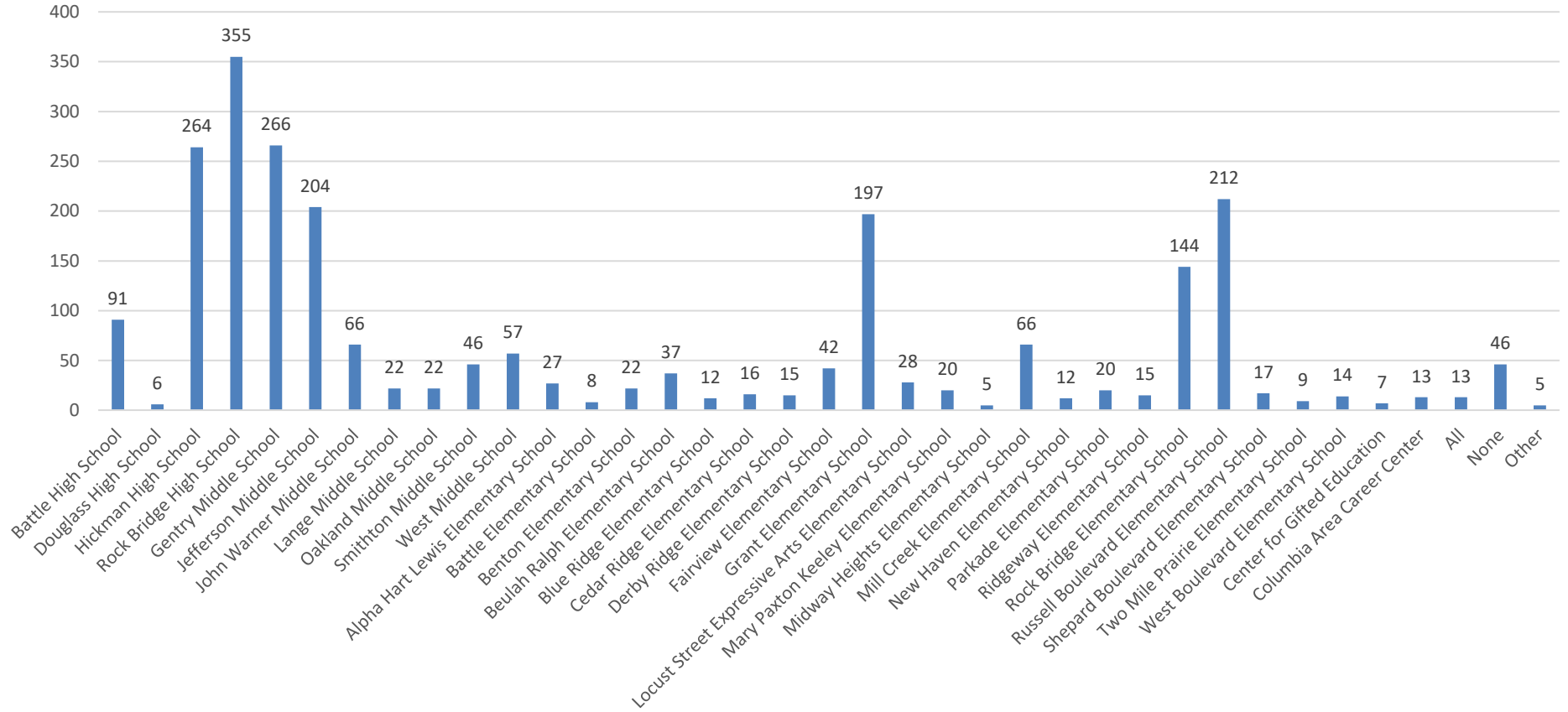

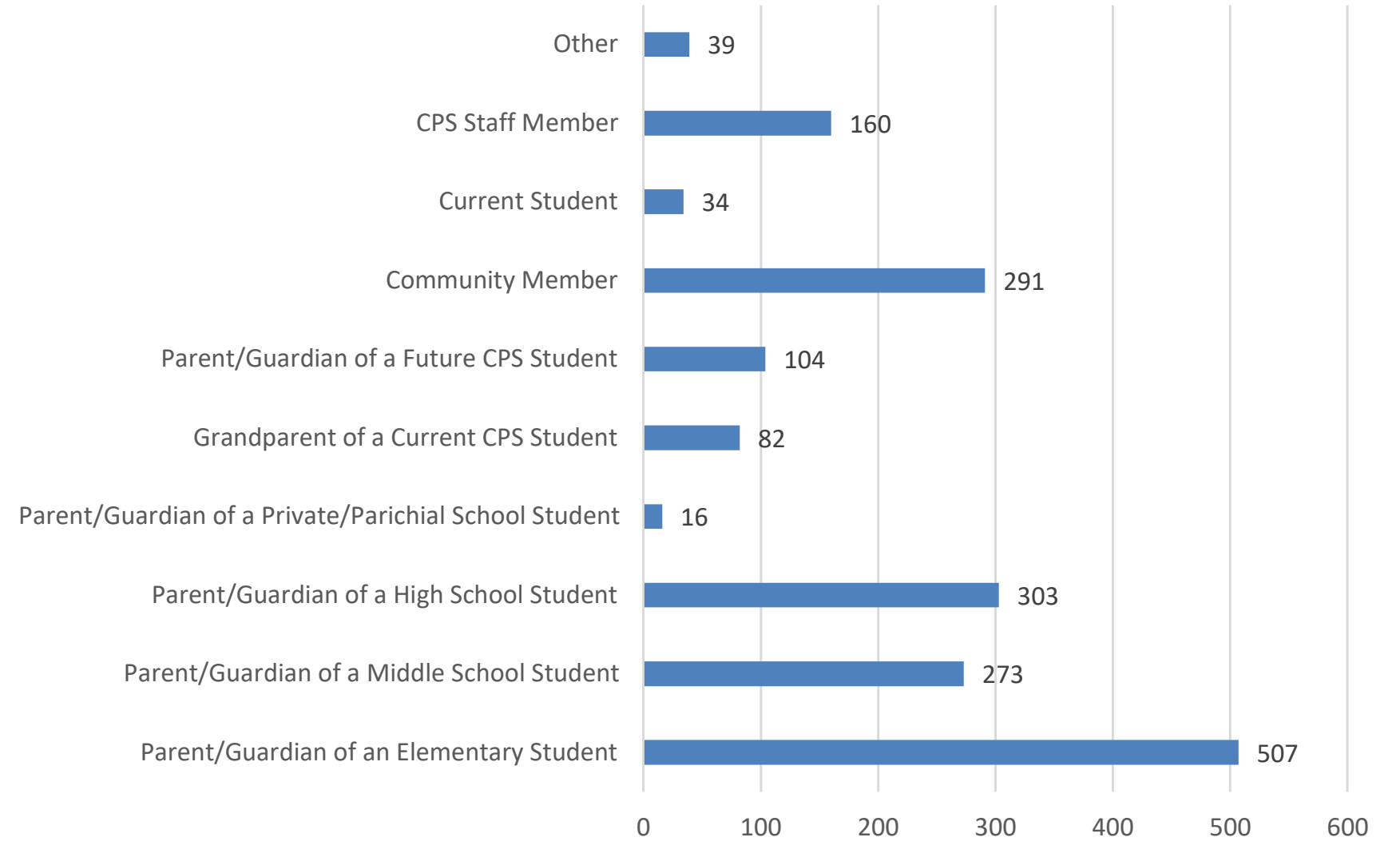

School Affiliation

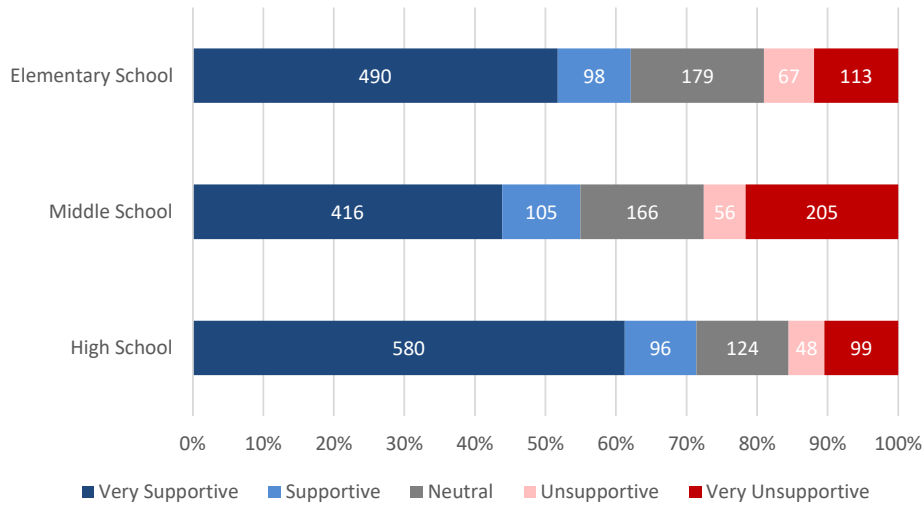


Parent/Guardian/Student Status

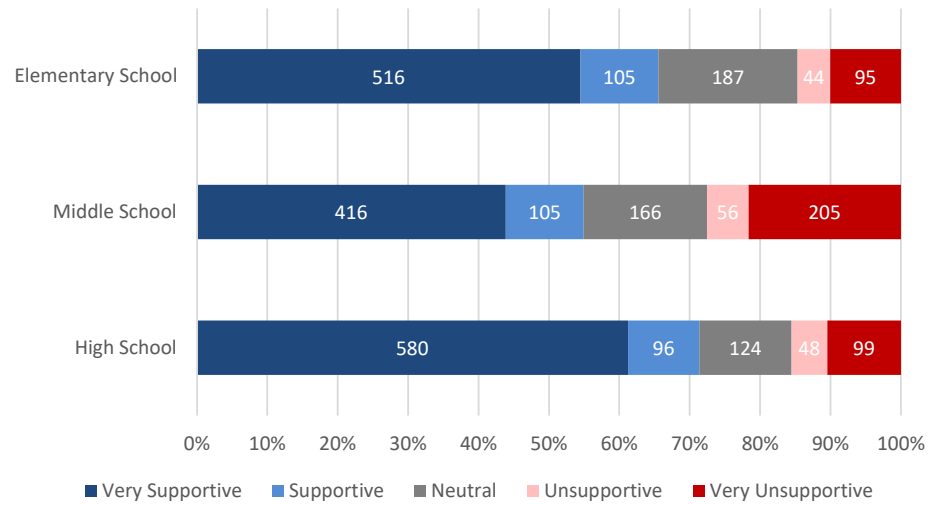

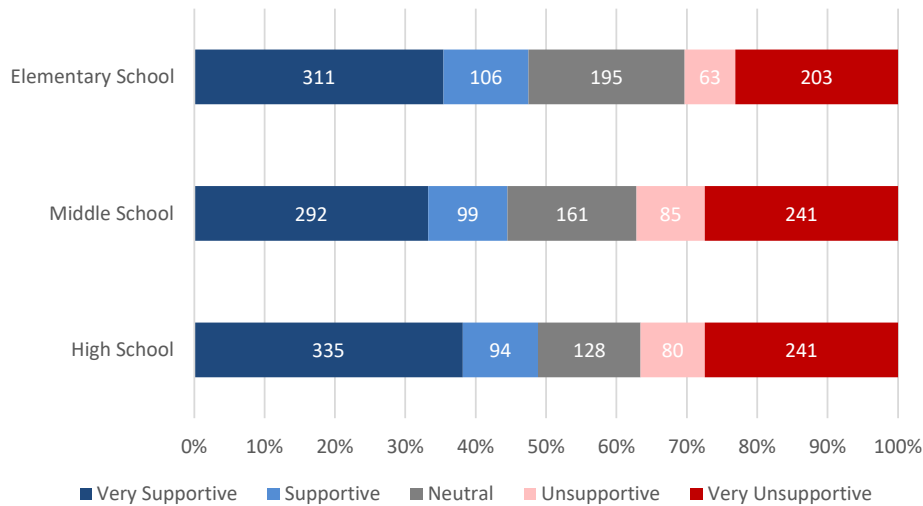
Option A-1 Level of Support



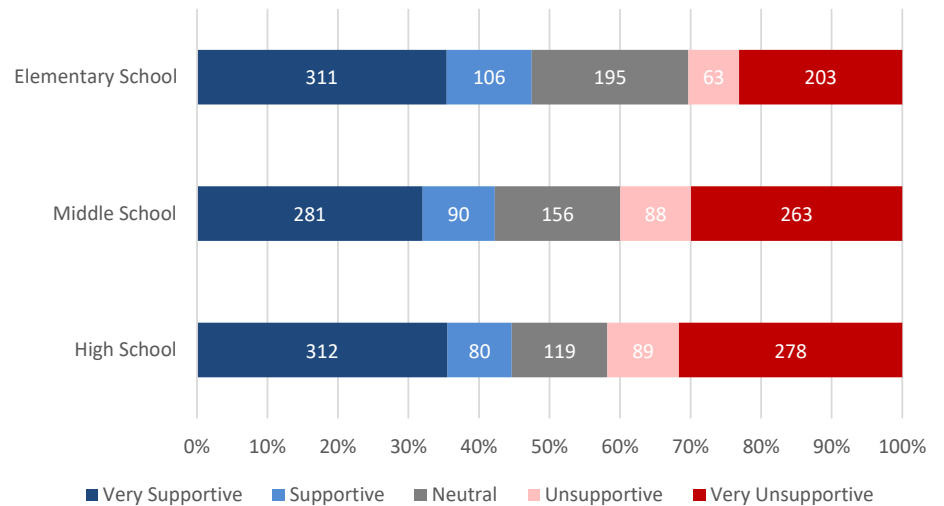
Option A-2 Level of Support

Comment Summary

Option A-1

- Concerns about the effect of redistricting on students' mental health.
- Dislike the variability of low SES and free and reduced lunch at the elementary school level.
- Smaller neighborhoods and neighborhoods with a smaller student population dislike the new feeders.
- Approve that this option has the least number of students moved.

Option A-2

- Individual concerns about students transferring schools in the middle of their time there.
- Approve of high school boundaries remaining the same.
- Concern that another redistricting effort will be needed in the short-term.
- Concerns about the effect of redistricting on students' mental health.

Option B-1

- Concerns about transportation, specifically for high school students.
- Likes the feeder patterns, especially for the middle to high feeders.
- Questions about grandfathering in students to their current schools in 5th, 8th, and 12th grades.
- Specific neighborhood and school concerns.

Option B-2

- Mixed concern on if the overcrowding in schools is solved.
- Individual neighborhood and school concerns.
- Dislike longer commute times to schools.
- Worries about the variability of low SES and free and reduced lunch at the elementary school level.
