(♠) Medical Assisting (CARMED0125F)

400 hours \$6,290 (includes textbooks, equipment and certification fee)

Nyack, BERC 9/30 – 5/15 M – Th 5:30 – 9:30pm

(♠) Medical Assisting (CARMED0225F)

400 hours \$6,290 (includes textbooks, equipment and certification fee)

Nyack, BERC 9/30 – 5/15 M – Th 9am – 1pm

This comprehensive program prepares students to become professional medical assistants who are trained and certified in Medical Assisting, Phlebotomy, EKG and Basic Life Support/CPR. Through remote and hands-on instruction, students acquire both the administrative and clinical skills needed to assist medical professionals in doctors' offices, labs and other healthcare facilities. This course includes hands-on classroom practice of drawing blood and other clinical skills. Tuition payment plan available.

Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. HSD or equivalent required. Health form and immunization required. Orientation required.

(♠) Clinical Medical Assisting (CARMEDSK0125F)

288 hours \$4,179 (includes textbooks, equipment and certification fee)

Nyack, BERC 9/30 – 2/27 M – Th 9:30am – 1:30pm

This course teaches students select clinical and administrative components of working in physicians' offices, clinics and other health-related facilities. Topics include HIPAA, electronic health records, medical office procedures, health insurance, scheduling and reception. Clinical coursework includes infection control, vital signs, assisting with the physical exam, lab testing, anatomy, physiology, medical terminology and Basic Life Support/ CPR. Medical billing, ICD/CPT coding, EKG and phlebotomy will be introduced. Students that successfully complete this course may take the National Healthcareer Association's Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA) certification exam. Tuition payment plan available. Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. HSD or equivalent required. Health form and immunization required. Orientation required.

(♠) **Dental Assistant Program** (CARDENT0125F)

60 hours \$1,859 (includes textbooks)

Nyack, BERC 9/9 – 10/30 M & W 9am – 1pm

The 60-hour Dental Assisting program helps to prepare students for entry-level positions in one of the fastest growing healthcare positions. The purpose of this course is to familiarize the student with all areas of pre-clinical dental assisting and provide training in the professional skills required to function as an assistant in the dental practice. Topics include dental anatomy and physiology, oral health and prevention of dental disease, infection control, dental radiology, tooth restorations, dental equipment, assisting in dental care, the dental office and legal aspects of dentistry. In addition to entry-level administrative jobs, this course is ideal for students interested in pursuing a future formal Dental Hygienist program. Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. HSD or equivalent required. Orientation required.

(♠) Medical Coding (CARADMC0225F)

171 hours \$4,035 (includes textbooks, rental of coding manuals, certification test and fees) Nyack, BERC 9/17 - 2/13 T & Th 5:30 - 8:30pm

Saturdays 9am – 1pm

This course is designed by the AAPC to prepare students for a career as a medical coder in hospitals, physicians' offices and other healthcare settings; and to pass the AAPC Certified Professional Coder (CPC) exam. Topics include: terminology, anatomy & physiology and medical coding purposes, principles and guidelines. Includes instruction on ICD-10, CPT and HCPCS coding including determination of the levels of evaluation and management services. High school diploma and a basic understanding of medical terminology and anatomy and physiology is required. Tuition payment plan available. Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. HSD or equivalent required. Orientation required.

(Medical Billing and Coding (CARMBCS25F)

162 hours \$4,750

Nyack, BERC 10/8 - 3/11 T & Th 5 - 9pm

Physicians in the United States depend on medical billers and coders to receive payment for their services. Positions are available in hospitals, medical practices, insurance companies, billing companies, nursing homes, specialty pharmacies and more! This course covers the entire revenue cycle, from patient registration to medical coding, claims submission, reimbursement and collections.

Additional topics include legal, ethical and regulatory compliance, health records, medical terminology, basic structures, functions and common disorders of the human body, diagnostic coding (ICD-10), medical procedure coding (CPT), HCPCS coding, types of health insurance, insurance claims submission and follow up. Students who successfully complete the course will receive a voucher to take the National Healthcareer Association's Certified Billing and Coding Specialist (CBCS) Certification exam. Tuition payment plan available. Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. HSD or equivalent required. Orientation required.

