At Orientation, your family will accomplish the following:

- Parents/Guardians will complete any school forms requiring parent signatures.
- Return overdue textbooks or library books and exchange damaged Chromebooks.
- Students will have their school picture taken and receive their student ID card. Students should be dressed appropriately for school portraits.
- Apply for a parking pass to park in the student parking lot during the school year.
- Pay for locks, goggles, parking pass, student planners, and any outstanding fees.
- Complete/check status of food services applications and sharing form for potential waiver of some school fees.
- Purchase cap and gown package for Senior students.
- Pickup or purchase (\$65) 2023-24 yearbooks.

Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner at No Cost for West Students

West High School is again participating in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) Program for the 2024–25 school year. This means that all students will be provided breakfast, lunch and dinner at no cost. Although West is a CEP school, it is critical that you fill out the Free & Reduced Price School Meals application. ALL families are encouraged to fill out and return the application. Those who qualify may be eligible to have school fees and some testing fees waived and receive community benefits such as reduced Internet, phone service and medical expenses.




Annual Information Update

Each family should review, update and maintain your student's demographic information. Parents/Guardians can update their student's information online through the Infinite Campus Parent Portal. Parents/Guardians are asked to complete this online process prior to attending Registration.

When you log on to Parent Portal there will be three lines at the top left corner, right above the Message Center. Click on that for a dropdown menu. At the bottom of the menu select "More." Next, select the option "Update Contact Information." Select the first option on the left side of your screen for "Current Student Registration" to complete the Annual Registration. Parking Procedures

- The west-side parking lot will be closed to families during drop-off and pick-up times between 7:00 7:45 am and 2:45-3:15 pm.
- Families may use the inlets on Shawano Avenue in front of the building, for drop-off and pick-up.
- Families may also drop-off/pick-up using the east-side parking lot, entering at the stoplights at Shawano Avenue and 12th Street. Upon leaving, families may only exit the east-side lot using the exit onto Allard Avenue.
- Students with parking passes should enter the east-side parking lot at the stoplights on Shawano Avenue, and exit the lot using the exit onto Allard Avenue. Students should only park in the white-lined stalls within the east-side parking lot. Parking passes are available for purchase in the Main Office, with an approved application.
- Staff may enter the west-side parking lot using the Reed Street entrance.
- Please note that the west-side parking lot will be available to only staff during drop-off/pick-up times.

Required for all student athletes

Planning to play sports at West? Students and their parents must register for sports online at https://gbwhs-ar.rschooltoday.com. This is where you will upload your physical form, complete the activities eligibility form and complete the HIPAA form. If you have trouble registering, contact Mr. LaPlant at right:ri

Make sure to have a valid WIAA physical exam form on file with the school. If you haven't had a physical since April 1, 2022, you will need to see your doctor or go to a walk-in clinic with the school's physical form. Bellin Health Fastcare is open at the Meijer store for walk-in patients.



The cost is \$20, but if you receive free or reduced lunch you can have the fee waived. Pick up a physical exam waiver from the Main Office before going to your exam.

Enter the personal Activation Key sent to you by the District. If you do not have an activation key, contact Help Desk at 920-448-2148.




5) Log In

If you have more than one child in the district, you can select the child you wish to review information for on the right.



7) Explore

Once you select the student whose information you would like to view, click on the 3 bars. This will bring up a drop down menu to review grades, attendance, assignments, etc.





Parent Portal Mobile App

You can access Infinite Campus Parent Portal from your mobile device! Visit your Play Store or App Store and search for the Infinite Campus Mobile Portal app. Once the app is downloaded, you will need to select your state (Wisconsin), then search for "Green" and select "Green Bay Area." Before you can set up your mobile app, you will need to set up your account on a computer. Receive instant notifications of your child's grade and attendance!

TARDY, ID BADGES & ELECTRONICS (TIE) POLICY

TARDY

Students are considered on time if they are in the classroom when the bell rings.
They are tardy if they are in the hallway after the start of class without a pass.

- Teacher marks student tardy
- Teacher has a conversation with the student privately
- Each Friday, data is ran for total tardies for that week
- Students with 4 or more tardies in a week will be assigned a lunch detention
- Communication will be sent home weekly through a text message to families of students with 4 or more tardies
- Excessive tardies may result in additional consequences



Students must have their ID with them at all times. The ID must be for the current school year. Students may not use their Infinite Campus as a replacement for IDs.

Students must show their ID whenever they enter the building.

- Students without an ID will fill out a form at the circle desk and receive a wristband to wear for the day
- Our Student Learning Advocate will meet with students with a pattern of not having their ID over a period of 3-4 weeks
- Student Learning Advocate and the student will work to find a solution
- Parent/Guardian will be notified

ELECTRONICS

PHONE, COMPUTER, EARBUDS, ETC.

Electronics are not to be used in classrooms unless students are given permission to use them for instructional use.

Cellphones are not allowed in bathrooms or locker rooms.

- Teachers will share the policy with students
- Teachers may give up to 2 reminders during the the class period to store electronics in a safe space
- If student refuses or receives more than 2 reminders, the teacher will call for a monitor to come meet briefly with the student
- If the behavior continues, student will be removed from class
- An Associate Principal will meet with student, determines consequence and call home
