FENTANYL FACTS

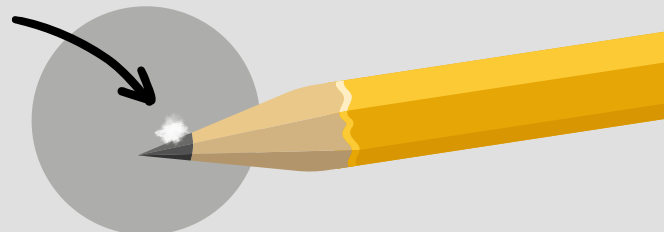
FENTANYL IS A SYNTHETIC OPIOID THAT IS UP TO 50 TIMES STRONGER THAN HEROIN AND 100 TIMES STRONGER THAN MORPHINE.

FENTANYL IS IMPACTING INDIVIDUALS WITH AND WITHOUT SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS. (CDC)

DRUG TRAFFICKERS ARE DISGUIISING PILLS CONTAINING DANGEROUS FENTANYL TO LOOK LIKE LEGITIMATE PRESCRIPTION DRUGS AND EVEN CANDY, TARGETING KIDS AND TEENS.

DRUGS CAN CONTAIN LETHAL AMOUNTS OF FENTANYL, AND YOU WON'T BE ABLE TO SEE, TASTE, OR SMELL IT. THE ONLY WAY TO KNOW IF DRUGS ARE MIXED WITH FENTANYL IS BY TESTING THEM WITH FENTANYL TEST STRIPS.

DEADLY DOSE OF FENTANYL:



ONE PILL CAN KILL

SIGNS OF OVERDOSE

- Unresponsive
- Shallow breathing
- Unable to wake
- Unusual snoring/gurgling sounds
- Blue/grey lips or finger tips

OVERDOSE RESPONSE

- Call 911 immediately.
- Administer Naloxone or Narcan, if available.
- Try to keep the person awake and breathing.
- Lay the person on their side to prevent choking.
- Stay with them until emergency workers arrive



TAKE BACK CONTROL