(♠) Medical Office Assistant (CARAMOS0125F)

144 hours \$2,691 (includes textbook and certification testing fee included)

Nyack, BERC 10/15 - 2/27 T & Th 5 - 9pm

This course will prepare students for positions in private practices, billing agencies and health care institutions. Topics include: ICD-10 coding, CPT coding, HCPCS coding, billing, health insurance and the use of the HCFA HCF 1500 form, medical reception, patient communication strategies and HIPAA. Students who successfully complete the course may sit for the National Healthcareer Association's Certified Medical Administrative Assistant (CMAA) exam. Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. HSD or equivalent required. Tuition payment plan available. Orientation required.

(A) Pharmacy Technician (CARPHAR0125F)

135 hours \$2,650 (includes books and certification fee)

lemote 10/7 – 4/21 M & W 10am – 1pm

This course will prepare students for positions in hospitals, nursing homes, retail and manufacturing! Students will be introduced to medical terminology related to pharmacy, dosage calculations, IV admixture preparation basics, dispensing of prescriptions, pharmacy rules and regulations, HIPPA and communication skills. Successful students will be prepared to take the Pharmacy Certification exam given by the National Pharmacy Certification Board (PTCB). HSD or equivalent required. Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. Tuition payment plan available. Orientation required.

(Nurse Assisting (CARCNA0125F)

132 hours \$2,527 (includes textbook and testing fee)

Nyack, BERC 1/7 – 5/13 T & Th 8am – 2pm

(Nurse Assisting (CARCNA0125F)

132 hours \$2,527 (includes textbook and testing fee)

Nyack, BERC 9/23 – 12/16 M, W & Th 5 – 9pm

This NYS-approved program will prepare students to take the New York State Nurse Aide Certification Exam. Students are trained to work as nurse aides in nursing homes, hospitals and other health-related fields. This extensive training includes a 30-hour clinical rotation in a nursing home. Clinical dates may take place on Saturdays. Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. Proof of immunization is required. Tuition payment plan available. Orientation required.

() Phlebotomy Technician with EKG (CARPHLE0125F)

80 hours \$2,778 (includes textbook and testing fee)

Nyack, BERC 9/30 – 1/29 M & W 9am – 12pm

(A) Phlebotomy Technician with EKG (CARPHLE0225F)

80 hours \$2,778 (includes textbook and testing fee)

Nyack, BERC 10/8 – 11/22 T, Th & F 5 – 9pm

Students will learn the practice and skill of drawing blood for phlebotomy positions in laboratories, hospitals and doctors' offices. In addition, students learn to prepare for and perform an electrocardiogram using 12-lead EKG equipment. After practicing on mannequins, students will draw blood from one another under the supervision of their instructor. Ask the admissions counselor about phlebotomy internships available at local healthcare facilities! Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. HSD required. Students who successfully complete the program will be allowed to sit for the National Healthcareer Association - Certified Phlebotomy Technician (CPT) Exam. Tuition payment plan available. Orientation required.

() Patient Care Technician (CARPCT25F)

80 hours \$2,300 (includes textbook and testing fee)

Nyack, BERC 9/3 – 1/29 M & W 6 – 9pm

NEW

Patient Care Technicians work in healthcare settings such as hospitals, clinics, rehabilitation centers, long-term care facilities, physicians' offices and assisted living facilities. These professionals possess the technical skills to perform bedside care, diagnostic tests, collection of laboratory specimens, vital signs, phlebotomy, EKGs, and more. The Patient Care Technician course at Rockland BOCES is designed for the Nursing Assistant/Aide who wants to progress their career, advance their skills and become a more competitive candidate for employment. Successful students may take the National Healthcareer Association - Certified Patient Care Technician (CPCT) national certification exam. Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. HSD required. Tuition payment plan available. Orientation required. Prerequisite: Nurse Aide Certification

(Electrocardiography (EKG) Technician (CAREKGS25F)

30 hours \$789 (includes textbook and testing fee)

Nyack, BERC 10/9 – 11/6 T 9am – 3pm

Students will learn to perform a 12-lead electrocardiogram, troubleshoot technical problems and identify normal and common abnormal cardiac rhythms. Upon successful course completion, students are eligible to take the Certified EKG Technician (CET) Exam offered by the National HealthCareer Association. Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. HSD required. Orientation required.

