## A. Student/Staff Recognition

- 1. (PMEA) All-State Festival and Conference. In the performing arts world, this is the equivalent of making it to the state championship. The festival was held late last month at the Erie Bayfront Convention Center and student performances were held at the newly renovated historic Warner Theater.

Students are led by Ms. Sarah Miller, Orchestra Director, Mr. Varden Armstrong and Mr. Robert Babick, band directors, and Ms. Bobi-Jean Alexander, choir director.

2. The U.S. Department of Education recently announced the 2024 U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon Schools, which includes Rowan Elementary School. Rowan is one of only three schools on the list from Pennsylvania, in addition to also being the only Pennsylvania elementary public school and the only educational institution representing the western side of the state. Across the country, 41 schools, 10 districts, three postsecondary institutions and one early learning center are being honored for their innovative efforts to reduce environmental impact and utility costs, improve health and wellness, and offer effective sustainability education. The honorees were named

from a pool of candidates nominated by 24 states. Rowan and the other award winners will be recognized later this summer at an event to be held in Washington D.C.

Seneca Valley had 36 students from various grade levels compete against hundreds of other students from across the country in the Academic Games League of America (AGLOA) National Tournament, which took place in Atlanta, Georgia, April 20-22. Seneca Valley proudly returned with 20 team and individual awards after competing in seven areas: Equations, On-Sets, Linguishtik, Theme, Propaganda, Current Events and Presidents. A special shout out goes to Miss Lydia Miller, senior, for being a member and leading scorer for the Senior Division Propaganda National Champion Team. All Seneca Valley students were led in this effort by Mr. Michael Stebbins, senior high school librarian, Ms. Julie Smith, Ryan Gloyer Middle School science teacher, and Mr. Jeremiah Friday, Haine Elementary School gifted support teacher.
