WEAPONS**, toys or real, are allowed at school.
- 3. No personal items are allowed at school. The school is not responsible for any of these lost or stolen items. Phones, smart watches and electronic devices should stay in backpacks. See page GS8 for more details.
- 4. Bikes and scooters ridden to school must be locked to the bike racks and cannot be ridden on school grounds.
- 5. If you drop off your child, please use the designated drop off spots by their assigned grade level door. **Do not use the bus zone.**

Recess:

- 1. Students must have a daily note or phone call from parents to stay in at recess. They may be sent to a Buddy Room.
- 2. Students may not enter the building during recess without permission from an aide.
- 3. Students will leave and enter the building in an orderly manner.
- 4. Students will follow the safety rules and our school-wide expectations.

Lunchroom Expectations:

- 1. Students are asked to wait patiently, talk quietly, and eat politely.
- 2. Trading food is not allowed. Students need to eat and touch their own lunch. Students are encouraged to drink milk, juice, or water. No pop, energy drinks or coffee are allowed.
- 3. Students are responsible for cleaning up after themselves.
- 4. Students will sit where directed and wait to be dismissed.
- 5. All students are required to take a hot lunch or pack a lunch.

Hallway Expectations:

- 1. Students will walk on the right side of the hallway and stairs.
- 2. Voice level is at 0 or 1.

After School Expectations:

- 1. Bus students must ride the bus unless they have a note and/or phone call from their parents.
- 2. Students must leave the building and grounds immediately after dismissal and may not return to the playground until **after** 4:00 PM.
- 3. Bikes, skateboards, rollerblades, and scooters may not be ridden on school grounds. Students need to walk their bikes and scooters until they are off school property.
- 4. Students will use their designated exit doors at the end of the day to minimize congestion. Please pick up at your student's designated grade level door.
- 5. Do NOT park in the Bus Zone.
