Mrs. Camarote - Special Education and English Language Support. Mrs. Camarote is a Hampton graduate and most recently taught in the North Hills School District.


Miss Dayton - Building Substitute. Miss Dayton completed her student teaching, and served as a building substitute, in the Avonworth School District last year.

Into Math

After a two year curriculum investigation that included research, site visits, and two full pilots, the Hampton Township School Board voted to adopt Houghton Mifflin Harcourt's Into Math program. It is an intentional, comprehensive, and inspiring mathematics program for grades K–5 that centers on student growth. Into Math supports students as they develop their conceptual understanding and grow into procedurally fluent mathematicians. According to the publisher, Into Math "gives students opportunities to discover the 'why' behind the 'how' in mathematics. It reshapes the teaching model and enables students to develop deeper understanding and productive perseverance in problem-solving." We are all excited about the new math materials and the learning opportunities they will provide for our students!



Student Absences

Daily, on-time attendance is an important part of school success. All students should be on time for homeroom, which begins at 8:45am. This is an important time for organization and preparation for the day. Students who are habitually tardy, arriving after 9:00am (the start of the academic day), disrupt their learning and their classmates' learning. These disruptions can negatively impact academic, social, and emotional development. Per District Policy #204, after ten (10) absences all subsequent absences must be accompanied by a medical note. Please review the Family Handbook for detailed information about attendance policies and when to keep an ill child at home. Please call (412) 486-6000 press 2, then press 4, to report student absences for Poff.

School Meals

Breakfast and lunch are provided daily. Students may go to the cafeteria for breakfast as soon as they arrive each day. *Breakfast is provided free of charge for all students.* Students order lunches during morning homeroom. Applications for free or reduced price lunch are available in the main office or on the <u>Food Services webpage</u>. Monthly menus are also posted there. Information for setting up online payment accounts can be found at the "At the Cafeteria Register" link on the Food Services webpage.

Water bottle refilling stations are located throughout the building. Students are encouraged to bring a *spill-proof* bottle and drink as they need throughout the day.



Classroom party treats must either be a healthy snack or non-food treat. Guidelines are in the <u>Handbook for Families with Elementary School Children</u> on the the District website.



Student Safety

Visitors Visitors must sign in at the office and have their government identification scanned before they can receive a badge that allows them to move past the office and enter the building.

Volunteers Clearances are required for volunteers who work with students without the supervision of a Poff faculty member (e.g, Holiday Shop, Book Fair, Science Olympiad). Details about how to obtain clearances can be found here.

Drills By law, students must participate in monthly fire drills and annual evacuation, lockdown, and severe weather drills. Students will participate in developmentally appropriate lessons on ALICE procedures using the book *I'm Not Scared, I'm Prepared*. Families will receive additional information regarding ALICE training in a newsletter prior to the student lessons in September.

Captured Vestibule The captured vestibule is used for early dismissals. An approved adult must sign out the student and may be asked to show ID before the student is dismissed. Shelving is available to drop off or pick up items without entering the building. Please label items with the student's name. A pen and paper are available for this purpose.

Home-School Partnerships

The key to a child's success at school is communication and collaboration between teachers and families. Below are some of the methods we use to encourage your involvement.

Communication Our school newsletter, Poff Papers, is published online each Thursday evening and sent via the District's Hampton Headlines email on Friday mornings. Homeroom teachers will also establish regular communications to keep you informed about classroom events and the academic skills your child is learning at school. Please be sure to read these and then follow-up with any questions that arise.

Let's Get Acquainted This adult-only event is for families to meet the teacher, see the classroom, and learn about the coming year. Homeroom teachers provide an informative, 60-minute presentation about classroom expectations and grade level curriculum.

Conferences Teacher conferences are scheduled for November 7th and 8th this year. Homeroom teachers will send information for choosing a time slot. These brief, 15-minute sessions are an opportunity for teachers to share your student's progress at the start of the year. Families are strongly encouraged to schedule additional phone, in-person, or virtual conferences at any point in the year when questions or concerns arise.

Homework Homework is an opportunity for collaboration. Families are encouraged to communicate with their teachers about how homework time is going. Homework should <u>not</u> be a source of daily frustration or be so easy as to feel pointless. A good rule of thumb is that assignments should take about 10 minutes times the grade level to complete. Thus, a third grader would expect assignments to be completed in about 30 minutes. If your student is taking much more or less time on a regular basis, please let your teacher know so things can be adjusted.



Transportation

Bus Riders 5th grade students are assigned as "safeties" for each bus. The role of the safeties is to assist the driver in maintaining a calm environment through kind reminders the students when necessarv. lt is responsibility of all students to follow bus transportation rules including not eating or drinking on the bus, remaining seated, and using a guiet voice. For the first two weeks of school all new students K-5 will be assigned a "bus buddy" who will assist with finding the correct bus and bus stop daily.

Walkers Students who are walked to school by an adult may be escorted to the main entrance in the front of the building or to door #8 in the back of the building. After school, a Poff staff member will walk students across the street to the intersection of Marie and Haberlein where an adult should be waiting to greet them.



Car Riders Use the back entrance (door #8) for both drop off and pick up.

Drop Off - Enter the back parking lot. Stay in a single line next to the curb. Pull forward to the second cafeteria door (door #8). Remain in your vehicle as your student exits. Pull forward when he or she is safely on the sidewalk. Stay in line. Do not pull around other vehicles. Continue to follow the curb back to the fence, turning left and driving around the parking lot to exit onto Haberlein Road.

Pick Up - Please send a note with your student if you plan to pick them up from school. All families will receive a numbered card on the first day of school. When picking up after school, place it in your passenger side window. Enter the back parking lot. Stay in a single line next to the curb. Pull all the way forward to the back fence. A staff member will dismiss your student from the building once your number has been identified. Remain in your vehicle and pull away as soon as your student is safely inside. Do not pull around other vehicles.

1st, 4th, and 5th graders will receive their devices within the first few days of school. All students should bring charged devices daily.

Student Devices

Students in grades 1-3 are provided with an iPad. 4th and 5th graders receive HP laptops. Each school year, families must access the District's <u>insurance site</u> to either <u>accept or decline</u> the insurance for your student's device. You should receive an email from the District with detailed information regarding registration. Questions can be directed to Margieann Green at <u>margieann.green@ht-sd.org</u>.

On the first day of school, you will receive a hard copy of the *Device User Agreement*. Please be sure to review this with your student, sign it, and return it to school.
