#### Welcome Back!

We are looking forward to partnering with families to seek academic success for all of our students. We ask that you keep open communications with your son or daughter's teachers, as they will always have the most up-to-date information regarding grades and your child's progress. Counselors are also always more than happy to assist you.

#### Are you on track for graduation?

Students generally have the following number of credits at the beginning of the school year to be on track for graduation:

- 10<sup>th</sup> Grade 8 credits
- 11<sup>th</sup> Grade 13 credits
- 12th Grade 18 credits

Students who fail classes generally continue taking the next grade-specific courses concurrently while retaking a failed class or pursue alternative options for retrieving credit at a later date. Counselors can guide students through the various options for retrieving credit.

What about the graduation year or "Class of"? 9th Graders this year will be Class of 2028. The "Class of" will remain the same for the duration of a student's high school career.

#### Seniors (Class of 2025):

- ALL seniors will take the SAT for free at Federal Way High School in mid-October. Students who wish to retest or take the ACT in addition, can sign up to do so at the following websites: the SAT at <u>www.collegeboard.com</u> or for the ACT at <u>www.act.org</u>.
- FAFSA applications open October 1<sup>st</sup> and begin providing funds in January. The earlier you apply the better! See the Career Center for help.
- Begin your college applications and essays now. Application deadlines can be as early as Dec. 1st.
- Check in at the Career Center to find out which colleges or military representatives will be visiting FWHS. You can sign up to meet with them.
- Check in the Career Center for available scholarships and scholarship applications.
- Start your High School and Beyond Plan early. They are due March 24<sup>th</sup> and are a graduation requirement for ALL seniors.
- Seniors who do not meet **ALL** graduation requirements will not be allowed to walk at graduation. Be aware of graduation requirements and be sure you meet them.

#### Juniors (Class of 2026):

- Considering a Military Academy? Now is the time to see the College and Career Specialist in the Career Center to begin this long application process.
- If you failed any classes last year and did not attend ELO, you should consider your options for making up the lost credit. Your counselor is an excellent resource to use for exploring your options.
- You will take the PSAT in the Fall and will take the SAT in the spring at no cost at FWHS.

• Parents, please log into Parent Vue right away to stay on top of your student's progress.

#### Sophomores (Class of 2027):

- You will take the PSAT for the first time in the Fall. Consider this an opportunity to take the test to see the contents and get an idea of where you may need improvement for taking it as a junior next year. Doing well may also qualify you for a number high-value scholarships.
- If you failed any classes last year and did not attend ELO, you should consider your options for making up the lost credit. Your counselor is an excellent resource to use for exploring your options.
- Parents, please log into Parent Vue right away to stay on top of your student's progress.

#### Freshmen (Class of 2028):

- Grades count <u>now</u> towards your future. Remember all of your semester grades will be on your permanent high school transcript that you will send to colleges, vocational schools, and possibly future employers.
- Some freshmen struggle academically in the beginning. We ask that parents partner with us to support students in organization, monitoring their grades weekly, communicating with teachers, and talking with your student about their progress. Please log into Parent Vue right away to stay on top of your student's progress.
- You will take the PSAT 8/9 test this fall. This is an introduction to the College Board PSAT and SAT exams that you may take in grades 10-12. Consider this an opportunity to take the test to see the contents and get an idea of where you may need improvement for taking it as a junior.

On a **Wednesday in October** we will have many activities occurring. The activities include:

PSAT 8/9 - All 9<sup>th</sup> graders take the PSAT 8/9 for free PSAT - All 10th & 11th graders take the PSAT for free SAT - All 12th graders will take the SAT for free

This is a unique opportunity for students to take these assessments at no cost, the usual cost to take the SAT is \$55. The SAT is a college entrance requirement for some universities. Our district has received special permission to administer the SAT on a day other than the typical Saturday administrations. This is an opportunity that students will not want to miss.

#### **Student-Initiated Schedule Changes**

The course choices made by students during registration for 2024-2025 classes this previous spring are considered to be final. We plan our courses and staffing for the upcoming school year based on those choices. Schedule change requests from students will be allowed within the first five days of the beginning of the school year for the following reasons only:

- A senior needs a specific class for graduation
- A student's schedule is incomplete
- A student is in a class for which she/he has not met the prerequisite



- A student is placed in a course not requested and an alternate class can accommodate an additional student
- A teacher recommends the student move to a different level within the same discipline

Once the semester has started, students must remain in their scheduled classes. Schedule change requests based on teacher choice, teacher style or lunch assignments will NOT be considered.

