

HOMELESS CATEGORIES
McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act
Defined by where people live

1. **ON THE STREET** – Living on the street or living in a make-shift shelter such as cars, tents, abandoned buildings, etc.
2. **SHELTERED** – Foster children, anyone living in temporary residence facility for individuals or families or abuse shelters or other shelter facility, transitional housing through a shelter.
3. **DOUBLING UP** – Children and immediate family have moved in with other relatives or friends. Without such temporary arrangement, they would be without a home or shelter. Highly mobile people whose housing changes frequently.
4. **Hotel/ Motel** – People who live in welfare sponsored room or rooms in a hotel/motel.
5. **UNACCOMPANIED YOUTH** – Young people experiencing homelessness who are not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian.
