Academic Dishonesty: Plagiarism/Cheating

Sinaloa students must rely on their own talents and abilities to complete academic work at a level in which they take pride. Any attempt to shortcut this undertaking undermines the learning process. Cheating offenses may include but will not be limited to the following:

- Copying someone else's work
- Allowing someone else to copy your work
- Submitting work on which the student has received substantial assistance from another person (including tutors, parents, etc.)
- Cheating on a quiz, test, or assignment
- Giving or receiving information regarding a quiz or test that gives an unfair advantage
- Using AI to assist in written work or visual work. (Chat GPT, etc.)

Consequences will include the following:

- Parent/Guardian contact by teacher
- Grade of "F" (fail) on the assignment; 0-59%, at teacher's discretion and as appropriate relative to the offense
- Citizenship will be lowered to an "N" by the teacher for 1st offense. Second offense will result in "U" in citizenship, and can also result in an administrative "U" which can impact promotion
- All cheating offenses will be documented for the student in Aeries. A second offense during the student's enrollment at Sinaloa will be reviewed by the administration and could result in an administrative "U" (see Promotion Activities Page 10)

Activities and Assemblies

Sinaloa Middle School has a variety of activities available for all students. The leadership class plans school spirit activities that include special dress-up days, school rallies for renaissance and other celebratory events, and school dances. We also have awards assemblies to recognize and celebrate students for a variety of special achievements. Other activities include Red Ribbon Week, Athletic Programs, Clubs, and many other events that are confirmed daily through morning announcements and communication with families and students through the principal's weekly message to our Sinaloa community. Students may be prohibited from participating in extracurricular or special school events if they are in violation of the following school rules:

- The student has any recorded suspensions in the most recent quarter.
- The student has cumulative tardies per semester in excess of 20.
- The student has 2 or more failing grades based on the most recent grading period.

Aeries

All parents and students must have an active Aeries Portal account in order to view grades, attendance and other important information. Parents/Guardians must complete the Parents' Rights and AUP forms through their Aeries Parent Portal each year. **Students will NOT be able to select their lockers or receive their textbooks during our orientation days, or access electronic devices, computers, etc., until these forms are completed & submitted by their parent/guardian.**

ASB –Associated Student Body

ASB is Sinaloa's student government. ASB officers are elected through the leadership program. Every A Block classroom elects a representative to provide leadership for school activities and campus issues. These ASB representatives comprise the student council that meets monthly to plan events, discuss student concerns and questions, and approve expenditures of ASB funds.

Attendance-Main Office

Parents/Guardians are to notify the office if their student will not be attending school. *To report an absence, tardy, or to request an early check out, call 805-520-6830, press 1, or, email:*

An absence is considered a truancy if it is not excused within five days. Excused absences include: medical, dental, legal appointments, bereavement, school business, or religious holidays. *If a student has more than 12 days of excused absences, a doctor's note will be required to excuse future absences.* Unexcused absences are defined by the state of California as anything other than those listed.

Parental permission for these types of absences does not make the absence "excused." The district makes automated phone calls to a designated phone each evening to report an absence if the school has not been notified of the absence. Students with excessive absences, either excused or unexcused, will be required to conference with site administration and parents for a School Attendance Review Team (SART) meeting, and if attendance issues continue, can be referred to the School Attendance Review Board (SARB). (See also Tardies and Truancies) Absences can negatively affect a student's academic efforts and likely create gaps that the student will struggle to overcome.

Backpacks

Backpacks may be used to store books and materials. Do not leave backpacks unattended, give backpacks to friends or place in a friend's locker. Backpacks are not allowed in the PE area, locker rooms, gym, or the Cafeteria/Lunch Area. (See Lockers)



Balloons, Flowers, Cakes, Pizza, Food Delivery, Etc...

Balloons, flowers, cakes, cupcakes, pizza parties, food delivery orders, etc. are not allowed on our campus. Parents can deliver home-packed lunches to students, but restaurant food is not allowed to be delivered by parents. The food delivery services, such as Uber Eats, DoorDash, Postmates, GrubHub, and several others have become unmanageable and are also not allowed. All students receive a free lunch or are invited to order from the snack bar or to bring lunch from home.

