Grade Level	Requirements
Grade 6 With Promotion to Grade 7	A sixth-grade student must have earned a final grade of “D” or better in at least five of seven courses, to include three of the four core courses.
Grade 7 With Promotion to Grade 8	A seventh-grade student must have earned a final grade of “D” or better in at least five of seven courses, to include three of the four core courses.
Grade 8 With Promotion to Grade 9	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 3 courses in English Language Arts (ELA)</li> <li>• 3 courses in Mathematics</li> <li>• 3 courses in Science</li> <li>• 3 courses in Social Studies               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ (To include completion of one credit in Civics)</li> <li>○ 1 course in Career Exploration and Planning (may be incorporated in a Core Content Area)</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Successful completion of a “D” grade or higher is needed to pass all courses.</li> <li>• Civics must be taken in Middle School, only exception is student entering 8th grade from out of state or a private school after the start of Semester.</li> <li>• For the Civics course, the final grade calculation is different since it is an EOC course, where the EOC is 30% of the final grade. Students need to have a final full year “D” average to obtain credit for the course.           <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ This is the same calculation for the Algebra and Geometry high school credit courses.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• A student who successfully completes a high school course while in middle school may receive a middle school credit and a high school credit for that course.           <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ If a student completes a high school course with an end-of-course (EOC) exam associated with that course, they <u>must</u> first take the EOC before a grade and credit can be awarded.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• A student who successfully completes a college level course while in middle school may receive a middle school credit and a high school credit for that course.</li> </ul>
