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Dual Enrollment, Dual Credit, Advanced Placement, and Honors Classes

What are they?

Timothy offers Dual Enrollment, Dual Credit, Advanced Placement®, and Honors classes (in addition to regular classes). Some classes get you college credit (often at a fraction of the cost) while you are still enrolled at Timothy Christian High School, and some do not. Here are the distinct differences:

Dual Enrollment

Dual Enrollment means just that — a student is enrolled at two places (one of which is Timothy). Students may take classes at Grand Canyon University, College of DuPage, Colorado Christian University, and Elmhurst University. Upon successful completion of the class, students may transfer the college credit to the college of their choice. Students must verify that their choice of a college/university post-high school will accept the credit.

- GCU and CCU offer countless online, asynchronous classes, which students can take during study hall. Students can attend in-person classes at College of DuPage and Elmhurst University.
- Students must take responsibility for transferring classes to their college of choice.
- This option does not affect a student’s high school GPA.

Dual Credit

Dual Credit allows students to earn both high school and college credit. To earn college credit, students must pass a Dual Credit class with a C or better. The grade earned will be part of the student’s college academic record. Unlike AP classes, students do not have to pass a standardized exam to earn college credit. College admissions counselors may consider Dual Credit grades during the admissions process.

- Students earn both college credit and high school credit.
- This option affects a student’s high school GPA.
- Timothy only offers one Dual Credit class at this time (Honors Chemistry).
- Students must take responsibility for transferring classes to their college of choice.

With courses available individually or as a comprehensive curriculum, Sevenstar offers a unique combination of interactive online structure, instruction by accredited Christian instructors, and self-paced learning to fit each student’s unique needs. Timothy students may take a variety of high school classes online with Sevenstar, including Advanced Placement® classes, foreign language, and computer science classes. Additional class fees apply.

Advanced Placement® (aka AP) Classes

Timothy offers many Advanced Placement® (AP) courses, but students can utilize Sevenstar online for even more AP classes. The AP program develops college-level courses that high schools can choose to offer and corresponding AP exams that are administered once a year. In order to gain college credit students must score a 3 or higher (in some cases a 4 or higher) to earn college credit. Each college has different minimum scores.

- Students must take the AP exam to earn college credit.
- AP classes taken at Timothy are weighted and will affect a student’s high school GPA.
- Online AP classes do not affect a student’s GPA.
- Students must send AP scores to their college of choice.

Honors Classes

Honors classes cover the same or similar material as regular classes, but provide more depth and insight into the subjects at hand. More challenging content means studying takes more time, projects require more work, and tests are more challenging. Students do not receive college credit for Honors classes, but for many, the rigorous coursework along with like-minded peers is rewarding. College admissions counselors usually look favorably on Honors classes on a student’s high school transcripts.

- No college credit is given for Honors classes.
- Honors classes taken at Timothy are weighted and will affect a student’s high school GPA.
- Online Honors classes do not affect a student’s GPA, however, the student will receive high school credit.

In-person and online classes outside of Timothy can range from \$250–\$750 and are not included in tuition. Consult your academic advisor about scheduling Dual Enrollment classes a semester in advance.



Grand Canyon University

Online **Dual Enrollment**



Timothy Christian High School students may take college credit courses online through Grand Canyon University. Grand Canyon University (GCU) has been accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) since 1968. This gives students a headstart on college level classes. Your college counselor will help you check to make sure the course does not have a prerequisite and that your future college of choice will accept the credit.

- There are over 100 courses available to take through Grand Canyon University.
- Students have a broad range of courses from which to choose.
- The registration process is rolling.
- Asynchronous online courses run for 7 weeks and count for 4 college credits.
- A 3.0 cumulative high school GPA is required unless otherwise specified.

Through the Learning Management System, GCU's online classroom, interactive forums allow online Dual Enrollment students to network, interact, and participate with their peers and professors when collaborating on projects and assignments.

Colorado Christian University

Dual Enrollment and **Dual Credit**



Colorado Christian University is a four-year liberal arts university accredited by the Higher Learning Commission; therefore, credits transfer to many colleges and universities nationwide.

Online Dual Enrollment

Timothy students can also take CCU Academy online courses, which are taught by Colorado Christian University instructors. The courses are designed specifically for high school students who wish to have a faith component integrated with their general education coursework. The online Academy courses are offered three semesters per year in 10 to 15-week blocks.

In-Person Dual Credit

Honors Chemistry is taught in-person at Timothy by chemistry teacher Mr. Adamski. Students receive both Colorado Christian University credit and Timothy High School credit.

Elmhurst University

In-Person **Dual Enrollment**



Timothy students on a rigorous math pathway may take additional advanced math coursework in person (after completing AP Calculus AB at Timothy) through Elmhurst University. Alternatively, Elmhurst University offers many other courses for which a student may be dually-enrolled, and students may take up to two classes at Elmhurst University free of charge. Students must work with their academic advisor to schedule in-person classes at Elmhurst University well in advance.

College of DuPage

In-Person **Dual Enrollment**



College of DuPage offers an Early Admissions Program for high school students who are under age 18. Eligible students can take college-level courses in-person at COD's campus, many of which are offered nights and weekends.

Beyond Dual Enrollment, Dual Credit, Advanced Placement, and Honors Classes.

Think like an entrepreneur.