Behavior Expectations

In an effort to maintain a safe and healthy campus, and to achieve our core goal of a respectful and positive environment, Sinaloa students will:

- Be respectful to one another at all times.
- Be considerate of the rights and feelings of others.
- Show courtesy to all adults on campus.
- Act responsibly with all materials entrusted to them.
- Arrive timely to all classes every single day.
- Be prepared to learn when arriving to class.
- Resolve conflict with others constructively & without being mean or cruel.
- Speak to an adult if they know something that could be dangerous to others.
- Focus on being a positive influence to others.

Bikes, Skateboards, and Scooters

- Must be parked and locked in the fenced area at the west end of the campus.
- Must be locked individually and may not be locked to another bike, skateboard or scooter.
- Playing/loitering in this area is not allowed. This area will be locked during the school day.

- Skateboards and scooters may not be stored in lockers or classrooms.
- **Bicycles, skateboards and scooters may not be ridden on campus. They must be walked on and off campus through the front of the school.**
- Sinaloa is not responsible for any items left overnight or over the weekend.

Students who violate these rules will have the “item” confiscated and a parent will be required to pick it up. Repeated violations may result in detention or suspension. **Students are required by state law to follow the helmet law when riding such items.**

Bullying

Bullying is behavior that is repeated and deliberate abusive behavior intended to hurt others. Bullying can be pushing, shoving, hitting, and spitting, as well as name calling, picking on, making fun of, laughing at, and belittling. Bullying causes pain and stress to victims and is never justified or excusable as “kids being kids,” “just teasing,” or any other excuse. The victim is never responsible for being a target of bullying.

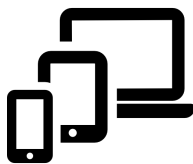
The Sinaloa Staff spends time with all of our students educating them about bullying and the consequences of it. Parents are asked to talk with their students about bullying and inform any adult on campus if it occurs, immediately.

Cafeteria

The cafeteria is open daily for breakfast and lunch. A La Carte items are also available. Parents can monitor lunch accounts or make online payments for student accounts.

Cell Phones/ Electronic Devices

School Board policy mandates that cell phones / electronic signaling devices must be turned off (including vibrate and silent modes) in the classroom and during school activities. Cell phones are NOT to be visible during school hours, and NEVER anywhere but the front of the school as designated by our posted signs. For emergency situations, students can ask their teachers for permission to use the cell phone in the main office ONLY. Texting/using phone and airpods/headphones during school hours without permission will result in detention and more if behaviors are repeated. Students may also use phones before and after school in the front area of the school ONLY!



The use of a cell phone and airpods/headphones is a privilege that can be revoked if the guidelines are not followed.

- 1st offense - warning & after-school pick up
- 2nd offense - parent call & parent must pick up
- 3rd offense - parent call & phone turned in daily. Students will have to turn in their cell phone to the office every morning and then pick it up after school as part of a cell phone contract.

Pictures and videos may never be taken on school property.

Students are not allowed to bring cameras, video cameras, iPods, hand held games, gaming systems or laser pointers to school at any time, except on days designated by the school administration. Items not allowed at school including cell phones that are used inappropriately will be confiscated. Confiscated items will be returned only to a parent. Sinaloa assumes no responsibility for any loss, theft, or damage to the above items. STUDENTS CANNOT

RECORD ANYTHING ON CAMPUS, PARTICULARLY FIGHTS, ARGUMENTS, OR ANY ACT OF VIOLENCE. THESE ACTIONS WILL RESULT IN AN AUTOMATIC SUSPENSION. POSTING RECORDED FIGHTS OR ANY OTHER VISUALS FROM OUR CAMPUS ON SOCIAL MEDIA WILL ALSO AUTOMATICALLY RESULT IN SUSPENSION AND/OR POLICE INVOLVEMENT.

CHAMPS

CHAMPS is not a program, but rather a compilation of how-to strategies that support teachers in the very skills that have been associated with student success. CHAMPS is a systematic, prevention-oriented approach that guides teachers in providing universal classroom supports that are likely to promote appropriate behavior and reduce disruptive behavior in the classroom. Once the teacher has implemented the core supports, there is guidance for how to structure supports that target smaller groups or individual students who need additional supports. Sinaloa MS utilizes the CHAMPS philosophy school wide, both in and outside of the classroom. Time is spent at the beginning of the school year to teach expectations and these are reinforced daily, so students are expected to know and follow these guidelines.

Communication

The school communicates with families in a variety of ways:

- Emails and all-calls sent from the SMS Staff through the parent communication system (Blackboard).

