MINUTES

January 13, 2020

- CALL TO ORDER The meeting was called to order by Mr. James Nickel, President, at 7:05 p.m.
 - A. Moment of Silence The meeting was opened with a moment of silence.
 - B. <u>Pledge of Allegiance</u> Stella Brody, a third-grade student at Evans City Elementary School, continued the board meeting initiative, *I Led the Pledge*, by reciting the "Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag."

2. INFORMATION REPORTS

- A. <u>Student/Staff Recognition</u> Ms. Linda Andreassi announced the following student and staff recognition:
 - Band festival attendees were treated to a sea of blue and black at the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association (PMEA) District 5 Band Festival held Dec. 12-14. Seneca Valley alone made up 35 percent of the festival band. District 5 is made up of students from Beaver, Butler, Lawrence and Mercer counties. Over 220 students auditioned for a band of 125 musicians.
 - 2. Haine Elementary School's First Lego League (FLL) team, aka Haine Raiders, earned the top elementary score and was awarded the Elementary Excellence Award Trophy on Dec. 14 at the Western Pennsylvania FLL Grand Championship at Sewickley Academy. Students competed in four

- rounds of the robot game and in three presentations that included a robot design and project details. Haine Raiders also placed second in October at the Tenacious Tiger Tech Tournament and was named the Top Rookie Team in December at the A Galaxy Far, Far Away Tournament.
- 3. Seneca Valley is the only School District in Butler County to be awarded a Teacher in the Workplace Grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE). The \$25,000 grant will enable teachers to visit local employers and learn the skills and industry trends to enhance their classroom instruction, student learning and career readiness. Seneca Valley teachers will be participants in a structured job-shadowing program during the summer, learning more from employers near our school district. After debriefing about the experience, the faculty will review their school curricula and make recommendations for adjustments that support developing 21st century skills that meet local employers' needs.
- 4. Members of the Seneca Valley Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps (JROTC) Raider Battalion placed first at the Western PA JROTC Air Rifle Competition hosted on Dec. 21 at Seneca Valley. Additionally, Seneca Valley cadets swept the top three individual scores. The shoulder-by-shoulder event included JROTC battalions from Albert Gallatin, Butler, Beaver and Valley high schools.
