Scoliosis screening will begin soon for students in 6th and 8th grade. preparticipation sports physical includes screening for scoliosis. Students who have completed the sports physical for the 2017 - 2018 school year will not be screened. Any parent who would like their child exempt from this screening must send in a written note with this request to Mrs. Anderson. Scoliosis screening results may indicate that your child needs further evaluation to determine whether he or she has a spinal deformity and, if so, what treatment may be necessary. Scoliosis is a side- to-side curvature of the spine that can cause complications if left untreated. Although the cause is unknown, the condition becomes more apparent during the adolescent growth spurt. If detected early, scoliosis can be treated.
