A. <u>Student/Staff Recognition</u>

- 1. Mr. LaVarr Stephens-Howling, Ryan Gloyer Middle School (RGMS) Acting Assistant Principal and student council advisor, was recently awarded the Region A Middle School Advisor of the year from the Pennsylvania Association of Student Councils (PASC). As PASC Region A Middle School Advisor of the year, he was chosen from representatives in a 10-county area: Beaver, Butler, Clarion, Crawford, Erie, Forest, Lawrence, Mercer, Venango and Warren. Mr. Stephens-Howling is now in the running for the PASC State-Level Advisor of the Year.

 - 4. The Haine Middle School Garden and Beyond Grant in the amount of \$18,862.60 requested by Ms. Annie Mersing and Ms. Erin Wilcher. Funds will be used for supplies to create a school garden which will include aquaponics and embryology components.
- I. <u>Student Trip</u> Approve the secondary band trip to Norfolk, Virginia from April 25-28, 2025, under the supervision of Mr. Varden Armstrong, Mr. Robert Babick and Ms. Sara Snyder. Students will miss two days of instruction. This will be at no cost to the district.

- J. Renaissance Learning, Inc. Agreement Approve agreement with Renaissance Learning, Inc. to utilize the STAR assessment tool as the universal screening measure for students in grades 3 through 8. This includes the licensing fee for the STAR assessment tool, training, and ongoing support. Pending solicitor review and approval.
- K. <u>School Reconfigurations (Pennsylvania Department of Education)</u> Approve the reconfiguration plans for Connoquenessing Valley Elementary School, Ehrman Crest Elementary School, Haine Elementary School, and Rowan Elementary School to include extended day kindergarten programs.

- G. <u>Insurance Premiums</u> Approve insurance premiums for the 2024-2025 fiscal year as provided by First National Insurance Agency.
- H. <u>Capital Reserve Transfer</u> Authorize the transfer of \$660,000 from the general fund to the capital reserve fund representing surplus funds from the 2023-2024 fiscal year. This represents allocations set aside in the current year for curriculum which were not used.

- I. <u>Athletic Training Services Agreement</u> Approve a five-year renewal agreement with Allegheny Health Network to provide athletic training services as well as medical assistance services provided in connection with the school's athletic program.
- J. <u>Booster Group Resolution</u> Approve the Booster Group Resolution for the 2024-2025 school year.

K. <u>Ticket prices</u> –

- 1. Approve the athletic ticket prices for the 2024-25 school year with no changes as follows: football reserved seating \$8.00/entry; football pre-sale adult general admission \$6.00/entry; football pre-sale student general admission \$4.00 entry; all football tickets at the gate \$6.00/entry; all other sports adult general admission \$5.00/entry; all other sports student general admission \$3.00/entry.
- 2. Approve a student or adult annual athletic pass for the 2024-25 school year at a cost of \$50.00 for the year. The pass will allow entry into al Seneca Valley sponsored home athletic events. Pass does not allow for entry to any away or any WPIAL and/or PIAA playoff events.
- L. <u>Facilities Rental Fees</u> Approve the facilities rental fees for the 2024-25 school year with no changes.
- M. <u>Bid Awards</u> Award the professional lawn care contract to Funyak Landscapes, L.P. for district wide lawn care services.
- N. <u>Final 2024-2025 General Fund Budget</u> Approve the final general budget for 2024-2025 in the amount of \$176,200,022 with a proposed millage increase of 5.32 mills (4%).
