

ACADEMIC PROGRAM SPECIFICS

- Sayre School does not provide class rank due to small class sizes
- GPA is weighted +1.0 for Honors and AP courses (all other courses are considered college preparatory)
- AP classes have selective enrollment based on criteria determined by each department
- Logistical constraints of the schedule may limit opportunities for some AP and Honors classes in the junior and senior years
- Most APs are not open to students until their junior and senior years
- Students enrolled in an AP course must sit for the exam
- 19 AP classes offered
- 24 Carnegie credits required to graduate
