Beginning in the 24-25 school year, we will open new classrooms, throughout the school year, at our various sites as we are able. We will also be moving from a 6:1:1 model to an 8:1:3 model to better serve more students and to enhance supports provided to all learners in our classrooms. Most of our classrooms that are opened for the 24-25 school year will use the ratio of 8:1:3 (instead of 6:1:1).



Social Skills Development (SSD) 6:1:1

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Our three SSD Special Education Programs support students from kindergarten through 12th grade who struggle in their home schools due to unmet behavioral, emotional, or mental health needs. These full-day programs cater to a wide range of abilities, from mild developmental disabilities to gifted abilities, ensuring that every student receives the tailored support and instruction necessary to thrive academically, socially, and emotionally.

Key Components:

- Social Emotional Learning (SEL):
 - Each program integrates SEL into daily activities, teaching students to recognize and manage their emotions, develop empathy, build positive relationships, and make responsible decisions. SEL lessons are customized to meet the developmental and individual needs of students across all grade levels, promoting self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decision-making.

• Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS):

 PBIS is a foundational element of our programs, providing a structured framework for proactive strategies to define, teach, and support appropriate student behaviors. By focusing on positive behaviors and reinforcing them consistently, we create safe and positive learning environments across all grade levels. Students are encouraged and rewarded for demonstrating positive social interactions and emotional regulation.

Individualized Crisis Management Plans:

 Understanding that each student has unique needs, we develop individualized crisis management plans to address specific behavioral and emotional challenges. These plans are crafted in collaboration with students, parents, and our team of professionals, ensuring that each student receives the necessary support during challenging times.

Access to Support Services:

 Each program provides students with access to a dedicated team of professionals, including social workers, school psychologists, and school counselors. These specialists work closely with students across all grade levels to offer counseling, crisis intervention, and additional support tailored to their individual needs. Appropriate Social, Behavioral & Communication Skills (ASBCS) 6:1:1

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A full-day program is meticulously designed to support students who struggle with pragmatic language and communication, social awareness and interaction, academic learning, and behavior management (ASBCS). This program caters to students with a wide range of abilities, from developmental disabilities to gifted abilities, ensuring personalized and effective support for each student.

Key Components:

- Comprehensive Therapies:
 - Occupational Therapy: Focuses on enhancing students' fine motor skills, sensory processing, and daily living skills.
 - Physical Therapy: Aims to improve gross motor skills, coordination, and physical fitness.

Appropriate Social, Behavioral & Communication Skills (ASBCS) 6:1:2

Introducing our new for 2024-2025 specialized 6:1:2 program for grades 3-5, located at Finger Lakes Elementary School, serving as an extension of the Midlakes Education Center. Tailored to support students on the autism spectrum, our full-day curriculum emphasizes social, behavioral, and communication skills development. Integrated therapies such as occupational, physical, speech, and music therapy complement expert support from psychologists, counselors, and social workers. With dedicated sensory rooms and movement areas, students have spaces for regulation and engagement. With a low studentto-staff ratio of six students to one teacher and two assistants, we ensure individualized attention, empowering every student to thrive academically, socially, and emotionally.

Key Components:

1. Tailored Support:

• The program is specifically tailored to support students on the autism spectrum, addressing their unique social, behavioral, and communication needs.

Career Creations/Transition Class (CC) 12:1:1

Career Creations/Transition Class (CC) is a specialized program tailored to meet the unique needs of students, ages 16-22, with mild to moderate cognitive abilities. Designed for students who are eligible to attend school until the age of 22 and have completed four years of high school, CC provides a supportive and inclusive learning environment where students can continue to develop essential skills for independent living and successful transition to adulthood.

With a student-to-staff ratio of 15:1:1, our program offers personalized attention and support to ensure that each student receives the guidance they need to succeed. Instruction is provided in the four core content areas, including English Language Arts, mathematics, science, and social studies, with a focus on functional and practical applications.

A key component of our CC program is the development of employment skills. Through hands-on training, job shadowing opportunities, and community-based internships, students gain valuable experience and confidence in their ability to enter the workforce. Our dedicated team of educators and transition specialists work closely with students to identify their career interests and goals, providing guidance and support every step of the way.