- Parents are encouraged to initiate communication with staff regarding their student's progress

Counselors are available to assist students in the areas of educational guidance, class selection, post middle school plans and social or personal concerns. Counselors are also available to assist parents with home to school communication and any questions or concerns regarding their students.

Cyber-Bullying

(Texting, Snapchat, E-mail, Instant Messaging (IM), YouTube, Instagram, Twitter, Tik Tok, ask.fm, etc...)

Students who engage in harassing/bullying or who make written threats to other students or staff via the internet, electronic devices, and/or cell phone will be subject to disciplinary consequences, including detention, counseling by administration and law enforcement, suspension and/or expulsion; this behavior interferes with learning and creates an unsafe environment on campus. Cyberbullying also undermines our campus vision, culture and expectations.

Detentions

Teachers and Administrators may assign a 15 minute after school detention without parent notification for inappropriate student behavior. It is expected that students will serve their detentions on the date and time assigned. Failure to do so will result in additional consequences that range from additional detentions to suspension for refusal to serve. Additionally, administrators have the right to assign lunch detentions without parent notification for moderate behavior concerns. Students who repeatedly neglect to attend their assigned detentions will be required to conference with parents/guardians and administration.

Dress Code Policy

In accordance with the Governing Board we believe that appropriate dress and grooming contribute to a productive learning environment. As our school dress code is in compliance with our Board Policies and Administrative Regulations, we expect our students to give proper attention to personal cleanliness and to wear clothes that are suitable for the school activities in which they participate. Students have the right to make individual choices from a wide range of clothing and grooming styles, but they must not present a health or safety hazard which would interfere with the educational process. **(Simi Valley Unified School District | AR 5132 Students)**

Regardless of identity or gender, all students should wear clothes that are sufficient to conceal undergarments at all times (waistbands and straps excluded). **Tops and dresses with low cut necklines at the front (showing cleavage) are not permitted. Students must be able to participate in school activities such as sitting, raising their hands, writing on the board, etc. without exposing undergarments, or areas that should be reasonably covered by undergarments.**

Specific Dress Code Guidelines

Sinaloa faculty and administration support fashion choices appropriate to the educational setting. Students' attire should be comfortable, and enable them to participate in a wide array of educational activities. Clothes shall be sufficient to conceal a student's private body parts at all times. See-through fabrics, halter tops, backless shirts, or any clothing that, through the normal range of motion would reveal private areas of the student's body, are prohibited.

- Undergarments are not to be worn as tops or bottoms at any time. Bralettes, sports bras, boxers, etc are not considered tops or shorts and must be covered by another garment.
- Backless tops and dresses are not permitted.
- Any clothing with logos or images of a sexually or violently suggestive nature, drug or alcohol-related references, or products that are not age-level appropriate for our site are prohibited. ***Examples: Cookies Brand Merchandise, Playboy, etc...or phrases such as "I like hot moms/dads", etc that are deemed inappropriate by school administration.***
- Any clothing that exhibits profane or offensive language is not appropriate to wear to school.
- Articles of clothing or jewelry that pose a threat to the safety of the student or others shall not be worn on campus or at school activities.
- Shoes must be worn at all times and must have enclosed heels or a heel strap for safety reasons. No slippers, flip-flops, or similar footwear. No heels taller than 1 inch.
- Clothing and jewelry shall be free of writing, pictures or any other insignia which are crude, vulgar, profane or sexually

suggestive, or which advocate racial, ethnic or religious prejudice, the use of drugs or alcohol or any illegal activity or which bear drug, alcohol, or tobacco company advertising, promotions and likeness.

The administration has the right to determine if attire is inappropriate for school or any school activity. Violation of the dress code will result in appropriate disciplinary action including but not limited to the following: **student changing clothes, parent notification, detention, and/or parent conference. Please remember, if it is not appropriate to wear or have at school, then it is not appropriate to wear ON your clothes.**

Fighting

Fighting or promoting fighting either on or off campus is NEVER TOLERATED. Rough horseplay or play fighting will be treated as seriously as "real" fights. Consequences include parent and administrative conference, suspension and/or expulsion for repeated offenses. Students found to be recording fights, whether or not they are posted online, will be subject to suspension, as mentioned earlier.

Gum

Due to the damage caused to school property and facilities by the careless disposal of gum, gum is not allowed on campus. Students who chew or possess gum on campus will receive referrals and/or detentions, and gum will be confiscated.

