Students can enjoy several after school club offerings taught by our dedicated staff (arts and sports)







# Helpful Information



#### School Hours

The school office is open daily between the hours of 8:00am and 4:30pm.

Transitional Kindergarten: Monday-Friday 8:55-12:15

ILS Kindergarten: Monday-Friday 8:55-12:55

Kindergarten-Grade 5: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday 8:55-3:30

Kindergarten-Grade 5: Thursday 8:55-2:15

Minimum Days: 8:55-12:20

Breakfast and lunch are served daily, free of charge.

Breakfast service and supervision begins at 8:20

Students may not be dropped off prior to 8:20am

#### Morning Routines

**Students in grades TK and Kindergarten** begin their day in the classroom. Doors open at 8:40.

Students in grades 1-5 begin their day on the lower lot for Walk Club.

Safety Gates will be closed and locked at 9:15







#### **Parking Lot Safety**

#### DO:

- Go slow and pull up to curb
- Move forward and stay in your vehicle
- Right turn ONLY out of parking lot
- Use crosswalks
- Practice patience and care
- Follow guidance from staff

#### DO NOT:

- Hurry
- Double park
- Stop in middle of lot
- Run across street
- Leave car unless parked in stall
- Disregard staff guidance

For the welfare and protection of our students, the following procedures and policies are in place to maximize safety.

### Student Safety

#### Early Dismissal

Adults requesting an early dismissal are required to come to the front office and record the dismissal with proper identification.

A student may only be released to a parent, guardian or adult noted on the student's emergency card.

You can update your emergency card and contacts in the Parent Portal or contact the school office.

#### Safety Fence

Campus will be locked and secured during school hours. All visitors and volunteers must route through the school office to sign-in prior to gaining access to campus.

#### Safety Brills

Various drills are taught and practiced throughout the school year. Reach out to your student's teacher or contact the office if you have specific questions.

#### Medication at School

If your student requires access and administration of regular medications, the school must receive a Medical Release form completed by your child's physician. Selected school staff may store and/or dispense prescribed medication when in the original container. Inhalers must be kept in the office while a child is at school. No medication may be with a student at any time including cough drops, pain relievers, and/or over the counter medications.





#### Why is attendance important?

For your child to get the most from their educational experience, it is important and necessary to attend school each day. Students miss valuable instructional time whenever they are late or leave early from school. By regularly attending school, your child strengthens learning and increases the knowledge needed for them to reach their full potential.

#### Reporting an Absence

Please notify the school office if your child is going to be absent as soon as possible. To do so, either:

Please state the student's name, teacher, date, and reason for the absence. We truly appreciate your timely communication.

#### Please Note

If a student is tardy or absent an excessive amount, the school attendance clerk, along with the principal, will schedule a meeting to discuss concerns and offer support. If the pattern continues, the school may refer the student to the San Juan Unified School Attendance Review Board (SARB) for further action. Punctuality and attendance are very important for all students' academic success for a bright future.

#### Title-I School Parent and Family Engagement Policy Cameron Ranch Elementary School

Cameron Ranch Elementary School has developed a written Title-I parental involvement policy with input from Title-I parents and has distributed the policy to parents of Title-I students. The policy describes the means for carrying out the following Title I parental involvement requirements [20 USC 6318 Section 1118/a)-(f) inclusive).

#### Involvement of Parents in the Title I Program

To involve parents in the Title I program at Cameron Ranch Elementary School, the following practices have been established:

- 1. The school convenes an annual meeting to inform parents and families of Title I students about Title I requirements and about the right of parents and families to be involved in the Title I program.
  - a. Parents and families are informed of the school wide program, including ways to get involved during the annual Back to School Night meeting.
  - b. Cameron Ranch Elementary School has a Meet and Greet event and Back to School Night within the first three weeks of school to build relationships with families. Cameron Ranch hosts Principal Chats throughout the school year to strengthen opportunities to inform parents about academic and social-emotional programs, as well as ways to volunteer and get involved.
  - c. During Back to School Night, each teacher provides information to the parent about grade level and state standards (Common Core State Standards), as well as district approved research-based curriculum and school-based assessments.
  - d. Information is provided during ELAC and SSC meetings.
  - e. During scheduled teacher-parent conferences, teachers inform parents of their child's progress on reaching grade level proficiency and performance on school-based assessments, district assessments, and state assessments.
- 2. The school offers a flexible number of meetings for Title I parents, such as meetings in the morning or afternoon
  - a. Parents are invited to schedule an appointment with the teachers, principal, and/or counselor at any time throughout the year.
  - b. Parents are invited to attend monthly School Site Council meetings.
  - c. Parents of English Language Learners are also encouraged to participate in ELAC, which meets a minimum of four times a year, and are provided the same information during SSC, including information about Title I programs and funding resource
  - d. Parents are informed and invited to participate in the School Site Council (SSC) which meets a minimum of seven times throughout the year.
  - e. Meeting minutes and agendas are listed on the school's website.
- The school involves parents and families of Title I students in an organized, ongoing, and timely way in the planning, review, and improvement of the school's Title I programs and the Title I parental involvement policy.
  - a. The Academic Program is reviewed and input is provided during School Site Council meetings.
     b. In the annual revision of the SPSA, parents are invited to the SSC/ELAC meetings to provide input.
  - c. Upon identification of parental need for information in another language or in another format, the school will take steps to ensure that the parent request is fulfilled.
- The school provides parents and families of Title I students with timely information about Title I programs.
  - a. Parents are provided information about school wide programs during Back to School Night, School Site Council meetings, ELAC Meetings, and are welcomed to schedule an appointment with the teachers and/or principal at any time throughout the year.