(♠) Veterinary Assistant Program (CARVET25F)

100 hours \$2,599

Nyack, BERC 9/30 – 12/18 M, W & Sa 6 – 9:30pm

This 100-hour Veterinary Assistant program introduces students to the exciting and growing field of veterinary medicine. Students will learn about the care of animals as well as how to recognize signs of illness and disease. This program also covers interpersonal communication, interaction with clients and their animals and how to assist the veterinarian during examinations. Administrative duties such as fee collection, banking and accounts payable are also emphasized to provide the student with the skills necessary to maintain an efficient front office. Class will also take place on occasional Saturdays. Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. Orientation required.

<u>Clinical Externship</u>: Upon successful completion of this Veterinary Assistant Program, you will be eligible to participate in a 40-hour clinical externship with a local facility. You may be asked to submit to a thorough background check, drug screening and meet other requirements.

(Animal Science (TANSCIPM25F)

437 hours \$8,550 (supplies and textbooks additional)

West Nyack, Bldg. 3 9/5/24 – 6/13/25 M – F 8 – 10:30am or

11:30am - 2:15pm

Animal Science students will acquire basic knowledge and skills necessary for further study or entry-level positions in animal science and related fields. This technical course teaches specialized and advanced skills in areas such as veterinary assisting, care and handling of animals in a laboratory or veterinary setting, dog grooming and kennel/pet shop management. Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. Orientation required.

() NYS CNA Review Class (PCNAREV25F)

Nyack, BERC 12/4 – 12/6 M – W 5 – 9pm 12 hours \$245

For NYS-Certified nurse aides who would like to update their skills or prepare to retake the NYS-Certified Nurse Aide examination. Class size is limited to eight students.

Tuition does not include the fee for the certification exam.

(A) Practical Nursing Entrance Exam Prep (PLPN25F)

Remote 11/5 – 1/30 T & Th 7 – 9:30pm 54 hours \$415

This class is offered to help students obtain the minimum required scores on the Practical Nursing entrance exam and to strengthen their skills to be successful in the program. It covers math, reading, writing, critical thinking and test taking skills. Students are given the opportunity to take a practice test as part of the course. Textbook purchase required. Please call (845) 348-3500 for information.

() Practical Nursing (LPNFT24-25)

This program is a 1,080-hour course in the biological, physical and behavioral sciences with correlated clinical learning experiences. Applicants must have a high school diploma (or equivalency) and either US citizenship or legal INS status. Consideration is given to entrance exam results, interview, education and work history. Federal financial aid and tuition payment plans available to eligible students.

West Nyack, Bldg. 2 9/5/24 – 6/13/25 M – F 8 – 10:30am or 11:30am – 2:15pm Learn the technical skills necessary for new construction, renovation work and cabinetry work from the ground up. Gain hands-on experience in renovating and constructing buildings. Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. Orientation required. Tuition payment plan available.

(♠) Building Trades (CARBLD25F)

110 hours \$2.470

West Nyack, Bldg. 1 11/12 – 3/27 T & Th 3 – 6pm

This project-based, hands-on class will teach students basic building maintenance and construction including carpentry, electrical and plumbing skills, blueprint reading, tile work, finish work and and hand tools. Successful students will receive OSHA certification. Real world projects will take place in BOCES' shops. A passing score on a reading assessment is required. Orientation required. Tuition payment plan available.

() Home Maintenance For All (VHOM25F)

West Nyack, Bldg. 2 10/9 - 12/117 – 9:30pm 25 hours \$310

This class will cover basic tools the homeowner should have as well as replacing switches and receptacles, dry wall repair, painting, basic plumbing and toilet repair, tiling, home safety and other topics relative to home repair and maintenance. Students can choose whether they would like to participate in the skills hands-on or to observe. Many topics of interest will be discussed, so even if a repair is not done by the homeowner, they will be familiar with the topic in order to discuss it with a contractor.

(♦) Electrical Trades (TELECAM25F)

437 hours \$8,550 (supplies additional)

West Nyack, Bldg. 2 9/5/24 - 6/13/25 M - F8 – 10:30am or 11:30am – 2:15pm Learn residential and commercial electricity, communication and data wiring. Work with wire switches, lights, receptacles and appliances. Passing score on Reading Comprehension assessment required. Orientation required. Tuition payment plan available.

(♠) Basic Electrical Construction (CARELEC25F)

\$3,637 (supplies included)

West Nyack, Bldg. 2 10/7 – 1/23 M, T & Th 5 – 8:30pm

Gain the knowledge and skills required for an entry-level position in the electrical field! Topics include: tool recognition and proper use, safety, introduction to the National Electric Code, basic electrical theory, basic blue print reading, hands-on activities including circuitry, pipe-bending, installation of electrical devices and controls and proper wiring technique. Successful students will receive OSHA certification. HSD or equivalent required. A passing score on a reading assessment is required. Orientation required. Tuition payment plan available.

