Academic Schedule

HHCA operates on a hybrid year-long schedule of 45-minute classes/2 days per week; 90-minute classes/2 days per week; and 50-minute classes/Fridays.

Course Offerings

Most academic core courses (English, history/social studies, mathematics, and science) are offered at College Preparatory (CP) and Honors (H) levels, with the exceptions of Algebra 3 (CP only), Statistics (CP & AP only) and Spanish 1 & 2 (CP only).

AP courses are year-long and capped at a maximum of four. This year, 125 students are taking a combined total of 244 AP classes. AP offerings include*:

Dual Enrollment

Juniors and seniors with a 3.0 unweighted GPA may pursue dual enrollment opportunities with the University of South Carolina-Beaufort and/or the Technical College of the Lowcountry. Approximately 45 juniors & seniors are enrolled in over 100 dual-credit courses for 2024-2025.

Diploma with Distinction

This graduation honor is bestowed upon students who complete an independent research project culminating in a written and verbal defense of their thesis.

Elective Courses

Students may choose from a variety of fine arts, technology, physical education, and interest-based electives, including: Art, Theater Production, Theater Design, Chorus, Band, Strings, Yearbook; Forensic Science, Intro to Business, Journalism, Mock Trial; PE & Wellness, Strength & Fitness; PLTW courses: Biomedical Science, Computer Science, Engineering, Human Body Systems; Sports Medicine, Personal Finance, Teacher Aide, and Internships.

Academic Resource Center

HHCA's NILD-certified staff provides academic support for students with documented learning challenges, aiming to produce confident, passionate and purposeful achievers prepared for college, career, and life.

Internships

Forty-eight HHCA juniors and seniors are currently interning in the community, gaining experience in their field of interest. HHCA students have completed internships in dance, law, medicine, marketing, real estate, physical therapy, marine biology, interior design, engineering, architecture and more.

Athletics

HHCA offers 31 athletic teams, including 18 varsity sports, with 75% of high school students participating. Over 65 state championship titles have been earned throughout school history. Each year, a number of HHCA athletes go on to play collegiate sports, including 13 from the Class of 2024.

Since 2015, HHCA has earned 21 SCISA State Championship titles: Girls Basketball (7), Girls Soccer (3), Girls Golf (2), Football (3) Boys Soccer (2), Boys Golf (3), and Baseball (1).

In 2023-24, state championships were earned in Girls Basketball, Football and Baseball, along with individual athletic accolades.

Fine Arts

Over 70% of students participate in HHCA's award-winning Fine Arts programs. HHCA's theater department took first prize at SCISA's state One Act competition in 2023 and 2022, along with several individual top honors. This year, student actors will present 101 Dalmatians KIDS (2nd-7th), Big Fish the Musical (9th-12th), Willy Wonka Jr (4th-12th) and Annie Jr (6th-8th).

HHCA draws students from around the country to its annual summer Jazz Camps. Band students perform in jazz combos and ensembles, pit orchestra, and other musical offerings during the year. Budding artists often exhibit their work in our local arts community.