A student may get a schedule change request form at Eagle Days, during Advisory or outside the Counseling Office and turn it into the Counseling Office during lunch. Students will be given a new schedule IF a schedule change has occurred. Students must attend their original classes until the schedule change process is complete. Not attending a class does not constitute a "dropped" class. Students must follow the proper procedures outlined by the Counseling Office for schedule changes.

### STATE MANDATED TESTING

#### <u>Smarter Balanced Assessments and End of</u> <u>Course Assessments</u>

As of the 2014-2015 school year, the state testing changed from the HSPE to Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA). Math and English Language Arts (ELA) will be assessed using the Smarter Balance Assessment in the Spring. Meeting standard on an 10<sup>th</sup> grade Smarter Balanced Assessment in ELA and Math is a state requirement. The class of 2025 must pass the SBA Math and ELA tests or equivalent tests such as AP, Cambridge, Dual-Credit or SAT/ACT. See your counselor with questions.

#### STUDENT ATTENDANCE INFORMATION

Regular school attendance is necessary for students at FWHS to be successful with their educational program.

Attendance matters! Some facts about how important attendance is:

- 1. Students who miss less than 2 days of school in September tend to continue this trend and generally miss less than 10 school days per year.
- 2. Chronic absenteeism is the leading indicator of a student's likelihood to drop out of high school.
- 3. Research shows that missing only 10% of school, or about 18 days total in a school year (that averages out to only 2 days per month) negatively impacts a student's academic performance.
- 4. When students improve their attendance rates, they improve their academic prospects and increase their likelihood of graduating.



#### What to do when your student is absent?

- Contact FWHS via telephone, email or fax regarding your student's absence.
  Phone: 253-945-5419 (hotline: leave message 24/7 with your name, your student's name & ID number, date of absence and reason for absence)
  Fax: 253-945-5454 (must include parent/guardian signature)
  Email: <u>FWHSattendance@fwps.org</u>
- All absences will result in an automated phone call regardless of whether or not the parent/guardian has called or if the absence is excused. If your phone number changes or you would like the auto dialer to call a different number than the one listed on your student's emergency card, please contact the counseling secretary at 253-945-5408.
- If no contact has been made within 48 hours of the student's absence, your student's record will indicate truancy/unexcused absence.
- Seven unexcused absences in a calendar month or ten in a school year require that the school file a BECCA petition with the King County Juvenile Courts. We suggest that absences for three (3) or more days be "pre-arranged" through the Attendance Office.

# What to do when your student needs to leave school during class time?

- Students <u>are not</u> allowed to leave campus without an Off Campus pass from the Attendance Office. They will be considered truant if they do so. Send your student to the Attendance Office before school with a note or call ahead to (253) 945-5419 excusing your student for their appointment. Your student will be given an Off Campus pass and will be able to meet you at the designated time and place.
- Students must check back in with the Attendance Office when returning to class in order for the computer to track which periods he or she has missed.

**WASHINGTON STATE LAW REQUIRES:** All youths are required to attend school, or another approved educational program, until they are 18 years of age, have a diploma or a GED certificate. Parents can file a Becca Petition, an At Risk Youth Petition or a Child in Need of Services Petition under this law. To find out more about

#### **FWHS** – A Safe and Supportive School By: Isaac May, Assistant Principal

We at Federal Way High School pride ourselves in our efforts toward providing a safe and supportive learning environment for all students. We utilize schoolwide PBIS program REP (Respectful, Engaged, Positive) FED to identify and reinforce consistent student behaviors at Federal Way High School. We teach and revisit these expectations through Advisory classes and rely upon the support of everyone to achieve these lofty goals.

In efforts of utilizing your support for a Safe and Supportive School, we wish to review the following:

- The importance of regular school attendance. Students with unexcused absences make it challenging to enhance their school performance. Remember, FWHS is a closed campus and all students should clear absences through the attendance office (attendance procedures found in the student planner).
- We also ask for your support in encouraging that all electronic devices, such as phones and music players, are kept absent from the learning environment. Per district policy, these devices have the direct capacity to disrupt the learning environment, academics, and may violate the



privacy acts of others. Each teacher has expectations for the use of these if needed for an academic reason.

