FRIDAY, AUGUST 23RD

The Orchestra instruments are VIOLIN, VIOLA, CELLO, and BASS.

Learning to play an instrument is a wonderful opportunity for students to develop discipline, commitment, responsibility, teamwork skills, as well as learning more about music. It can be an enjoyable activity that helps to develop self confidence, and an expressive outlet they can carry on through their lives.

The Orchestra program continues in the 5th grade, and the Middle Schools and High Schools.

INTRODUCTION TO THE ORCHESTRA INSTRUMENTS

Recently, your student attended an assembly about the VIOLIN, VIOLA, CELLO, and BASS. Students heard the differences between the instruments, and how they use the bow to produce sound, and sometimes they pluck the strings, called pizzicato. Your student will have a “hands on” experience with the different Orchestra instruments in the week following the assembly.

ORCHESTRA REGISTRATION AND COST

There is no fee to participate in Orchestra at the Elementary level. Guardians are responsible for renting or obtaining an instrument, a lesson book, and supplies needed to play the instrument.

A good quality instrument in proper working condition is required. It is essential that the instrument is the correct size for the student (1/2, 12”, etc.) (eg. An instrument that is too large or small makes learning more difficult. All instruments should include a case, bow, rosin, and fine tuners for all 4 strings. Cellos and Bass need rock stops, and violins and violas will need shoulder rests.

Essential Elements for Strings, Book 1 for their instrument is the required book to purchase for lessons this year. All other music will be provided.

A collapsible metal music stand is highly recommended for home practice. This promotes the development of proper playing position.

ORCHESTRA LESSONS

Your student will receive a 30 minute weekly group lesson during the school day at their school. When possible, lessons are scheduled on a rotating basis so students will not miss the same time of day each week. The average group size is 5-8 students, usually of like instruments. Students are responsible for making up any class work missed while attending their lesson. Lesson schedules will be distributed to all Orchestra members before lessons start.

AFTER SCHOOL REHEARSALS

After school rehearsals will begin in October and will take place every week for one day after school until 2:50pm with the exception of Prairiewood rehearsals which run until 3:15pm. You will receive a schedule in late September with these dates. Guardians will be expected to provide transportation for their student after each rehearsal. Attendance is highly recommended.

ORCHESTRA EXPECTATIONS

1. Attend lessons, rehearsals, and concerts.
2. Remember to bring your instrument, music book, and pencil on your lesson day.
3. Try to practice a minimum of 10 minutes per day, 5-7 days a week.
4. Be on your best behavior at all times, respecting others and all the instruments.
5. Be patient, cooperative and keep trying! Learning an instrument takes time and practice.
6. Try to make the commitment to play the entire school year.
7. Have fun and enjoy learning to play your string Orchestra instrument!

HOME PRACTICE

Practice requirements start at 10 minutes a day, 5-7 days a week. There will be weekly assignment sheets with practice charts attached. Most students need assistance establishing good practice habits. Families, please provide a quiet place for practice and remind and encourage your student to practice. Keep the instrument safely in its case when not in use, away from siblings, friends, and pets. **Please remind your child to bring their instrument and music to school on the day of their lesson, encourage them to play for family, and offer encouragement regularly. Help your student to understand the commitment and encourage them to complete a full school year before making any decisions about the instrument.**

ACQUIRING AN INSTRUMENT

It is best to start a student in Orchestra by renting an instrument from a reputable music company. This way your child is ensured a quality instrument that is correctly sized, and can switch to the next size when needed. Instrument purchases are best made when the student is ready for a full size instrument. (Generally, students will make one move up in instrument size during 4th grade.) *Beware of cheap and synthetically colored instruments for sale! We strongly advise against purchasing instruments from online retailers such as Amazon as they are often very poor quality.* When the quality of the instrument is poor, it makes it more difficult for your child to properly learn to play their instrument.

Cassandra Strings

Cassandra strings is highly respected and very reputable, and renting an instrument through this company is recommended by the D200 Orchestra Program. A representative from Cassandra Strings comes out to D200 weekly to service instruments at your child's school. Renting through Cassandra Strings is a convenience to the guardian because purchases, instrument switches, repairs, etc. are taken care of for free through the orchestra teacher at each school. Rental cost per month is between \$25-\$70, depending on the instrument. Please be prepared to make your first payment when you complete the rental process. You will also be able to purchase Essential Elements for Strings Book 1 at this time, as well as a music stand, if desired.

We will be holding two in-person Rental Open House meetings this year, but you can complete the rental process online at your convenience as well. The Rental Open House will be held on Thursday, August 22nd from 5-7:30pm at Creekside Middle School and Friday, August 23rd from 5-7:30pm at Northwood Middle School.

If you complete the rental process prior to or by Wednesday, August 28th, your student will receive their instrument and book at their first school lesson!

You may also choose to rent elsewhere. If you choose a different store than those above, you will need to go to the store to rent an instrument. Please remember to rent the correct size and get the required book.

If you already own an instrument, please have your child bring it into school for their first lesson so the orchestra teacher can make sure it is in good playing condition, and it is the correct size.
