FacilitiesUpdate

We are very fortunate in the Orting School District (OSD) to have an amazing facilities team. Our custodial, maintenance and grounds staff are truly exceptional. They will be busy all summer long making repairs, doing deep cleaning and preventative maintenance work to be ready for learning in the fall.

In addition to their regular duties, we have several projects in the works to help mitigate the impact from growth and crowded facilities. To help address parking woes, the team will add a gravel parking lot on the vacant land adjacent to Orting High School (OHS). This will help alleviate some congestion across the OHS and Orting Elementary School (OES) shared campus. We will continue our cost cutting efforts by installing a new energy efficient boiler at Ptarmigan Ridge Elementary School (PTR) to replace the failed unit. We will also install energy efficient lighting at OHS. We are thankful for the grant money received from Puget Sound Energy to help support this work. We will be excited to see the savings over years to come.

Three of OSD's Four Schools Continue to Face Overcapacity Issues

At PTR, we will install four additional portable classrooms to accommodate the growing number of students. Our Developmental Preschool and ECEAP learners will call PTR home next year. This will allow us to demolish the ailing building behind OES next winter and add six portable classrooms for use by OES and OHS. Currently, both schools are out of space to grow. This is the last spot we can add portables before we must move to the main parking lot to add learning space.

Three of our four schools are significantly over their designed capacities. From 2020 through 2033, we are expecting 6,139 new homes within the 44 square miles of our district. Where we sit in 2024, about 5,500 homes are left to be built. In our planning, we will continue to look at adding temporary facilities, but this will only serve as a short-term band aid solution. Our Board of Directors remains committed to passing a school bond to remedy overcrowding, improve safety, health and security as well as prepare students for careers of their choosing. They will officially decide in July whether or not to place a school bond on the ballot in November 2024.

As stewards of public funds and assets, we hope you see the care that goes into maintaining our facilities as well as the stewardship in forward planning. Our Facilities Department works hard to ensure our buildings are running smoothly. Facilities Director Curtis Nybo has saved the district approximately \$228,659 by replacing LED light bulbs in our schools and offices. In addition, Facilities will replace the boiler at Ptarmigan Ridge Elementary that will have a 96 percent efficiency, and save the district \$48,856 with a Conservation Grant from Puget Sound Energy. All the labor done to complete these jobs was done by our Facilities Department. Thank you, Facilities, for all your hard work!

In May, Orting School District hosted their first district-wide **Cultural Unity Fair.** The fair highlighted our students' and staff cultures across our district that represented cultural performances, art, and food. The event kicked off with a Land Acknowledgment performed by an Orting parent and Puyallup Tribal member, Ty Satiacum, in tx^wəlšucid (Twulshootseed), while his son, an Orting High School student, translated into English. In the traditional Puyallup way, we raise our hands to the Puyallup Tribe and the Satiacum family as a thank you for supporting this event!

Community members can make an impact inside the classroom. This school year, Orting Elementary School (OES) implemented a Watch D.O.G.S (Dads of Great Students) program. "I love the Watch D.O.G.S program!" Ms. Green, first grade teacher at OES, said. The program helps engage students using fathers and father figures. Well done, Cougars!
