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Course Description

A strong English Language Arts course covers five major strands: Reading, Writing, Speaking & Listening, Language, and Media & Technology. Each strand presents its own clear and consistent framework. Taken together, the five strands represent an integrated model of literacy for the twenty-first century.

6th grade Advanced English focuses students on using precise language, appropriate vocabulary and style, and effective transitions for their purpose and audience to

- -produce arguments that support claims with strong reasons and relevant evidence to persuade a target audience;
- -write informative/explanatory passages that introduce and convey ideas in an organized manner to develop a topic using germane facts, concrete details, and examples;
- -compose narratives about real or imagined experiences using key narrative techniques to develop events and engage readers.
- 6th grade Advanced English develops grammar skills by helping students
 - -demonstrate command of standard English grammar and usage;
 - -exhibit command of standard English capitalization, punctuation, and spelling;
 - -apply knowledge of language to use precise language when expressing ideas and to eliminate wordiness and redundancy.

The Advanced English students will complete one additional project-based assessments each quarter that will be a test grade. In addition, 10% of the questions on all Advanced English assessments will be more rigorous.
