

2nd grade Remote Learning Plans Semester 1

Day 1

Math- Create 15 addition/subtraction or mixed (addition & subtraction) problems and solve them.

Reading- Read for 15 minutes. While reading, try to find any red words (from phonics) that we have covered, and write them on a paper.

Writing- Write a journal entry about your day.

Science/Social Studies- Draw a picture to represent what we are currently learning. Try to label the items in your picture and explain the importance of the item.

Phonics- (see reading)

Day 2

Math- Create 5 different numbers that are 3 or more digits. (Example 147). Then, write each number in standard form, expanded form, word form, and base ten blocks.

Reading- Read a story related to our current science/social studies topic.

Writing- Write about a time when you got lost. (or a time when you found something.)

Science/Social Studies- (see reading)

Phonics- Rainbow write 5 words with our current phonics pattern.

Day 3

Math- Write three word problems and solve them.

Reading- While reading today, use post it notes and jot down the important parts of the story. (Key details)

Writing- Write a letter to tell a friend/relative what we have been learning about in science/social studies.

Science/Social Studies- (see writing)

Phonics- Hidden picture. Draw a picture and 'hide' 5 words with our current phonics pattern in the picture.

Day 4

Math- Draw 5 digital clocks and write a time in them. Next to the digital clock, draw a matching analog clock to show the time.

Reading- While reading today, pick any phonics pattern we have studied and spy out the words that belong to that pattern. Write them on a piece of paper.

Writing- Write about a dream you have. (This could be a real aspiration, or a fantasy dream.)

Science/Social Studies- Make note cards to teach others a few facts about our current topic.

Phonics- (see reading)

Day 5

Math- Write down three digits. Make the biggest number and the smallest number using those 3 digits. Repeat this five times.

Reading- After reading today, create a story mountain about your book. (For this a picture book works well.)

Writing- Write to tell me why we should or shouldn't be studying about our current science/social studies topic. Give reasons to explain your opinion.

Science/Social Studies- Find things around your home that are a solid/liquid/gas.

Phonics- Use magnetic letters, chalk, playdough, salt, shaving cream (pick one) and make as many words as you can using our phonics pattern for the week.
