Please note: by definition of the Oregon State Board of Nursing, a UAP “is a person whose position description or job within an organization or client healthcare team does not require licensure or certification by a state of Oregon health related licensing agency. The UAP includes, but is not limited to, the person working in the following positions: medical assistant, certified medical assistant, registered medical assistant, home care worker, emergency department technician, labor and delivery technician, direct care staff, traditional health worker, volunteer. Status as a UAP includes those who have a state of Oregon issued health-related licensure or certification but who holds a position where their license or certificate is not a requirement. A licensee or certificate holder working as a UAP must not count the hours worked towards licensure or certificate renewal.”
