Academic Year

The cosmetology program is nine months in length. Classes are regularly scheduled Monday-Friday, 8:00 AM to 2:45 PM. Students enter the program in early September and graduation takes place during mid-June.

The one-year certificate program is accredited by the <u>Board of Registration of Cosmetology</u> <u>and Barbering</u> and follows the guidelines outlined by them. After meeting the hour and course requirements, the student will receive a Certificate of Cosmetology and is eligible to take the Massachusetts Cosmetology Examination for licensure. After passing the written exam and the written practical exam, a license to practice hairdressing for compensation is issued. This license requires the cosmetologist to work under the supervision of a hairdresser or aesthetician for two years. This examination is not a graduation requirement.
