Important Kindergarten information:

Way to go!!! We have made it through the first week! Give yourself a pat on the back.

As we continue to work on routines in class please take a moment to read over some of these important things:

- ⇒ All Kindergarteners have a morning snack time... please send a healthy snack to school. It would be very helpful if you can have the snack separate from their lunches.
- ⇒ At all dismissals if you are at the drive through line, please remember to stay in the car. We will bring your child to you. If you want to pick up your child at the gate you must park on the North side of the street. This will really help cut down on traffic. Thank you!
- ⇒ Please make sure your child goes to the bathroom before school or during their morning recess. Please discuss appropriate bathroom behavior.
- ⇒ **Safety with our school supplies and playground equipment. Scissors are for cutting paper only and should NEVER be in their mouth. Students should not be running on the playground or the concrete.**
- ⇒ The classrooms can be cold at times, so please have your child bring a uniform appropriate sweater or light jacket to put on during these times. *No logos or designs. Colors need to be red, white, or blue.
- ⇒ Please remember to bring in the rest of your school supplies. Including headphones/earbuds. These will be used during their computer class on their specials day.

9. Tell me the name of 3 kids you sat near or played with today?
10. What are you looking forward to at school tomorrow?
