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
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# **APPLICATION**

Create a student profile in Veracross, our admissions portal, at **www.parktudor.org/apply**. After creating the profile, you will continue the admissions process by completing all steps listed.

An application fee is required.

- \$150 for JK1 applicants (includes the cost of an individual developmental admissions assessment)
- \$50 for JK2-12th grade applicants

# **RECOMMENDATION FORMS**

Please utilize Veracross to assign teachers to complete the Park Tudor recommendation forms. Recommendations should not be completed by family members or relatives.

# ASSESSMENT/TESTING AND SHADOW DAYS

JK1	JK2 and SK
Applicants must complete an individual developmental assessment with our Lower School psychologist. This assessment will examine a variety of skills that predict school success. In addition to the developmental assessment, JK1 applicants will join us for a playdate. These playdates will last approximately one hour.	Applicants will join us for a combined playdate and short admissions assessment. This event will last approximately one hour.
Grades 1-3	Grades 4-11
Applicants will experience a day (morning) in the life of a Park Tudor student by attending classes, meeting teachers, and getting to know our community. During the morning, applicants will also take part in a short reading and math assessment.	Applicants must take the Independent School Entrances Exam (ISEE). ISEE registration details can be found in your child's Veracross profile. Additionally, applicants to grades 4-12 will participate in a shadow day where they attend classes, meet faculty members and get to know our community.

#### REPORT CARDS

Applicants to grades 1-12 must upload a copy of current semester and previous year's grades or progress reports in the Veracross admissions portal.

# TRANSFER STUDENTS

On occasion, a student's high school is not the right fit. Students wishing to transfer to Park Tudor in grades 9-11 should apply in the same manner as all new applicants and will be considered on a space available basis, very rarely, applicants to 12th grade will be considered dependent on circumstances. Please note that in order to be considered for a transfer, applicants should provide an official high school transcript and must have:

- · A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
- · No failing grades

# FINANCIAL AID AND MERIT AID

**Financial Aid and Merit Aid:** Park Tudor celebrates and recognizes the academic achievement of its students. In 2023–24, Park Tudor awarded more than \$4.7 million in financial aid and merit awards to 34% of our student population. In grades 6-12 merit awards range from \$500 to full tuition, with an average award of approximately \$6,000.

Many families would like to provide their children with a private school education but assume they cannot afford it. Many financial aid options including payment plans, need-based financial aid, and merit scholarships, are available to help families make a Park Tudor education more affordable.

Awards are granted to families from a variety of financial backgrounds, including those who may have a high level of demonstrated need and those who may require only minimal financial assistance.
