The 5th-grade reading program is designed to provide students with a diverse exposure to various literary genres and informational texts through the reading of novels and selections from the textbook Wonders. Through the careful selection of novels and short stories, students will engage in rigorous exploration aligned with the language arts standards established by the state of Louisiana. Emphasizing the development of critical reading skills, comprehension strategies, and vocabulary enrichment, this course aims to cultivate a deep appreciation for literature while preparing students for academic success. The Accelerated Reader program will be used to promote independent reading, allowing the students to select books or articles of their choice.
