COLLEGE CREDIT/AP TRACK RECOMMENDATIONS

AP CREDIT COURSES

AP classes can be as challenging as introductory college courses and can show admissions officers that you're ready for college-level work. Admissions counselors consistently tell us that good grades and academic rigor are the most important factors when schools evaluate applications.¹

AP classes offer the opportunity for students to take the AP exams which have an associated cost. If you need assistance to waive the exam fees, please speak with your grade-level administrator.

AP SCHOLAR & BEYOND²

AP SCHOLAR
Granted to students who receive scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams.

AP SCHOLAR WITH HONORS
Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.

AP SCHOLAR WITH DISTINCTION
Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.

COLLEGE IN THE HIGH SCHOOL

College in the High School courses offer students the opportunity to earn college credit without testing. In some cases, the earned college credits will need to be purchased through the university with the established agreement. Students must complete the college requirements to earn the college credit, determined by their high school teacher.

These college credits are provided with the college we have an established agreement to provide college in the high school. Credits are transferable to Washington State universities & community colleges, as well as to most other universities.

ARTICULATED CREDITS

Many Elective/CTE courses provided at CHS also include articulated college credits with Spokane Falls Community College or Spokane Community College. These courses offer free college credit when the student has met the requirements to earn college credit, determined by their high school teacher.
