#### A. <u>Student/Staff Recognition</u>

- 1. Nationally known and recognized, Seneca Valley Performing Arts ensembles continued to receive top rankings at Pennsylvania Music Education Association (PMEA) conferences and festivals last month:
  - Nine Seneca Valley Band students were selected to participate in PMEA
    District 1 Region Band Festival that was held at Deer Lakes High School.
    Region Band is a select group of students who have advanced through
    audition to the regional level of the state festival process. Students are led by
    Mr. Varden Armstrong, Mr. Robert Babick, Mr. Brian Croach and Ms. Sara
    Snyder, secondary instrumental instructors.
  - Eleven Seneca Valley orchestra students participated in the PMEA District 2, 3 and 5 Orchestra held at Hickory High School. Based on auditions at this event, seven Seneca Valley students were selected to advance to the Western Region Orchestra. Students are led by Ms. Sarah Miller, secondary orchestra instructor.
  - Twenty-five Seneca Valley band students were selected by audition to perform in the PMEA District 5 Jazz Festival held at Slippery Rock University (SRU). Students are led by Mr. Varden Armstrong and Mr. Robert Babick, secondary band instrumental instructors.
- 2. Three Seneca Valley students returned with first-place awards after presenting their research projects at the Region 9 Pennsylvania Junior Academy of Science (PJAS) competition held at Slippery Rock University last month. All three students will move on to present at the state PJAS competition held at Penn State University in May. Entry fees for the regional competition were

funded by the Seneca Valley Foundation (SVF). PJAS is a statewide organization designed to stimulate and promote interest in science among its junior and senior student members through the development of research projects and investigations. Student adviser for the program is Ms. Kelly Weston, senior high school science teacher.

3. Mr. Mike Manipole, Ryan Gloyer Middle School (RGMS) Health and Physical Education Teacher, recently received the Ann Moniot Outstanding Middle Level Teacher Award for the 2023-24 school year from the Pennsylvania Association for Middle Level Education (PAMLE). This award is presented to a middle level educator that has made professional contributions that have positively influenced middle level education and students within their school, has a passion for teaching that is contagious to those around them, and someone who creates positive and caring relationships with their students and their colleagues.   - 2. Robotics Club Grant in the amount of \$30,000 requested by Ms. Annie Mersing. Funds will be used to support the Robotics Clubs for middle and elementary school students.
  - 3. Hi 5 Kindergarten Transition Grant in the amount of \$2,000 requested by Dr. Kristen White. Funds will be used to purchase UFLI materials that will be used in local preschool programs. These materials will support students transitioning to kindergarten.