Health Office-Main Office

No type of medication, prescription or non-prescription, can be administered by school personnel without the appropriate form signed by both the doctor and the parent. Forms may be picked up in the health office. **Medication must be in the original container and must be brought to the health office by a parent where it will be kept in a locked cabinet. If a student sustains an injury that requires a brace or cast, the parent needs to provide the health office with a doctor's note indicating any restrictions that may apply while at school.** While we want all children to be in school, parents should not send children to school if they have a fever, are vomiting, or have flu symptoms. Students must have a pass from the teacher to come to the health office. **Students should report to the health office if they are feeling ill. All illness-related calls to parents must come from the health office and not students' cell phones so that staff can be aware of a problem.**



The following screenings are conducted during the school year at no cost to parents: vision and hearing (8th grade). These screenings are mandatory by law. Parents may write a note excusing their child from the screening. **All students must be in compliance with immunization requirements prior to the first day of school.**

Homework (Board Policy 6154A)

It is board policy that middle school students should expect up to 1 to 1 ½ hours of homework a night. This may vary from day to day. "The Board believes that homework is the responsibility of the student. It is the student's job to develop regular study habits and to do most assignments independently." It is the student's responsibility to obtain and make up any class work that was missed due to absences. If a student is absent from school for three or more consecutive days due to illness, a parent may contact the school office and request classroom assignments. All communication about requests for extension on assignments due to illness must be addressed with individual teachers.

ID Cards

Students will receive an ID card after school ID pictures are taken in August. ID cards/numbers are used for computer and library privileges, lunch purchases, AR tests, and to check out sports equipment at lunch. Students who lose their ID card can request a new one from the Library.

Honors IM Program

The Honors International-Mindedness (Honors IM) program is designed to prepare students for highly-rigorous academics in high school, including Advanced Placement classes and Royal High School's IB Diploma program. The pathway aims to develop open-minded, analytical, and caring young people through intercultural understanding and respect. Students in the program will model the approaches to learning and learner attributes taught at Royal High School's IB Diploma program. The purpose of the Honors IM pathway is to motivate and inspire students to become global learners by exploring and understanding the different perspectives of other cultures, as well as global and local issues.

Library

The library is an excellent resource for research and pleasure reading. The library is open before and after school, and during lunchtime. Food is not allowed in the library and students are expected to conduct themselves in a quiet manner and follow the rules. ID cards are also necessary to check out books. A student may check out up to 3 items at a time. A fine of \$.10 per item and \$.25 for reference materials will be charged daily for each overdue item. Internet access is also available in the library for research purposes.

Lockers

Lockers are issued to all students who have completed all appropriate paperwork (Aeries - Parent Portal: Parent Rights & AUP Forms) & signature pages.

Students and parents must understand that the school is not responsible for any materials that are lost, stolen, or damaged while in the school locker.

Students and parents are agreeing to assume full responsibility for the loss or damage to any and all items left in the locker. Students are responsible for keeping their lockers clean and **should not keep any valuables in the locker overnight.** Students should make a habit of regularly cleaning out their lockers, and of electing to remove books during times of inclement weather to avoid damage. **Students are to use only the locker assigned to them** and may not share a locker with anyone. Students who either leave their belongings in another person's locker, or who allow others to leave items in their locker are subject to disciplinary action, including detention. **Students must maintain maximum security by not sharing their combination with anyone, including friends.** The only permissible locks are those from the Sinaloa ASB office. School officials may open and search any locker for reasonable suspicion, or in the event of an emergency.



Lost and Found

Students missing items are encouraged to check in the office for missing items. Unclaimed lost and found items are donated to charity on a regular basis. Notifications of donations are made on a regular basis in the morning announcements.

Lunch and Nutrition

Nutrition is a 15 minute period (20 minutes on a minimum day) which allows students to go to their lockers, use the restroom, or eat a snack. This time includes the passing period. Snacks are available for purchase using change and nothing larger than \$5.00 bills. Lunch

is a 30-minute period. Lunch is eaten in a designated area and **students are expected to throw away their own trash.** At no time is there to be food outside of the designated eating areas.

Consequences will be assigned to students who violate these rules.

STUDENTS MAY NOT SELL CANDY, SODA, OR OTHER ITEMS FOR PERSONAL GAIN OR PROFIT. STUDENTS ARE ALSO NOT ALLOWED TO GIVE PROHIBITED ITEMS TO OTHERS, SUCH AS ENERGY DRINKS, SODAS, AND JUNK FOOD. THIS IS A SAFETY AND HEALTH ISSUE.