• Finally, we encourage you to monitor your student's attendance and grades regularly, either online, contacting the school or your student's teacher.

#### Please read before back to school shopping!

#### ATTIRE AND GROOMING STANDARDS

Students in the Federal Way Public Schools are expected to dress in a manner that reflects pride and respect for themselves and their school. On a daily basis, it is generally expected that student dress shall be clean and appropriate for the activity in which the student is engaged. If a student or parent deems it necessary to challenge the current grooming standards, the final determination will be made by a collaborative discussion with an administrator. Ultimately, decisions will be made by honoring district and building policies and procedures. The following is prohibited:

- 1. No clothing presenting a reasonable expectation of a material and substantial disruption of the education process, damage to school property, or a health or safety hazard.
- 2. No sunglasses may be worn inside the building.
- 3. No pants that are unusually low riding and are worn low on the hips or below, or those revealing undergarments.
- 4. No showing of undergarments.
- 5. No excessively short shorts, skirts or dresses. High slits are also disallowed. No see-through clothing is allowed.
- 6. No roller skates, in-line skates, shoes with wheels, skateboards and the like are allowed in the school area. If a student brings such items, he/she will need to check them into the main office.
- 7. No piece of clothing that promotes violence; contains sexual, drug, alcohol, tobacco/marijuana and/or illegal substance content; or contains obscene language or pictures is allowed.
- 8. No clothing that symbolizes gang membership or which displays gang-related words, symbols, messages, or pictures will be allowed.
- 9. No underclothing should be visible.
- 10. No attire that glorifies crime.

#### 2024 - 25 Athletic Eligibility

All athletes must complete <u>all</u> forms online at <u>www.federalway-wa.finalforms.com</u> and turn in your completed physical form to the athletic secretary prior to the first day of practice if you don't have a current physical on file with Mrs. Jordan, Athletic Secretary.

Athletes must log-in and complete their forms prior to attending practice/tryouts.

#### Before you are cleared to turn out you must:

- 1. Complete all forms online at <u>www.federalway-wa.finalforms.com</u>.
  - Physical Form- Physicals are good for 24 months and must not expire during the sports season; please verify with Mrs. Jordan that she has your current physical.
- 2. Have no outstanding athletic fines.
- 4. Purchase an ASB card to be able to participate.

### From Our School Nurse: Mrs. Andrea Kleín

**MEDICATION AT SCHOOL:** Orders for medication at school are only valid for the current school year. If you think your scholar might need medication at school, please read the information listed below.

Washington State law permits school staff to administer medication only in limited situations. Parents and health care providers are urged to give medication outside of school hours whenever feasible. Medication is defined to mean all drugs, whether prescription or "over-the-counter". No scholar may give, dispense or administer any medication or remedy to another scholar. For more information or to access our district's

**PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS:** Prescription medications required during the school day need to be in the original pharmacy-labeled container, must be accompanied by written orders signed by both the healthcare provider and a parent/guardian, and are to be kept locked in the health room. Scholars may be permitted to selfcarry prescription medication in certain circumstances, including life-saving medications such as Epipens and inhalers and when it is deemed by the parent/guardian and school nurse that it is in the best interest of the scholar. Arrangements must be made in advance with the school nurse. A medication order is still required and your healthcare provider must indicate that the scholar is safe to self-carry the medication. Only one day's dosage shall be carried by the scholar (inhalers excluded). Scholars may NEVER carry controlled substances.

**NON-PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION:** Scholars in grades 6-12 may be in possession of over-the-counter (nonprescription) medications/remedies on school premises under the following conditions:

- Scholars must carry written permission from parent/guardian indicating what over-the-counter medicine and dosage the scholar may take.
- 2. Scholar must carry only one school day's dosage, in the original packaging.
- 3. Scholar may not share the medication with anyone else.

**POTENTIALLY LIFE-THREATENING HEALTH CONDITIONS:** In accordance with state law, scholars with potentially life-threatening health conditions such as anaphylactic allergies, diabetes, seizure disorders, and severe asthma are required to have a medication or treatment order, nursing care plan, and medications in place <u>before</u> they start school in the fall. If you did not receive the necessary paperwork in the mail, please contact the school nurse for assistance.

