

## Falcon 5<sup>th</sup> Graders: Camp Nuhop



In 5th grade, we take our students for an Outdoor Education Adventure at Camp Nuhop. Last year was our first experience, and we went for 2 full days and 1 night. It was such a successful experience and so much fun that this year, we are going for 3 full days and 2 nights! We'll be gone May 10-12, 2017. Camp tuition is approximately \$142.50 per student. This covers their meals, lodging, and outdoor instructors, which teach our students all about Geology, Archeology, Shelter Building, Compass Class, Sensory Awareness, Astronomy, etc. All of their activities align with our 5th grade core curriculum in a hands-on way. Also available are "Challenge by Choice" activities like a giant swing, high ropes course, zip line, etc., in which students can choose to participate.

There are a few fundraising projects we do as a class to help lower the cost that each student has to come up with in the end. We have done 2 of these projects so far: the 90-second Buehler's Shopping Spree and the Hillsdale Craft Show. In the spring, we are planning to host Father/Daughter and Mother/Son dances at the High School for grades 2-6. More information coming soon!

HHS has begun a Drug Free Clubs of America (DFCA) program this year, which is sponsored by Tri-County Educational Service Center. The program is designed to encourage students to make healthy life choices instead of succumbing to peer pressure. Each week, Mr. Reidy, coordinator of the program, creates incentives for students who possess a club card. These incentives can be anything from getting to be at the front of the lunch line, to a midday snack, to a perfect parking spot raffle. According to DFCA, "Positive reinforcements celebrate drug free decisions and motivate members to stay on the right track." There is still time to join DFCA before the end of December. In order to join, students need to fill out a form and pay the \$20 fee. The fee covers incentives and drug screens. Drug screen results are not distributed to the school, but if failed, students must return club cards to the association.
