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PRINCIPAL

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Monroe Area High School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. - Increase weighted proficiency rate by 3% in all EOC content areas
- Staff will participate in Professional Learning for literacy