Lunch Drop Off

Parents who are dropping off items or lunches to school must deliver them to the main office and may not give it to students from the parking lot. Lunches that are dropped off must be for an individual student and not to be shared with others. Items that are meant to be shared with others, such as pizza or cupcakes, create a potential risk of food allergies to other students and cause a disruption on campus. We do not accept deliveries for students from outside companies.

Lunch Activities

Football, soccer balls, and basketballs are available for check out with student ID card. **Students may not bring sports equipment from home.** The use of sports equipment is limited to the blacktop and playing fields and not allowed anywhere else. Abuse of this privilege can result in suspension of the privilege.



Markers, Aerosol Cans, Etc.

To protect our school environment & facilities, permanent markers of any kind (sharpies, white-out, paint pens, etc.) & aerosol spray cans (deodorant, cologne, etc.) are prohibited at school. Items will not be returned to the student and must be claimed by a parent from the main office. Disciplinary action will result for students who write, mark, or spray on others or school property (vandalism). Vandals can be subject to suspension or expulsion, depending on the severity and the number of occurrences. Vandalism destroys property and impacts the look of the campus, affecting morale and campus culture. It can also be expensive.

Naviance

Sinaloa Middle School students will be accessing Naviance~Family Connection- a comprehensive website that you and your student can use to make plans about colleges, and careers. Family Connection allows your student to:

- **Get involved in the planning and advising process** – Build a resume, complete online surveys, and manage timelines and deadlines for making decisions about colleges and careers
- **Research colleges** – Compare GPA, standardized test scores, and other statistics to actual historical data from our school for students who have applied and been admitted in the past
- **Research careers** – Research hundreds of careers and career clusters, and take career assessments.
- **Create plans for the future** – Create goals and to-dos, and complete tasks assigned by the school to better prepare your student for future college and career goals.

Pathways Program

Sinaloa Middle School offers introductory Pathway courses, where students are exposed to different Career Pathways at a level appropriate to their age and grade. These career-focused courses are offered as part of a semester-long class in the following fields; Aeronautics, Cabinetry & Woodworking, Broadcasting, Communications, Robotics, Animation, Visual Arts, Theater Arts,

Musical Arts (band, choir, drumline, color guard), pre-ROTC club, and Digital Art. The idea is to offer students a taste of different Pathways to help stimulate their interest for High School Pathways and potential future careers.

Physical Education

Sinaloa is proud of its outstanding PE program emphasizing fitness and lifelong activities. PE is a required course for all students, just like the academic classes. As in other classes, students are responsible for making up any missed work in PE. Missed work is recorded as a zero until work is complete. A parent note (up to 3 days only) or doctor may excuse a student from PE; however, the assignments missed must be made up as soon as renewed activity is authorized. Activity lessons are made up by participating in physical recreation or sports outside of the school day for 30 minutes for each day of absence. A note from a parent verifying the 30 minutes of physical activity satisfies this requirement. Absences from a fitness test (i.e. fitness runs) must be made-up at school once the student is physically able to participate. Students should check with their PE teacher for make-up times.



Note: Students are expected to dress for PE even if they have a valid excuse for non-participation. Be sure to review the information distributed by the PE department carefully. **Students who choose not to dress must stay with the teacher for the duration of the class time and are not allowed “free time” on their own.** Students choosing not to participate in PE will receive a teacher referral for “non-suited”. If a student receives 5 or more non-suited within one semester, they will receive an administrative referral with the consequence of detentions, a parent conference, and possibly an administrative or teacher “U” in citizenship. Non-suited will seriously impact the student’s grade.

Progress Reports/ Report Cards

Progress Reports and Report Cards are NOT mailed home. Parents are able to view all report cards in Aeries. It is expected that every parent will review the report card with their student. Parents are encouraged to contact teachers by email or phone if they have any concerns about their student’s progress. **Parents are also expected to check Aeries frequently to stay focused on work and grades consistently.** Students and parents can access Aeries at any time they wish, and view grades and/or missing work in real time.