(Basic Electrical House Wiring (VELEC25F)

West Nyack, Bldg. 2 9/16 – 10/1 M, T & Th 5 - 8:30pm 28 hours \$450

This popular course prepares the student for the basics of residential wiring: installation techniques, tools, electrical boxes, cables, switches and receptacles. Use actual materials and tools to set up and test typical circuits and apply theory and provisions of the National Electrical Code. Class size is limited. **NEW**

() Creating Storage Solutions (VSTOR25F) West Nyack, Bldg. 3 М

\$425 10/21 – 1/13 6 - 9pm 30 hours

Have you ever thought about turning your ability to be uber organized into a career? In this class you'll learn how to level up your skills through designing, building and installing aesthetically pleasing storage solutions, with an emphasis on commercial settings. Topics also include sketching, measuring, use of tools and basic carpentry.

() Construction Management (VCONSTRUCT25F)

72 hours \$1,120

9/30/24 - 5/5/24 West Nyack, Bldg. 1 6:30 - 9:30pm M Construction managers plan, coordinate, budget, and supervise construction projects from start to finish. According to the bureau of labor statistics, employment of project management specialists is projected to grow six percent from 2022 to 2032, faster than the average for all occupations. Students interested in taking this class should have a high school diploma, experience in the construction field, and an interest in learning

how construction projects come together, from initial cost estimates until the build is complete and beyond. OSHA certification included.

() Residential and Commercial Electrical Training - 80 hours (VELECWIR25F) This course is offered in collaboration with employers and labor unions to prepare students for either employment or electrical apprenticeships. Learn about the residential and commercial wiring used in today's construction. You will also learn the route to become a licensed electrician through an apprenticeship. () Plumbing (CARPLUM25F)

110 hours \$2.470

West Nyack, Bldg. 2 10/21 - 3/25 M&T 3 - 6pm



Learn to install, repair and maintain residential and commercial plumbing systems! This basic course is suitable for individuals interested in pursuing a career in plumbing, homeowners wishing to handle basic plumbing problems, and for those in related fields such as maintenance and construction. Gain a clear understanding of the components, fixtures and piping systems that make up a plumbing system. Students will learn safety procedures and will familiarize themselves with the tools, equipment and materials used in installation and repairs. They will learn about pipe materials, fittings, and joints, and how to connect them. Water supply systems and distribution and pressure within the plumbing systems will be covered as well as fixture installation including hot water heaters. Learn to troubleshoot common problems like leaks and clogs, and to perform basic repairs. Students will receive OSHA certification. A passing score on a reading assessment is required. Orientation required. Tuition payment plan available.

() Basic House Plumbing and Heating (VPLUM25F)

West Nyack, Bldg. 2 10/15 – 12/3 T 7 – 9:30pm 24 hours \$325

This hands-on course provides an overview of plumbing and heating systems in homes and then teaches students how to diagnose and repair common plumbing and heating problems.

() Introduction to Welding (VINTRWELD25F)

West Nyack, Bldg. 2 10/7 – 12/16 M 6 – 9pm 27 hours \$475

Learn to weld! There are a variety of welding processes for fusing together metal. From flux-cored welding, to GMAW/MIG welding, to GTAW/TIG welding, to SMAW welding, to Oxy-Acetylene Welding, each welding process serves a specific purpose depending on the environment and types of materials being welded. This class will introduce students each of the different welding processes, focusing primarily on Oxy-Acetylene Welding. Students should bring a welding mask and gloves. The instructor will review these supplies on the first day of class.

() MIG Welding (VMIGWELD25F)

West Nyack, Bldg. 2 10/16 - 12/11 W 6 - 9pm 27 hours \$475 Metal Inert Gas (MIG) welding refers to a process of using a consumable wire electrode to heat and melt metals. Part I: MLR (Maintenance and Light Repair): This first part of the course is designed to prepare students for entry-level positions at local dealerships and independent auto repair shops. Course will include the following: shop safety; using lifts and shop equipment; inspection; lubrication service; brake, exhaust, suspension and steering; electrical and cooling systems; and tune-ups. Students, once approved, will also have access to manufacturer training with Ford (the Ford ACE program). 


