<u>Primary Facilities Update -</u> The Wyoming Board of Education has approved a resolution directing the Hamilton County Board of Elections to place a 7.98 mill, 37-year bond issue on the November 5, 2024, ballot to raise \$72.5 million for the new construction of three primary schools. <u>The Wyoming Primary Facilities Master Plan</u> includes:

- Three new K-4 school buildings on each of the current school sites.
- Solutions to the limitations of our current buildings as prioritized by the Wyoming Primary Schools Facilities Committee.
- Alignment with the community's preferred direction as identified by a statistically representative survey.

With the passage of the 7.98 mill bond issue, the cost to a homeowner would be \$279.21 annually for each \$100,000 of the market home value as determined by the Hamilton County Auditor. The actual financial impact is projected to be \$161.61 annually

for each \$100,000 of market home value (or 4.62 mills) due to the proactive work Wyoming City Schools has done to pay off the 1998 Wyoming High School Bond Issue debt early - reducing the millage paid by Wyoming homeowners by 3.36 mills at the end of 2024.

CINCINNATI CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL STUDENT THERAPY

During the summer, we partnered with MindPeace to facilitate the process of choosing a new lead mental health partner to address critical mental health needs for students. MindPeace completed a mental health needs assessment with stakeholder input. In this needs assessment, Wyoming stakeholders recognized a need to increase access to a continuum of on-campus mental health services. After an interview process of potential providers, we are excited to welcome Cincinnati Children's Hospital to fill this critical role. We are currently working with Cincinnati Children's Hospital to identify therapists who will be working within each of our school buildings and will provide continued updates. Please reach out to your school counselor if you have any questions.

WCS Intervention and Special Education Audit

The Hamilton County Educational Service Center (HCESC) will conduct a comprehensive audit of our intervention and special education services to ensure alignment in our vision and practices, accountability, and the delivery of high-quality, equitable services to students with disabilities. This initiative seeks to assess the effectiveness of programs, identify areas for improvement, foster a culture of continuous improvement within the district, and maintain the trust of stakeholders. In the coming weeks, we'll share more details about this process and how you can be involved. We are committed to keeping you informed and engaged throughout this entire process.
