HOMELESS CATEGORIES

McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act Defined by where people live

- ON THE STREET Living on the street or living in a make-shift shelter such as cars, tents, abandoned buildings, etc.
- SHELTERED Foster children, anyone living in temporary residence facility for individuals or families or abuse shelters or other shelter facility, transitional housing through a shelter.
- DOUBLING UP Children and immediate family have moved in with other relatives or friends. Without such temporary arrangement, they would be without a home or shelter. Highly mobile people whose housing changes frequently.
- 4. Hotel/ Motel People who live in welfare sponsored room or rooms in a hotel/motel.
- 5. UNACCOMPANIED YOUTH Young people experiencing homelessness who are not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian.
