

Red Jacket's Transportation Dept. Receives Perfect Score From NYSDOT



The Red Jacket Transportation Department has once again achieved a perfect score on its bus inspection by the New York State Department of Transportation. This marks the 11th consecutive year the department has received this outstanding recognition.

The inspection, which is mandated every six months, revealed zero Out-of-Service Violations—a testament to the department's unwavering

commitment to safety and excellence. Achieving such a flawless score is a significant accomplishment and speaks volumes about the dedication and hard work of the entire team.

The department's success can be attributed to the diligent efforts of two key players: mechanics Jim Cheasman and Will Ciardi. They are responsible for performing preventative maintenance and conducting monthly inspections on the buses. They also address any potential issues reported by drivers, ensuring that each vehicle remains in top condition.

According to the DOT Inspector, while it is not impossible to achieve a perfect rating, it is indeed rare and requires a tremendous amount of effort and dedication. The inspection process goes beyond checking fluids, air levels, and wiper blades. It involves rigorous tasks such as removing 200-pound tires and brake drums to inspect the thickness of brake pads and drum linings.

The Red Jacket Transportation Department takes immense pride in ensuring the safety of its students. This perfect score is a reflection of the district's unwavering commitment to providing safe and reliable transportation for all its passengers.