Creative thinking, initiative, innovation, and resilience are all qualities that define entrepreneurs. People with an entrepreneurial spirit are often characterized by their willingness to adapt to change, embrace challenges, and take a proactive approach to problem-solving. Even if a student doesn’t want to become an entrepreneur, an entrepreneurial mindset sets them up to develop their God-given gifts and talents — no matter what career they choose. At Timothy, Entrepreneurship Programming is part of the curriculum for electives in art, business, and family and consumer science. Students will develop a Biblical understanding of leadership, business principles, and generosity.

For those who want to dive deeper into entrepreneurship, Timothy offers two entrepreneurship classes:

FOUNDATIONS OF ENTREPRENEURSHIP

1 Semester (0.5 credit)
Grades: 9-12
Prerequisite: None

Through this hands-on, project-based course, students will explore key elements of entrepreneurship focusing on personal growth, resilience, problem-solving, collaboration, and effective communication. The course will cover topics such as goal setting, setting a new definition for failure, seeing problems as opportunities, becoming a team player, understanding the importance of networking, developing effective communication skills, and exemplifying Christ in the workplace. Students will develop the skills and mindset necessary to navigate the challenges and opportunities that arise in any situation.

FOUNDATIONS OF ENTREPRENEURSHIP 2

1 Semester (0.5 credit)
Grades: 9-12
Prerequisite: Foundations of Entrepreneurship 1

This course is designed to provide students with a comprehensive understanding of the essential principles and skills required to navigate the entrepreneurial landscape successfully. Through this project-based course, students will explore topics such as compound interest, opportunity costs, unique value propositions, establishing business goals, tracking progress, working through failure, and the importance of social entrepreneurship as a Christ-follower. Following this course, students will be prepared to participate in a student-run, school-based business.

Career Test-Drive: Real World Experience

Internships

Internships not only look good on a college application, but they give students the opportunity to gain real-world experience. Plus, internships often play a critical role in helping students choose a college major and ultimately a career path.

Timothy Christian High School students have three distinct internship opportunities to choose from: an on-campus internship running the coffee and smoothie bar, an off-campus internship, plus a 7-day internship during Renew.

ON-CAMPUS INTERNSHIP: STUDENT-RUN BUSINESS

1 Semester (0.5 credit)
Grades: 10-12

There’s more to running a successful coffee and smoothie bar than knowing how to make a caramel macchiato. There are sales, operations, marketing, finance, and management. All students will have roles within the organization, and responsibilities will vary, based upon specific roles. Interested students will complete an application and interview for a role. Beyond running the business daily, students will complete tasks as assigned, monthly reflections of learning, and an online portfolio including a resume, materials created based upon their role, and other projects completed through the experience. This internship provides an experience that will develop skills applicable to all careers and would be considered work experience on a resume.

RENEW INTERNSHIPS

Renew is a 7-day term in January when students can choose an internship. Think of this as a career test-drive. It’s just one more way students can develop real-world experience.

OFF-CAMPUS: INTERNSHIP

1 Semester (0.5 credit)
Grades: 11-12

Ever wonder if a career in medicine, finance, or engineering is right for you? Maybe you’re trying to decide what major you should pursue in college. An off-campus internship not only gives you hands-on experience, but often helps students pick a major.

At Timothy, an off-campus internship experience is a coordinated program with the school, students, and organizations within the Timothy community. This internship will provide students with an opportunity to explore a career. It will offer insight into the day-to-day routines and practices of a career, enable networking opportunities, and develop skills. Students will complete 60 hours of internship experience. In the first 5-6 weeks of the course, students will meet on Mondays during the scheduled internship time to prepare career documents, develop an online presence, complete internship modules, and talk about their internship experience. The rest of the week during the internship-scheduled time, students will go to their internship site.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

MINOR IN MATH

Senior Christian Friend has earned just about enough college credits to have a minor in math—all while still in high school! How did he do it? He’s taken four AP classes at Timothy, including AP Calculus and AP Stats. Then, as a senior, he took Calculus 2 and Calculus 3 at Elmhurst University. But it gets better! Timothy students can take up to two classes at Elmhurst University free of charge. That’s right, Timothy students can earn college credit at no cost; it’s all part of a dual enrollment program.

Dual enrollment means just that—a student is enrolled at two places (one of which is Timothy). Students may take classes at Grand Canyon University, College of DuPage, and Elmhurst University. Upon successful completion of the class, students may transfer the college credit to the college of their choice. Students must verify that their choice of a college/university post-high school will accept the credit.

Logistically, Christian worked with Timothy’s guidance counselor to arrange his schedule so he could commute to Elmhurst University every day, which is just a short drive away.

Taking dual enrollment courses not only got Christian college credit, but also prepared him to launch full-time into college in the fall. “College classes are harder than any high school class,” Christian admits. “But Timothy prepared me to be successful in them—even how my teachers at Timothy taught me to take notes or go ask for help during Focus Period. In college, there are office hours. But I’ve learned to really utilize that and ask for help when I need it.”

- 1
- Starting with the graduating class of 2025, all students must earn a minimum of 24 Carnegie credits to graduate. (0.5 Carnegie credit is equivalent to one M-F course for one semester). Any exceptions to the credit policy must be approved by the administration.
- 2
- Required courses are indicated in the four-year planner (next page).
- 3
- A student is required to complete 8 semesters of high school attendance and earn the applicable, requisite credits to receive a diploma. Any exceptions to the above must have the timely recommendation of a counselor and the principal and the approval of the Education Committee. The minimum annual credit requirement is 6.0.
- 4
- In addition to academic graduation requirements, all students must participate in and meet the expectations for Renew.