Promotion Activities

Eighth grade students will be required to meet the following criteria to be eligible for the promotion ceremony:

1. Earn a passing grade (semester grade) in at least nine of their twelve classes during 8th grade. At least 4 of those passing grades must be earned as final grades for the second semester
2. Earn no more than one (1) U in citizenship as a final grade for the 2nd semester.
3. Earn no administrative U’s; referrals to the office, suspensions, or trancies may result in an administrative U.
4. Administrative transfers and any involvement relating to drugs, alcohol, graffiti, violent behavior, or weapons may exclude a student from the promotion ceremony and end of the year activities.
5. Students who fail to meet all of these requirements may qualify to appeal their eligibility with administrative approval.

PTSA

Sinaloa is fortunate to have an award-winning Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA). At the middle school level both parents and students are eligible to join the PTSA. Membership information

is sent home the first day of school. Volunteers help with many school functions and activities throughout the school year.

Public Displays of Affection

Students are asked to keep hands to themselves. Hugging and kissing is not acceptable for young adolescent children on a middle school campus. Students will be counseled, parents contacted, and disciplinary action taken.

Renaissance

Sinaloa Middle School celebrates academic excellence through our Renaissance program. The program encourages and recognizes students through pep rallies and rewards. Eligibility for the program consists of:

- Attendance at Sinaloa for at least one semester
- A minimum GPA of 3.0 or a 0.5 GPA improvement in quarter grades for 2.0 or higher GPAs.
- No U’s in citizenship on semester report card
- No F’s for semester grades.

SABER Code

All SABERS should:

- **Start** each day with a positive attitude
- **Achieve:** Do their very best work every day and contribute in a positive way on campus, particularly in the classroom.
- **Believe:** Believe in success and transfer that belief in all interactions.

School Safety

Sinaloa takes great care to ensure our students are educated in a safe environment, as shown by our Sinaloa SABER Code. Students and parents are expected to report any potentially dangerous situation to a staff member or administrator. Such reports can be made anonymously. Sinaloa also prepares its students for emergencies by practicing fire drills, school evacuations, school-wide lockdowns, and a disaster drill.

School Site Council

The Sinaloa School Site Council is composed of parents, teachers, administrators, and students. The Council meets each year to discuss curriculum priorities. The Council approves the Single Plan for Student Achievement budget and prioritizes budget expenditures for additional funds that the school receives. Look for election

information in the school emails or contact the school. Meetings are open to the public and we certainly encourage parent and student participation.

School Suspension

Students who violate the disciplinary guidelines of the school, district or state of California Educational Code, may be suspended from school. **When students are suspended from school they may not attend any school functions during the time of their suspension, nor may they be on campus. Students suspended for 3 or more days will have work requested for them from their teachers. Classroom suspensions may be issued by the administration or individual teachers, with parent notification.**

Search & Seizure/Canine Search

The Canine Search and Training program, made available to our secondary schools by the Simi Valley Police Department, has two purposes. In addition to providing police canine units with venues to conduct training exercises, the program also serves to impress upon students the importance of keeping themselves and our schools drug free. An added benefit of the program is that the presence of controlled substances or explosives on our campuses may be detected during the training exercises. The dogs shall be separated from the students and not allowed to sniff any individual. Prior to conducting an inspection in a classroom, students will be asked to leave backpacks, jackets, hats and personal items prior to leaving the classroom. Dogs shall not sniff within the close proximity of students or other persons and may not sniff any personal items on those persons without their consent. The dates and times of training exercises are not announced in advance. Any locker or personal items identified by a dog during training will be opened in the presence of the student(s) to whom the locker is issued to or to whom the item belongs.

Should any illegal substances be found in a student's locker or possessions, appropriate disciplinary action will be taken. If nothing illegal is found, no action will be taken and no record will be made of the search. In all cases care will be taken to protect the rights of students. The administration reserves the right to search any student's belongings (including their individual lockers) if we have a reasonable suspicion that the student may have any prohibited items or substances on campus. Parents will be notified once a search has been conducted.

Sexual Harassment

All students receive information regarding sexual harassment laws and district policy from the counselors in the fall. Sexual harassment can consist of unwelcome sexual advances; requests for sexual favors; verbal, visual, or physical conduct of a sexual nature made by any student or adult in the educational setting. Students should report sexual harassment to any adult on campus. As mandated by Federal Law, all reports will be investigated by the site Title IX administrator (which would be the administrative team members). Violations will result in swift and serious disciplinary actions.

