Seneca Valley Intermediate High School Auditorium - 7:00 p.m.

Minutes

June 13, 2022

- 1. **CALL TO ORDER** Mr. James Nickel, Board Vice President, called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m.
 - A. <u>Moment of Silence</u> The meeting was opened with a moment of silence.
 - B. <u>Pledge of Allegiance</u> Mr. Nickel led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
 - C. <u>**Roll Call**</u> by Ms. Mislan, Board Secretary, showed the following members in attendance: Ms. Leslie Bredl, Mr. Eric DiTullio, Mr. Mike Jacobs, Mr. James Nickel, Ms. Susan Harrison, Mr. Frederick Peterson, Ms. Kathy Whittle, and Mr. Jeffrey Widdowson. Mr. Timothy Hester was absent.
 - D. <u>Amendment of Action Agenda</u> Approved the amendment of the agenda of the action agenda by the addition of the following resolutions:
 - 1. Accepted the resignation of Mr. Eric DiTullio as President of the Board of School Directors.
 - 2. Appointed Mr. James Nickel as President of the Board of School Directors for the remaining term through December 5, 2022.

Mr. Nickel made an amendment to the agenda and presided over the election of a new president stating, "While Mr. DiTullio has resigned as president, he remains a valued member of the Seneca Valley School Board."

E. <u>Acceptance of Resignation</u> - Accepted the resignation of Mr. DiTullio as President of the Board of School Directors.

Ms. Harrison motioned, seconded by Mr. Peterson, to accept Mr. DiTullio's resignation as President, with Mr. DiTullio abstaining and Mr. Timothy Hester absent.

F. <u>Appointment of Board President</u> - Appointed Mr. Nickel as President of the Board of School Directors for the remaining term through December 5, 2022.

Ms. Kathy Whittle nominated Mr. Nickel to serve as Board President until the expiration of the term on December 5, 2022. Mr. Nickel was approved 7-1 as the new Board President with Mr. DiTullio abstaining and Mr. Hester absent.

G. Appointment of Board Vice President

Ms. Whittle nominated Mr. Mike Jacobs, and Ms. Bredl nominated Mr. Jeff Widdowson for Board Vice President. The motion did not pass due to a 4-4 tie with Mr. Jacobs, Ms. Whittle, Mr. DiTullio and Mr. Nickel voting for Mr. Jacobs; and Ms. Harrison, Ms. Bredl, Mr. Peterson, and Mr. Widdowson voting for Mr. Widdowson. The Board agreed to vote on a Vice President at the next action meeting in August.

2. **INFORMATION REPORTS**

- A. <u>Student/Staff Recognitions</u> Ms. Andreassi announced the following:
 - The National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) announced over 2,600 winners of National Merit Scholarships financed by U.S. colleges and universities, including Seneca Valley's own Mr. Daniel Spear. A recent 2022 graduate and co-valedictorian, Mr. Spear has been offered a National Merit Purdue University Scholarship. Officials of each sponsor college selected their scholarship winners from among the Finalists in the 2022 National Merit Scholarship Program who plan to attend their institution. Daniel intends to attend Purdue University this fall as a computer science major.
 - 2. Mr. Chris Helmsen, a recent 2022 Seneca Valley graduate, has been named a National Cyber Scholar by the National Cyber Scholarship Foundation (NCSF) for his performance in a challenging online cybersecurity training program. Mr. Helmsen competed for a top score against thousands of high school students across the nation by solving real-world cybersecurity problems. Over 45,000 students nationwide sought to qualify for a National Cyber Scholarship. As a result of his achievement, Mr. Helmsen is one of only 20 students in the state who has earned a \$3,000 scholarship to attend the Cyber Foundations Academy, a multi-week online program based on the nationally recognized SANS Foundations training course and certification.
 - 3. The Seneca Valley Girls' Softball Team won the semifinals of the PIAA State Championship and will be competing for the State Championship title on Friday, June 17 at Penn State University. There has been a Seneca Valley athletic team in state finals for all three seasons this school year: SV Boys' Soccer was state runner-up; SV Boys' Swim Team are State Champions; and SV Girls' Softball.
