## GIRLS' RESEARCH

### PUTTING THE LATEST RESEARCH ON GIRLS INTO PRACTICE

Research lives in our classrooms and our pedagogy. Every Hewitt teacher understands the research on how girls learn best in environments that cultivate authentic and supportive student-teacher relationships, and has access to a variety of resources, including our director of faculty practice and research, to support mission-aligned, age-appropriate, and discipline-specific curricular design and lesson planning.

Students thrive when families work in close partnership with our school. We offer parents and guardians opportunities to learn from our in-house experts as well as our dedicated research partners like Dr. Carol Gilligan and Dr. Lisa Damour. Hewitt also partners with several research organizations including the Radical Listening Project in the Steinhardt School of Education, New York University; the Klingenstein Center at Teachers College, Columbia University; and Mine the Gap as we continue to develop new evidence-based best practices for educating girls.

## STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES

### LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Girls Who Code, Business Club, Current Events Club, Math Olympiad, Black Student Union, Arts and Literary Magazine, The Hewitt Times, Photography Magazine, Young Women's Cooperative, Student Council, Student Head of Athletics, Robotics, Student Tour Guides, News Decoder, Peer Tutoring, Debate Club, Student Service Board, International Thespian Society, Film Club, Earth Committee, Mental Health Awareness Club, and Science Olympiad, with new opportunities developing every year.

### AFTER-SCHOOL AND SUMMER PROGRAMS (K-4)

Hewitt's robust after-school and summer programs invite our students to explore and engage in over 20 different specialized classes, including Chess, Broadway Stars, Kitchen Chemistry, Craft Market, Creative Writing, Spanish Immersion, Making Movies, Mini Chefs, Multi-Sports, Prima Ballet, STEAM Explorers, Treblemakers Choir, and VEX Robotics.

### STUDENT LED SUSTAINABILITY

Hewitt's Sustainability Council, Upper School Earth Committee, and Middle School Sustainability and Community Activism Committee lead school-wide campaigns to reduce campus waste and promote a sustainable future. In an average school year, student-led efforts include:

- 2800 pounds of leftover food donated to Rescuing Leftover Cuisine
- 750 pounds of paper waste recycled
- 100 pounds of dried markers, used glue sticks, and empty snack wrappers recycled with TerraCycle


