

10th Grade College/Career Planning

This is an important year for you. Colleges typically look at the grades you earn in 10th and 11th grade for admission consideration, and will only conditionally admit you until they receive your final grades earned in 12th grade. This means you should be working to earn good grades while in high school so you have a lot of options when you apply to college or career training programs. Some colleges also consider grades earned in 9th grade, but all A-G courses count towards admission!

Use these guidelines to help you navigate your sophomore year:

- ✓ **Take challenging courses and do well in them.** Grades count, and will help your college application! Typically, colleges only accept grades of “C” and higher.
- ✓ **Get help when you need it!** There are many resources available to help you be successful in your classes. Be an advocate for yourself by reaching out for help.
- ✓ **Explore CaliforniaColleges.edu:** This is the year to start looking at different careers and the training needed for them, as well as learning about the college process. We will help you register your account this fall!
- ✓ **Visit College & Career Center webpage** to check out the resources available to you!
- ✓ **Attend 9/10 Grade College/Career Family Night on November 21 at 6:30 pm** to learn more about what you can do to be college/career ready.
- ✓ **Check in** with Mrs. Bergum and/or your counselor each semester so we can help you think about your options after high school.
- ✓ **Talk with your family** about college/career training program plans so there is a clear idea of what your family can afford. Having this discussion early will help you with your post-secondary planning.
- ✓ **Join a club or activity** on campus or in the community that you are interested in. It will enrich your high school experience, helping you to meet new friends and will also help you explore your interests! Think long term with your activities, perhaps taking on leadership roles in clubs or groups. Look for club rush in the fall, organized by leadership class!

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What are A-G's and why are they so important?

Doing well in your classes gives you an advantage when it's time to apply to college in your senior year. The more A's and B's that you earn, the more options you will have in considering colleges to apply to. Doing well in your classes also prepares you for any career training after high school. It's not just a grade that you earn, it's your understanding of the subject you are taking that will help you in the next level class! Check out the A-G requirements to be college and career ready:

| G | Elective 1 year required | *Economics - semester course, AP Econ (grade 12) AVID, Intro Film, Intro Engineering, ASB Leadership, Link Crew, Psychology, AP Psychology, Transportation Technology, Woodworking Technology, Yearbook, Honors Yearbook, Creative Writing, Public Speaking, or any other g course that exceeds the requirements. |

*One semester of Economics and one semester of Government are required for grade 12. District Graduation requirements include 2 years of physical education, starting with 9th grade PE.
