Academic Year

The dental assisting program is nine months in length. Classes are regularly scheduled Monday-Friday, 8:00 AM to 2:45 PM. Clinical externship components are scheduled with consideration for optimal learning experiences, therefore, hours will vary. Students enter the program in early September and graduation takes place during mid-June.


Financial Aid
