# & Rover Pipeline Appeal

Thank you for your solid support in passing two levies this past November. These levies allow us to protect Rover revenue and continue with the vision of new facilities for our district and this community.

I know there are some concerns with Rover's appeal of the Ohio Department of Taxation's (ODT) valuation of the pipeline. ODT's figures were over double what Rover presented to be evaluated. Rover will pay the undisputed amount until the appeal is settled.

The undisputed amount is still 1 ½ times more than what was conservatively discussed at the community levy meetings. I am very optimistic that the funding will meet the needs of our construction plans.


# Middle School Earns State's Momentum, Overall 'A' Awards

Congratulations to the middle school faculty, staff and students for their efforts in improving educational performance.

The State Board of Education recognized the middle school, one of only two in the tri-county area and 173 statewide, for surpassing expectations in projected student learning. Students in grades 5 through 8 gained more than a year's worth of growth based on state assessment of standards.

Data-driven decision making continues to be a focus for the district. Teachers analyze their practices across the grade levels in order to improve instruction.

In addition, district personnel visit recognized leaders in education to learn best educational practices.
