Guidance Curriculum

The goal of the guidance curriculum is to help students develop their full educational potential, including the student's interests and career objectives. The curriculum is based on District Core Values, The Leader in Me, Naviance, District Digital Citizenship, etc. Students receive most of these lessons during their Cardinal Leadership Time on Mondays and Wednesdays.

Responsive Services

Counselors intervene on behalf of any student whose immediate personal concerns or problems put the student's continued educational, personal, or social development at risk. Responsive services can occur any time a student has an immediate concern.

Individual Planning

Counselors will guide a student as he/she plans, monitors, and manages their own educational, personal, career, and social development.

System Support

Counselors will support the efforts of teachers, staff, parents, and other members of the community in promoting the educational, career, personal, and social development of students.

Naviance

Learning more about Self, Career, Military and College is the purpose of Naviance. In grades 6th-8th grade, students will set goals, complete self-discovery assessments and inventories, and learn more about planning for success after high school.