It's time to get your child's senior portrait taken if you haven't already. Pictures are due to the yearbook staff no later than December 15, 2024. Portraits received after this date are not guaranteed to be included in the yearbook. Portrait specifications:

- Only one person in portrait
- Head and shoulder shots only
- Plain background preferred in gray or blue
- Photo size: 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch tall by 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inch wide (can be larger as long as the head sized is correct)
- Head size from top of head to chin: 1 inch maximum
- No bright background
- Photos must be vertical
- Color photos. No black and white
- No full body, no props
- NO HEAD COVERINGS



#### FERPA

(Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974)

This law says that you can tell us who can see your child's directory information, such as his or her name, photo, or other information for specific uses. The district Form 206, "Request to Restrict Student Directory Information," is available in the counseling or main office. It's also available online at www.fwps.org/dept/comm/ferpa. Before signing, please read it carefully, as it may impact whether your child can be recognized in district publications, the news media and school publications such as the yearbook and graduation program.

The form does not need to be completed if you agree to the release of your student's directory information for the uses described in the form. This year, the form will not be sent home but will be available if parents want to fill it out. If the form is not completed and turned in, or boxes are left empty, Federal Way Public Schools will assume we have your permission to use your child's information as described in the form. #### FWHS Cambridge Program

Cambridge Parents and Students:

Our school district remains committed to providing a rigorous learning experience. At FWHS we provide all students the opportunity and supports to participate in Cambridge classes.

Please review these FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions) we have gotten about Cambridge this summer.

Q: When do Cambridge Students start school? A: All Class of 2027 (freshmen) Cambridge students: Attend Eagle Days to check your class schedules and familiarize yourself with the building.

All Grade 10-12 Cambridge students Attend Eagle Days to check your class schedules.

Q: How do I know if I have been accepted into Cambridge? A: You can tell if you are in the Cambridge Program by the classes on your schedule that you pick up on Eagle Day. You can contact Colin McDaniel by email at <u>FWHSCambridge@fwps.org</u> or call him at (253) 945-5452 if you have questions.

Q: Is it too late to get into the Cambridge Program?

A: Qualified students or students who choose these classes have been enrolled in 9th and 10th grade Cambridge classes per our district's board policy around Academic Acceleration.

Q: If I have a problem with my schedule at Eagle Day, who do I see?

A: Counselors will be available during Eagle Day to fix schedule problems. It is not unusual to have problems with your class schedule. With 1,600 students, each having a minimum of 8 classes that is 12,800 pieces of information to have accurate. Be patient if there is an error, and we will get it fixed. The first two days of school are focused school wide on orientation activities so there will be time to get schedules processed.

Q: What if my schedule cannot be fixed?

A: There are over 80 teachers at FWHS and over 400 different classes to schedule. Sometimes despite all the work we do, there could be schedule conflicts. A conflict means that you want to take two classes that are offered at the same time and ONLY during that time. The last few years we have minimized the conflicts, but sometimes students still end up having to make choices if a class section cannot be moved or a teacher's schedule cannot be changed. Thanks for being patient with the class schedules.

Q: If I have a typical counseling question, like arranging a meeting with all of my student's teachers or getting assistance with a peer conflict, who do I contact? A: Contact the Counseling Office at 253-945-5407 or 253-945-5408.

Q: What if I have an issue or concern with one of my classes?

A: Please begin by contacting your teacher.

#### Is an Advanced Academic Class Right for Your Student?

Traditionally, school districts have provided advanced academic programs and left it up to students to decide whether to enroll in them. In Federal Way, we're taking a different approach,



thanks to a policy approved by the school board in the spring of 2010.

Since 2011, under the district's policy, <u>Academic</u> <u>Acceleration Policy 2191</u>, students in grades 6-12 will be automatically enrolled in the appropriate advanced classes. Students who pass standardized tests have proven that they have the knowledge, skill and understanding of a subject necessary to take the advanced course(s).

Standardized state tests in reading, writing, math and science are used to determine the student's class placement. Students who want to sign up for advanced courses may do so, even if their test scores don't prequalify them. Additionally, students may opt out of these classes with their parents' permission. However, the goal is to encourage all students to achieve at their highest level. If you'd like to learn more, please go to <u>www.fwps.org/info/advanced</u> or contact your child's school.
