New Facilities!

We are entering very exciting times in Falcon Country! Over the last year and a half we have been talking about the possibility of new facilities, paid for with excess revenue from the Rover Pipeline. Results of the 2018 survey showed that when revenue "started to roll" that the community was ready to move forward. The revenue has started to roll! Last April we received the income of approximately \$1.8 million from just one line of the Rover Pipeline Next year we will receive the full amount from both lines and the compressor station. I am anticipating \$5 million plus. At our May board meeting we selected an architectural firm to assist with the process of designing our new facilities. This will be a 12-14 month process and we will seek input from all stakeholders.

The written test and the practicum truly test each student's ability to handle practical situations in the floriculture industry. Second grade students learned about fossils in science class. They made imprint fossils of shells and then painted them to look like rock!


