- 1. Officials of National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) recently announced Seneca Valley seniors Eric Combs, Peter Ko and Haihan Xu, as semifinalists in the 68th annual National Merit Scholarship Program. As semifinalists, all three will have the opportunity to continue in the competition for National Merit Scholarships that will be offered next spring. About 95 percent of the semifinalists are expected to attain finalist standing, which will be announced in February 2023, and approximately half of the finalists will win a National Merit Scholarship, earning the Merit Scholar® title. The nationwide pool of semifinalists, representing less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors, includes the highest-scoring entrants in each state.
- 2. Leila Wright, an eighth grader at Ryan Gloyer Middle School, has been named a Jack Kent Cooke Young Scholar. This is one of the most competitive and generous programs in the country and is a selective five-year, pre-college scholarship for high-performing students.
