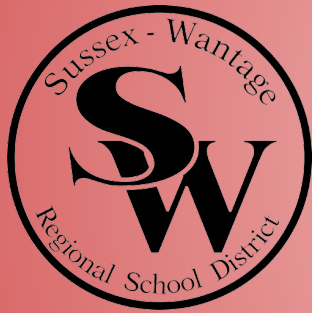

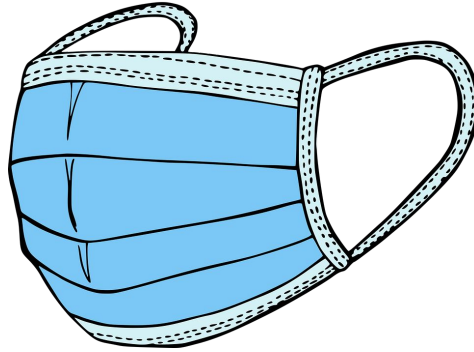


Congratulations to the SMS students