Tardies

There exists a direct correlation between on-time attendance in class and academic success. Therefore, Sinaloa takes seriously the responsibility of supporting student punctuality. Students are considered to be tardy to class if they are not in their class at the time the tardy bell rings. Excessive tardies will result in detentions, and possibly the loss of eligibility for activities. **Moreover, excessive tardiness during any quarter can result in a U in citizenship (teacher or administration) which will affect Renaissance, school**

activities like sports, and promotion activities/promotion eligibility. Parents will be notified in the event of excessive tardiness, (see chart below). **Class-based (Teacher) consequences are as follows:**

# of Tardies in one class	Consequence
5	"N" in Citizenship for that class
7	"N" in Citizenship for that class, parent notice.
10	"U" in Citizenship for that class, parent conference.

See below for additional consequences based on total tardies for all classes (Administration):

Students must also follow their teacher's individual tardy policy, which can be found in the teacher's classroom management plan.

Tardy Sweeps

Periodically, at the discretion of the administration, the campus will conduct a "tardy sweep," in which all students who are not in class at the time the bell rings will gather in a place selected by administration for counseling and possible discipline, depending on students' current tardy record.

Textbooks

Textbooks will be issued to all students from the library. Students are responsible for all books checked out to them. They are expected to pay for any lost or damaged books. **All books are to be covered at all times.** Cloth book covers are sold during orientation and at the ASB office during the year. Students may also cover books using paper book covers. Textbook distribution will occur during orientation days, as long as students are in good standing. Otherwise, books will be checked out after school has begun.

THINK – How to Respond

(Truthful ~ Helpful ~ Inspiring ~ Necessary ~ Kind)

In conjunction with the Sinaloa SABER Code, students will be held accountable for how they verbally respond to others. Students are expected to **THINK** before they speak. We all need to build others up with our words instead of tearing them down.

Toys

Toys, such as laser pens, balls, tech decks, slime, fidget toys, as well as any objects that have no relationship to learning, are not appropriate at school and should be left at home. Such objects disrupt the classroom and will be held in the office until a parent picks it up. **Other forbidden items on our campus are blankets, pillows, and stuffed animals.** Students are coming to school to learn, not to sleep.

Truancy

Students are expected to be in classes at all times. Students who are not in class and not excused are considered truant and will be assigned consequences such as detention, administrative U, ineligibility to participate in school activities, suspension or a referral to the Student Attendance Review Board (SARB).

Guidelines for Using Laptops and Other Technology

Sinaloa is privileged to have access to Laptops in all academic and some elective/physical education classes. As a result, students will spend a good amount of time utilizing this technology. Below is some basic information about the Laptops, about proper usage of the Laptops, and about consequences for Laptop abuse.

- On the Laptops, students can create Docs, Sheets, Forms, and Slides. Anything that is saved to the student's Google Drive from the Laptop at school can be accessed on any other computer using the student's district Gmail account.
- When using Laptops in class, students should...
 - Always be sitting down while using the Laptop
 - Always carry the Laptop with two hands and hold the Laptop by the base, not the cover
 - Not bang/slam/hit/lean on the Laptop; not place books/other items on top of the Laptop
 - Keep all liquids away from the Laptop

****Please note that laptops are NEVER allowed to be used at lunchtime or during nutrition period unless in the library.**

- Students must use the Laptop, or any other technological device, appropriately at all times. This includes...
 - Using the Internet to research academic information
 - Working on assignments in Docs, Slides, Sheets, or Forms
 - Remember, EVERYTHING that is written in Google is stored and can be viewed by your teacher or the district office, even if it's deleted.
 - Accessing class information on Google Classroom or other teacher-created share sites
 - Taking A.R. tests
 - Creating educationally-appropriate material
 - Collaborating on assignments
 - Accessing grades on AERIES
- Students may NOT engage in the following activities on the Laptops, or any other technological device, at any time:
 - Installing or downloading software, extension, or apps unless prompted by the teacher
 - Downloading and streaming music and videos (unless for academic purposes)- Taking pictures or video (unless for a specified academic purpose)
 - **Playing non-academic games**
 - Taking or touching someone else's Laptop
 - Visiting sites "incognito"
 - Visiting pages that are not directly related to a lesson
 - IMing or chatting (in MS Teams) during class time
 - Bullying
 - Using rude, abusive, threatening, or inappropriate language
 - Using inappropriate screensaver images.

Our school district cooperates with the Canine Search and Training program of the Simi Valley Police Department to help ensure that our campus remains safe and drug free. **Administrators will assign consequences for any other infractions not included on this matrix to ensure the safety of students and staff and to protect the right for all students to an education free from disruption or abusive treatment.**
